

The reorganization meeting of Council was called to order by the Burgess, Mr. J.L.Gahring, at 8:10 PM, on Monday, January 5, 1942, who presided.

The following Councilmen presented their Certificates of Election; Mr. Harry M. Winter, Mr. Harry L. Smith, Mr. Ed. M. Hutchins, and Mr. Clyde C. Stanger, Tax Collector; Mr. Victor T. Reed, Controller; Mr. Frederick S. McCune. They all appeared before the Burgess and took the "Oath of Office"

On roll of Council, the following answered present; Mr. Smith, Mr. Hutchins, Mr. Stanger, Mr. Winter, Mr. Berg, and Mr. Grey. Absent; Mr. Kelly.

Mr. Smith, nominated Mr. Grey as Chairman of Council, and it was seconded by Mr. Stanger, and on roll call, all present voted unananimus. Carried and so ordered.

Mr. Berg nominated Mr. H.L. Donaldson, as Treasurer, and seconded by Mr. Winter, and on motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Berg, resolved the nominations for Treasurer closed, and on vote it was carried and so ordered. On roll call all members of council voted in favor of Mr. H.L. Donaldson, as Treasurer. Carried and so ordered.

Mr. Winter, nominated Mr. F.A. Perry, as Boro Secretary, and seconded by Mr. Stanger. Mr. Hutchins nominated Mr. J.N. Myers, as Boro Secretary, and seconded by Mr. Berg. On roll call of Council, Mr. Perry received the following four votes; Messers Winter, Stanger, Smith and Grey. Mr. Myers received the following two votes. Messers Hutchins and Berg. Mr. Perry was declared elected to the office of Secretary. Mr. Berg, made a motion and duly seconded that the election of Mr. Perry, be made unananimus. Carried and so ordered.

The Burgess, at this point turned the meeting over to the newly elected President of Council, Mr. Grey. Mr. Smith made a motion, seconded by Mr. Winter, that the office of all employees be declared vacant except those of the Treasurer and Secretary, ~~and also the~~ *and also the* Board of Health, Zoning Commission, Shade Tree Commission, so carried and ordered.

On motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Berg, that Mr. F.I. Gollmar, be appointed as Boro Solicitor, and on motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Stanger, the nomination for Boro Solicitor was closed. Carried and so ordered. On roll call vote for Boro Solicitor, Mr. F.I. Gollmar, was elected unananimus. Carried and so ordered.

Borough Engineer - It being understood that this position would terminate when the Borough Manager has been appointed. Mr. James Fulton, of the McBride Surveying and Engineering Co. - was nominated by Mr. Smith, and seconded by Mr. Winter. Mr. Berg resolved that the nomination for Boro Engineer be closed. Carried and so ordered, and on roll call of Council, all voted in favor of Mr. Fulton, as Boro Engineer. So carried and so ordered.

Street Commissioner - Mr. Smith nominated Mr. Wm. H. Angell, as Street Commissioner, and was seconded by Mr. Hutchins. Mr. Stanger made a motion seconded by Mr. Winters, that the nominations close on Mr. Angell, carried and so ordered. And on roll call all voted in favor of Mr. Angell. Carried and so ordered.

At this time Council called a short recess so that the newly elected officers could have their photo taken by the North Hills Journal Photographer. A motion by Mr. Hutchins, seconded by Mr. Berg, that Mr. Wm. D. Raesmeier be appointed Chief of Police. Motion by Berg, seconded by Mr. Smith, nominations be closed. Carried and so ordered. On Roll call vote, all voted in favor of Mr. Raesmeier. Carried and so ordered.

A motion by Mr. Berg, seconded by Mr. Smith, that Mr. Joseph Jones, Mr. John Brauner, Mr. Cornelius Cloger, and Mr. Harry Booth, be appointed as patrolmen of West View Borough. Motion by Mr. Stanger, and seconded by Mr. Berg, that the nominations be closed on patrolmen mentioned. Carried and so ordered, and on roll call vote all voted in favor of the above. Carried and so ordered.

