

Minutes of regular monthly meeting of Council held on above date. All members of Council present excepting Chairman Dolde and Mr. Miller. Burgess and Solicitor present, Engineer arrived at 9:30.

Owing to the absence of the Chairman the Clerk called the meeting to order and called for nominations for a temporary chairman.

Messrs Schuster and Dyck nominated Mr. Chas. W. Gollmar and he was duly elected.

Mr. Dyck moved, Campbell seconded, - "That minutes of regular meeting of December 12th, and continuation of same of December 26th, be approved as read." carried.

Dyck, Jones, - That the December payroll be approved as paid. c.

The Chairman stated that there were several citizens in the audience wishing to take up various matters with Council and that Council would hear their petitions before proceeding with the order of business.

Mr. Stroup from Hempstead Avenue stated that Mr. Laubach's walk on Hempstead Avenue at the corner of Chalfonte Avenue was in such a condition that a person could not use the walk without getting their shoes covered with mud.

Jones, Campbell, - That the Clerk give Mr. Laubach 10 days notice to thoroughly clean off his walk and remove such part of his terrace as was on the street property and notify Mr. Laubach that his concrete walk on Hempstead Avenue must be rebuilt by May 1st, 1923 or the Borough would reconstruct same and charge the cost against the property. carried.

Mr. Page of Cornell Avenue complained about the condition of 12th Alley and Mr. Campbell moved, Schuster seconded, - That matter be referred to the Streets & Sewers Committee for investigation and report. c.

Messrs. Shoup and Wise of Bronx Avenue stated they did not feel like paying the cementwalk assessments until they were sure that the concrete walks would hold up and asked for some assurance that the roadway on Bronx Avenue would be filled to near the sidewalk levels.

The Chairman stated that assessments were made on the assumption that the work was substantial and that the Borough was protected on the work by a bond and a retainer of 10% of the contract price of the work, that citizens could not hold up payments on the chance of work going bad and that if assessments were not paid in due time liens would have to be filed.

The Chairman of the Streets & Sewers Committee stated that it was the intention of Council to cut off dirt above the grade of the street on the northern end of the street and make the necessary fill at the lower end of the street but that work was started too late in the season to complete the job in 1922.

Schuster, Campbell, - That letter of Mr. I. J. Courtney re the grading assessments on Amherst Avenue and the Viewers Awards on Amherst Avenue be referred to the Solicitor for answer and report. c.

Campbell, Dyck, - That Viewers Awards on Amherst Avenue be accepted.

Schuster, Campbell, - That letter from Lt. Col. Stanton of the Salvation Army re condition of Princeton Avenue be answered by the Clerk and then filed. c.

Schuster, Dyck, - That letter from the League of Boroughs and Twp. be referred to the Finance Committee. c.

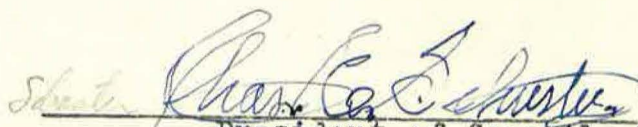
