Additions and corrections to the minutes of the regular meeting of the West View Borough Council held January 8th, 1934.

Mr. Baker opposed the election of Phillip Schladenhaufen to the position of Chief of Police for the reason that, although he had been in the employ of West View Borough and has regularly received a salary from the Borough, he has not paid his borough taxes for the years of 1932 and 1933. And he has not paid for the cost of his street improvement.

Mr. Hendler stated that there is a question as to the condition of the paving on that street and that was probably why the above mentioned assessment had not been paid, as there were others on the same street that had not paid and for the same reason.

On the balloting for Chief of Police, Hendler, Rankin, and Warren voted for Phillip Schladenhaufen and Dunn, Baker and Gahring voted for Kaesmeier. As this resulted in a tie, the deciding vote was cast by the President of Council, Mr. McCune, who voted for Phillip Schladenhaufen and declared him elected.

Mr. Dunn's motion regarding the auditing of the outgoing Treasurer's books to be corrected to read, "that the proper authorities notify the auditors to audit the Treasurer's books as soon as possible.

Motion to hold up the election of a Borough Engineer until a later meeting was voted on as follows: Dunn and Baker voted for the motion; Hendler, Gahring, Rankin and Warren voted against the motion.

Motion to elect the McBride Engineering Corporation was voted as follows: Hendler, Rankin, Gahring and Warren voted for. Baker voted against. Dunn did not vote.

Minutes of a special meeting of the West View Borough Council held in the Borough Hall Tuesday evening, January 9th, at 8 o'clock.

Members of Council present at the opening of the meeting were: Mr. McCune, Mr. Gahring, Mr. Hendler, Mr. Dunn and Mr. Baker. Mr. Warren arrived later in the meeting.

Also present were: The Burgess, Dr. Atkinson, the Solicitor, Mr. Montgomery, the Treasurer, Mr. Miller and the engineer, ~~MR. BARTLEY~~.

Minutes of the regular Council meeting of January 8th were read and approved provided additions and corrections requested by Mr. Baker and Mr. Dunn be made.

The Chairman introduced Mr. Montgomery, Solicitor, and Mr. Miller, Treasurer.

Mr. Baker said that he believed citizens who desire to address Council should be heard early in the order of business.

The Chairman, Mr. McCune, recognized Mr. Allison who presented the matter of the installation of a new fire alarm system. It was decided to discuss the matter in detail later in the order of business.

Bid for truck hire received from James McGuire for excavation work on Center Avenue. Mr. Hendler moved that the bid be held over. The motion was not acted upon.

On motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Rankin and carried, it was

"RESOLVED THAT James McGuire's truck be hired if the extra men are put to work on Center Avenue and if the work will require it."

On motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Dunn and carried, it was

"RESOLVED THAT Mr. McClain be congratulated for his efforts and what he has accomplished on behalf of the unemployed of West View Borough, in connection with the C. W. A.

On motion by Mr. Hendler, seconded by Mr. Rankin and carried, it was

"RESOLVED THAT the salary of the Secretary of Council be set at one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) per month."
Mr. Baker and Mr. Dunn voted against this motion; Messrs. Rankin, Hendler and Gahring voted in favor of the motion.

On motion by Mr. Hendler, seconded by Mr. Gahring and carried it was

"RESOLVED THAT the salary of the Borough Treasurer be set at forty dollars (\$40.00) per month."

"RESOLVED THAT the Solicitor be asked to give his opinion as to whether the salary of the retiring Treasurer continues until the books are taken from his possession." The Solicitor, Mr. Montgomery, said that he would give an opinion after looking up this matter.

On the question of retainer or salary of the Solicitor, Mr. Montgomery said that he and Mr. Warren had discussed the matter of salary but that no definite conclusion had been reached, and that personally he was willing to leave the decision to Council.

Mr. Dunn suggested that the matter of determining the Solicitors salary be referred to the Finance Committee, who will report back to Council.

On the question of charges or prices for the services of Borough Engineer, Mr. Dunn asked Mr. Bartley if engineering prices are covered by an established code of rates. Mr. Bartley stated that the government will probably establish such a code in the near future.

On motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Hendler it was suggested that the payment be made as per the A. S. of E. Code. This motion and second was withdrawn.

"RESOLVED THAT the payment be made as per the A. S. of E. Code. Mr. McCune suggested that the matter of Engineers' salary be referred to the Finance Committee.

Dr. Torrens stated that the question of Public Playgrounds had been before the School Board for ten years and had always been given up on account of the lack of funds and that for the same reason the School Board cannot afford to enter into the proposition now. Dr. Torrens said that the School Board would be in favor of playgrounds if financial conditions were better, but as the education of the children is the first consideration the Board cannot undertake playground expense at this time.

In answer to the suggestion made by one of the speakers that a swimming pool could be placed on the High School property, Dr. Torrens said that because ~~of~~ the City Board of Education is insistent for the payment by West View for tuitions that the Borough will need that ground in the future for school buildings.

Dr Atkinson mentioned the cost of supervision and other expenses incidental to public playgrounds and that West View could not afford to consider the proposition any further than to clear any plots that might be available for the establishment of fields to permit games without the purchase of equipment by the Borough.

On motion by Mr. Hendler, seconded by Mr. Rankin and carried, it was

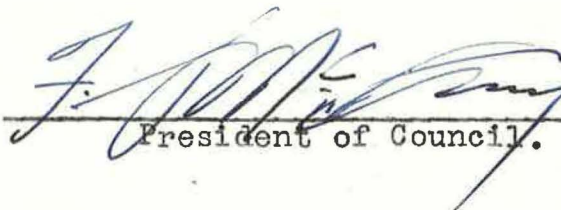

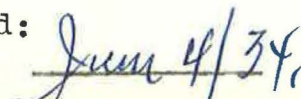

After lengthy discussion, Council rested on their decision of July 2nd, 1934 to sustain the action of the former Council of October 13, 1931, which was further strengthened by the opinion of Mr. Montgomery, Borough Solicitor, that the Wellington Heights Land Company has no legal claim against West View Borough for the cost of the Wellington Heights intersections, and also because if the payment was authorized by Council, the members would be liable to surcharge.