Truck Driver - Mr. Winters, made a motion that we appoint Mr. Carl Fisher, and seconded by Mr. Hutchins, Motion by Mr. Stanger, seconded by Mr. Berg, that the nomination close on Mr. Fisher as truck driver. Carried and so ordered, and on roll call vote was elected. Carried and so ordered.

Mr. Smith made a motion, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that the position of building inspector be held over until the next meeting. Carried and so ordered.

A motion by Mr. Berg, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that Mr. Curtis Evans, be nominated for the position of plumbing inspector. Moved by Mr. Winters, seconded by Mr. Hutchins that the nomination close. Carried and so ordered. On roll call vote all voted for Mr. Evans's appointment as plumbing inspector. So carried and so ordered.

A motion by Mr. Stanger, and seconded by Mr. Berg, that we nominate Mrs. Nancy Milliron as janitress and matron of Boro Hall. And on roll call all voted for Mrs. Milliron. Carried and so ordered.

On motion by Mr. Winters, seconded by Mr. Hutchins, that the North Hills Journal be selected as the boro's official newspaper. Their being no other applications and on roll call vote, the North Hills Journal was declared to be the official paper. Carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Berg, second by Mr. Hutchins that the Treasurer's Bond be set at \$30,000.00, and that the Boro Solicitor draw an ordinance fixing the bond at the proper amounts. This power was given the Solicitor in all cases where bonds are involved, and on vote was carried and so ordered.

A motion by Mr. Winters, seconded by Mr. Berg, that the Boro Solicitor's bond be set at \$5000.00, so carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Berg, that the Boro Secretary and Clerk's bond be set at \$1000.00. Carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Berg and seconded by Mr. Hutchins, that the controller's bond be set at \$2000.00, Carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Berg and seconded by Mr. Hutchins, that the Allegheny Trust Co., be retained as our depository and that the Boro Solicitor, be instructed to make the necessary agreements and on vote, carried and so ordered.

At this time the Burgess, Mr. Gahring, gave the "Oath of Office" to the following: Chief of Police - Mr. Wm. Kaesmeier, Patrolmen - Messers. Branney, Jones, Clogan, Booth, as well as Treasurer, Mr. H.L. Donaldson.

On motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that Council approve the above appointments. Carried and so ordered.

Mr. Stanger, was appointed by the chair to the JOINT -SEWER-COMMITTEE. A discussion was in order concerning the rules and general conduct of regular council meetings. In a motion by Mr. Berg and seconded by Mr. Stanger, that the chair appoint a committee to study the rules and make revisions and suggestions and recommend to council. Carried and so ordered.

At this time no committee was appointed by the chair.

Motion by Mr. Berg, seconded by Mr. Hutchins, that the names of all who took the oath of office, become a part of these minutes. A motion by Mr. Berg, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that council go into regular order of business. Carried and so ordered.

A motion by Mr. Berg, seconded by Mr. Smith, that the retiring members of council be given a vote of "Thanks" and on vote so carried and ordered.

The retiring members of council were Messers Macdonald, Strojce, Sweeney, and Paul.

Motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that the Boro Solicitor be instructed to draft and propose an ordinance establishing the position of Boro Manager, defining the duties and other matters for discussion, at our next council meeting to be held Tuesday, January 13, 1942. And on roll call vote there were four ayes, and two nays. So carried and ordered.

Motion by Mr. Smith, and seconded by Mr. Stanger, that the resolution as presented for C.V. Shoup, be read and adopted, and spread upon the minutes of this meeting, and a copy of same be sent to the bereaved wife and family. So ordered and carried.

The meeting of West View Borough Council was called to order by the Chairman, Mr. Grey, at 8:04 PM, on Tuesday, January 13, 1942. On roll call all answered present, except Mr. Kelly and Mr. Winter.

The reading of the minutes of the Re-organization meeting of January 5, were dispensed with.

