

West View, Pa., January 6th, 1930.

Minutes of re-organization meeting of West View Borough Council held on above date, all members of Council present. Burgess, Solicitor and Engineer present.

Burgess Atkinson, after filing his certificate of election and oath of office with the Borough Clerk, called the meeting to order and administered the oath of office to Councilmen G. A. H. Hendler, Walter F. Hunt, John E. Reed and Elmer J. Thompson, who after signing their affidavits and filing same with the Clerk took their seats in Council.

Messrs. Hendler and Hunt nominated Mr. Wm. M. Dickson for president of Council, there being no other nomination, Burgess Atkinson called for a vote and Mr. Dickson was unanimously elected President of Council.

The Burgess then asked for nominations for Secretary of Council.

Messrs. Hendler and Hunt nominated C. A. McClain for re-appointment to the positions of Secretary of Council or Borough Clerk, Street Commissioner and Building Inspector. There being no other nomination, a vote was taken and C. A. McClain duly elected to the offices mentioned.

Messrs. Hendler & Dickson nominated Harry J. Wagner, Jr., as Borough Treasurer, vote was taken and Mr. Wagner, elected unanimously.

Messrs. Hendler and Hunt nominated Judge Frank I Gollmar for Borough Solicitor and there being no other nomination Judge Gollmar was duly elected Borough Solicitor.

Applications of H. P. McKown and R. M. Douglas for Borough Engineer were read and Messrs. Hendler and Reed nominated Mr. McKown for the position. Burgess Atkinson called for a vote and Mr. McKown was unanimously elected Borough Engineer.

Application of W. D. Kasemeier for Police Chief was read. There being no other application Burgess called for a vote and Mr. Kasemeier was duly elected Chief of Police.

Application of Wm. Temme for police officer and ordinance officer was read and Mr. Temme was nominated and unanimously elected to said positions.

Applications of Mr. John Branney and Philip Schladenhaufen for appointment as police officers were read and both men were nominated by Messrs. Hunt and Hendler, vote cast and men declared duly elected.

Applications of Mr. Wm. F. Koertz and John Kelleher for positions of police officer were read and ordered filed.

Messrs. Thompson and Dunn nominated Mr. Paul Muzzio for Borough Electrician and vote was taken and Mr. Muzzion unanimously elected to the position.

Messrs. Reed and Hendler nominated Mr. Wm. Angel for Borough Street Foreman, there being no other nomination, Mr. Angell was duly elected Borough Foreman.

Burgess Atkinson asked President of Council Dickson to act as Chairman for balance of the meeting. Mr. Dickson stated that he knew he spoke for all the Council in saying that he was glad to have the Burgess with Council in the re-organization meeting, this being the first meeting the Burgess was able to attend since August 13th, 1929, that he hoped the Burgess would be able to attend many Council meetings during 1930 and that the same spirit of co-operation between the Burgess and Council which had existed for the last few years would continue through the coming term of Council.

Mr. Dickson asked for any communications which might pertain to organization. Mr. Howard Wilt's resignation as Borough Auditor was read and accepted by motion of Council.

The application of Chas. W. Gollmar for appointment to the office of Borough Auditor to fill the unexpired term of Mr. Wilt was read, Messrs. Hunt and Hendler nominating Mr. Gollmar and there being no

other nomination Mr. Gollmar was duly elected to the office of Borough Auditor to fill the unexpired term of Mr. Wilts'.

A letter from the Board of Health was read recommending Mr. Harvey Allen for re-appointment to the Board and also recommending the re-appointment of Mr. Theodore Scheide as Plumbing Inspector.

Chairman Dickson re-appointed Mr. Allen a member of the Board of Health for a period of five years and Council unanimously elected Mr. Theodore Scheide Health Officer for the term of the present Council.

A summary of the Board of Health and Plumbing Inspector's reports for the year 1929 was read and ordered filed.

Mr. Hunt moved, Hendler seconded, - That Council adopt the same rules as were used during 1928 and 1929 and that the regular meetings of Council be held the second Tuesday of each month. carried.

Reed, Hendler, - That all salaries remain that same as during 1929 until the 1930 budget is prepared and salary ordinance adopted. carried.

Hendler, Hill, - That Council adjourn to meet January 14th, 1930. c.

Reed, Dunn,- That Council visit site of proposed road from the




City end of Center Avenue to the new Perry Highway, proposed roadway to be between the Reppermund and Lipp properties. carried.

Thompson, Hill,- That contract for printing ordinances, etc., be renewed with the City and Suburban Life and that said publication be designated the official publication of the Borough. carried.


