West View, January 21, 1931.

Minutes of continuation of regular meeting of Council held on above date. All members of Council excepting Mr. Hunt present. Mr. Thompson and Burgess Atkinson arriving late. Engineer present. Solicitor absent.

Mr. Howard Thompson representing a committee from #2 Fire Company explained to Council that the Company had voted to purchase an American-LaFrance combination hose truck and pumper, pumper having a 500 gal. capacity. That at present the Company had 348 feet of 2½" hose on hand and would request that Council furnish approximately 450 feet of new hose also that Council transfer the title to the old Ford Fire Truck to the officers of #2 Company so Company could use the ford as a trade-in on the new truck.

The Chairman of Council, after complimenting the members of #2 Company on their interest and their acumen in raising the fund for the down payment on the new truck, stated that Council believed a ladder and hose truck was needed more than another pumper for the Borough; that Council wondered just how the Company intended raising the balance of the payments for the truck and asked the Committee to realize that the expenses of operating the Borough were high enough to make Council study seriously the advisability of making any extensive changes in #2 building.

Mr. Thompson stated that the height of the truck was not sufficient to require any changes in the doors of the building, that about all the Company would ask Council to do would be to place a new concrete slab in the building to carry the truck.

After bids received on Center Ave. grading and paving were tabulated by Borough Engineer McKown, Reed moved, Hill seconded that the contract be awarded to S. T. Brotemarkle & Son as the lowest bidder and the matter referred to the Borough Solicitor and Engineer to pass on bond to be furnished. CARRIED.

statement to Mr. Thompson that the water pressure, fire alarm system and Borough fire fighting equipment were deficient.

Mr. Thompson presented a survey from the Underwriters dated in 1922.

Burgess Atkinson agreed with the Chairman of Council's remarks stating that he was in favor of a ladder and hose truck instead of a pumper and that before agreeing to the purchase of a new pumper he wanted to see a paid fireman on the job, competent to look after and operate the apparatus, stating that a pumper was not a toy but a machine that improperly operated could do as much harm at a fire as it could do good when properly handled.

The suggestion that more ladder apparatus be placed on #3 Truck was made by Mr. Thompson who said the Company would take Council's suggestions into consideration in purchasing a truck.

Hill, Hunt,- That Council transfer to #2 Fire Company the Ford Truck and certificate of title to same for use as a trade-in for a new truck and that the Clerk advise officers of the Fire Department to notify the Water Company when called to a fire so that the Company could arrange to keep up the water pressure. carried.

Solicitor was instructed to render an opinion as to the personal liability of members of #2 Fire Company, for any public liability or property damage which might be incurred in the operation of their new truck when the title would be held in the name of the Company.

The Engineer explained to members of #2 the area of the triangle at the intersection of Cornell, Center and Amherst Avenues stating that he did not believe plot was suitable for a new Engine House.

Councilmen explained also the hope and aim of Council to erect as soon as possible a suitable Borough building on Perrysville Ave. to house all borough equipment.

Mr. Thompson for #2 Company thanked Council for the hearing and withdrew.