Mr. Seethaler Sr. arose from the audience and stated that he was the owner of 4 lots on Bronx Avenue, and are not salable due to Bronx Ave., at this point not being passable and if the boro council would vacate the alley in question to run through to Bronx Ave., he could dispose of these lots to the West View Park Co., who in turn would enlarge their Pony Track on these lots.

Motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that members of council and Boro Solicitor meet with Mr. Seethaler, on Sunday, Jan. 18, at 2:00 PM., when proper inspection could be made at these premises. Council voted to do this.

Motion by Mr. Berg, seconded by Mr. Smith, that the Controller, Mr. McCune, meet at the Allegheny Trust Co., with proper officers and the Boro Treasurer and the Finance Committee, on Saturday, Jan. 17, at 11:00 AM., to examine any and all collaterals held in this bank. Carried and so ordered.

The Controller wanted to know if he could obtain a list of the wages paid the boro employees and it was suggested that he check with the Boro Secretary, who would furnish him with such information. Mr. McCune, wanted to know what authorization there was for the spending of monies, such as payrolls, and other necessary expenses before the budget was passed. The Solicitor stated that he had prepared the resolution which should be passed to take care of this situation and the Treasurer would have to fill in the appropriation numbers and amounts. Mr. Berg, remarked that it would be impossible to estimate the amount at this time, This question was discussed by several members and Mr. Smith, asked the Controller if he would accept a resolution appropriating a certain sum to take care of this matter. He said he would accept this type of resolution if the Solicitor said such was legal. Attorney Kenny, for Mr. Reizenhouser of Clairmont Avenue, took the floor and requested that council make the necessary arrangements to close an alley (Curtis Alley) due to the inconvenience caused by dirt and dust.

Motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that this matter be referred to the Boro Solicitor, to get all the legal information on this and report back at the next regular council meeting. Carried and so ordered.

Mr. Hamburg, took the floor for Mr. Hendenberg, relative to opening a plan lots on the Leech farm, on Center Ave., and asked permission from Council to be permitted to tap these sewers to the West View Main Sewer, and it was recommended that he obtain approval of the type of houses he intended building, from the FHA., and report back to West View Council.

BONDS - Mr. Berg made a motion, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that the Secretary obtain bids, for the various classes of bonds which are required by West View Officers. Carried and so ordered.



The application of Mr. Wm. C. Fisher, for Boro dog catcher was read. On motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that the applicant be given this position for 1942, on the same paying basis as was in force in 1941, being \$100.00 yearly. On roll call vote ayes - Messers. Berg, Stanger, Hutchins, Smith, Grey, naves - none. Carried and so ordered.

The Chief or Police informs council that he had instructions that no dog, are to be hauled in the radio car or were they to be brought up to the hall and placed in any cell, and he suggests that a dog kennel be built, to take care of such conditions.

Motion by Mr. Berg, and seconded by Mr. Stanger, that the Public Works Committee, be given power to build a dog kennell. Carried and so ordered.

Mr. Schaeffer's application for building inspectør was read and on motion by Mr. Smith, and seconded by Mr. Hutchins, be laid on the talbe at next council meeting. Carried and so ordered.

A letter was read from Mrs. Otto J. Antionette, inclosing a bill for \$5.00, covering service of Turner's tow-truck, for pulling them out of Westfield and Ashford Ave., during recent icy spell. we had, and also asked council to make arrangements to give them an outlet to Rochester Road.

Motion by Mr. Stanger, seconded by Mr. Hutchins, that this be received and filed. On vote this motion was lost.

Motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Berg, that insofar as this letter contained a bill in the amount of \$5.00 covering towing as well as comments on the street conditions, that it be received and filed. Carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Berg, seconded by Mr. Hutchins, that this matter pertaining to an outlet to Rochester Road, be referred to the Public Works, and Boro Engineer, and report back to next regular council meeting. Carried and so ordered.

Letter from Mr. Sweeney being his final report as a committeeman on the Joint-Sewer Comm., of a meeting held in December, 1941 and his letter directed to the fact that there were sewer Man Holes that needed inspected and be put in first class shape as soon as possible, and on motion by Mr. Berg, seconded by Mr. Hutchins, that this be referred to the Public Works committee, and Mr. Stanger, of the Joint-Sewers. Carried and so ordered.

Check for \$185.27, accompanied this letter and was turned over to the Treasurer by the Borough clerk.

Motion by Mr. Berg, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that the part of this letter pertaining to vouchers be referred to the Treasurer. Carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Berg, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that Attorney Paul Brants' letter, relating to property being exonerated of taxes on school, be referred to our Borough Solicitor. Carried and so ordered

Motion by Mr. Berg, seconded by Mr. Smith, that Decembers pay roll be received and filed, as well as the reports from the Treasurer and Chief of Police. Carried and so ordered.

COUNCILMAN Kelly - spoke in favor of a Boro Manager, and thinks the time is not ripe at this present time and suggests that Council give this matter a great deal of consideration before the adoption of Boro Mgr.

Mr. Grey spoke as a Tax Payer, and gave his reasons for being against the Boro Manager, and if, was the desire of all the Tax Payers, to have a Boro Manager, he then would be in favor of it.

Mr. McCune, the controller informed Council that the present set-up in the Budget did not provide for the Street Commissioner after March 31.

Solicitor F.I. Gollmar, reminded Council, that there were two other Ordinances that were to be considered pertaining to the vacating of portions of Hart & Webster Alley, for the third reading.

Mr. Giffin ... Mr. Gollmar, Borough Solicitor, discussed the terms of the Architect proposed contract to be entered into with Mr. Giffin, Registered Architect. Mr. Giffin, being present, it was decided that Mr. Giffin's Commission of 3-1/2 percent would be based on the actual cost of construction rather than

the estimate cost. In no case should the construction cost exceed Nine Thousand Dollars (\$9,000.00). The Borough Solicitor was instructed to prepare a contract, incorporating this condition.

George Fuchs ..... Communication, dated December 15, 1942, addressed to Council and signed by Mr. Gollmar, Borough Solicitor, relative to Mr. George Fuchs' problem, in connection with his lot at corner of Highland Avenue and Perry Highway. Motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that the Borough Secretary be instructed to notify Mr. Fuchs that the tax assessment is entirely the responsibility of the County Assessment Board, and that any reduction in tax should be taken up with them. Further, Council does not, at this time, consider any change in the Zoning Law, which might have a bearing on this property. Carried and so ordered.

Mr. Montgomery, from the Audience, spoke in connection with the George Fuchs' property. He stated that he represented several owners, near and around this section, who are very unwilling that this property should be classed "Commercial".

Burgess Report .... Motion by Mr. Ford, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that the Burgess' Report for November 1942, be accepted. Carried and so ordered.

Borough Hall ..... Motion by Mr. Stanger, seconded by Mr. Winter, that the use of The Borough Hall be turned over to No. 1 Fire Company when the present Municipal Offices have removed to the new Municipal Building, and after Council and No. 1 Fire Company have entered into an agreement, governing the use of the building. Carried and so ordered.

Pittsburgh Railways Co. - Lot #495 Communication dated December 15, 1942, from the Borough Solicitor, Mr. Frank I. Gollmar, in connection with the request of Pittsburgh Railways Company for



permission to occupy Lot No. 495, Keating West View Plan. Motion by Mr. Baker, Seconded by Mr. Ford, that the request be held in abeyance until such time as more information is obtainable. Carried and so ordered. Councilman Smith wished to be recorded as not voting as is his custom in matters pertaining to the Philadelphia Company.

Used Furniture Motion by Mr. Stanger, seconded by Mr. Winter, that used furniture as secured from Amalgamated Association of Iron, Steel and Tin Workers of N. A. be purchased as a cost of \$173.75

Rental - .....
