ORDINANCE NO. 818

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING SMOKING IN STREET CARS, BUSES OR OTHER PUBLIC CONVEYANCES IN THE BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW: requiring posting of signs regarding the said prohibition, and providing penalties for violations thereof.

Motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Winter, that Ordinance No. 818 pass first reading. Roll Call: Ayes - Messrs Baker, Winter, Hutchins and Stanger. Nays - Mr. Grey. Carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Winter, that Ordinance No. 818 be taken up for second reading, title read only. Roll Call: Ayes - Messrs Baker, Winter, Hutchins and Stanger. Nays - Mr. Grey. Carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Winter, that Ordinance No. 818 pass second reading. Roll Call: Ayes - Messrs Baker, Winter, Hutchins and Stanger. Nays - Mr. Grey. Carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that Council suspend the rules to take up Ordinance No. 818 for third reading and final passage. Carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Winter, that Ordinance No. 818 be amended in Section 3 as follows:

"Nor more than ten dollars", to be inserted and the sentence to now read:

"Section 3 - "Any person violating the provisions of Section 1 of this Ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof in a summary proceeding before the Burgess or a Justice of the Peace in The Borough of West View, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than ten dollars and costs. In default of payment of such fine and costs, the offender shall be sentenced to be confined in the County Jail for a period of not less than one day nor more than five days."

Motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Winter, that Ordinance No. 818 pass third reading and final passage as amended. Roll Call: Ayes - Messrs Baker, Winter, Hutchins and Stanger. Nays: Mr. Grey. Carried and so ordered. Councilman Smith wished to be recorded as not voting as is his custom in matters pertaining to the Philadelphia Company.

Motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that a copy of Ordinance No. 818 shall be sent to all transportation companies operating within the Borough of West View. Carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Winter, that copies of Ordinance No. 818 be posted along transportation "Stops". Carried and so ordered.

Justus Evan's Communication dated January 9, 1943, from Justus Evans, Plumbing Inspector, read. Motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Hutchins, that the Borough Clerk be instructed to type Mr. Evan's monthly report. Carried and so ordered.

Mr. McCune Letter from Mr. F. S. McCune, Controller, dated January 12, 1943, read as follows:

Motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Hutchins, that the proper Borough Officials be authorized to execute the agreement with Mr. Giffin. Carried and so ordered.

Used Office .. Mr. Frank Gollmar, Borough Solicitor, discussing the Furniture purchase by The Borough of used furniture from the Amalgamated Association of Iron, Steel and Tin Workers of U. S. A., stated that since the ~~paid for the articles and the seller had seen fit to re-possess, then no contract, at this time, exists.~~ Mr. Gollmar further stated that in his opinion, Council could not have been surcharged for this purchase since Mr. Grey severed his connection with the Amalgamated Association of Iron, Steel, and Tin Workers of U. S. A., on June 30, 1942. Councilman Grey also explained his position in this matter and re-stated that his motive was only for the good of West View Borough. WEST VIEW BOROUGH COUNCIL MEETING

January 19, 1943.

Minutes of an Adjourned Meeting of West View Borough Council held January 19, 1943, at the Municipal Building, Ridgewood Avenue, West View, at 8 P M Eastern War Time.

Roll Call Meeting was called to order by the President, Mr. William Grey. Roll Call was answered by the following Members of Council: Messrs Baker, Smith, Stanger and Grey.

Mr. Giffin ... Mr. Baker stated that his Committee (Property & Purchase) Architect had met with Mr. Giffin, Architect, in Bellevue, on Thursday, January 14. The Committee carefully went over Mr. Giffin's estimates of the cost of alterations to the new Municipal Building and recommend certain reductions in each plan which Mr. Giffin had prepared.

Mr. Giffin, being present, explained the revised estimates as follows:

PLAN 1 - Council Chamber to occupy three rooms across the front of the building on the second floor. Original Estimate \$11,939.02 - Revised Estimate \$9,759.00.

PLAN 2 - Council Chamber on the first floor with slight changes to second floor. Original Estimate \$9,153.00 - Revised Estimate \$8,800.00.

PLAN 3 - Council Chamber along the side of the building on the second floor. Original estimate \$10,374.00 - Revised Estimate \$9,024.00.

Mr. Giffin stated that he had contacted Mr. Brotzman of the Office of Production Management, who intimated to Mr. Giffin that it would be very likely that priority assistance would be furnished for a project of this type.

Motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Baker, that the Borough Manager be instructed to proceed with the work necessary to secure a priority certificate. Estimate to be based on Plan 1 - \$9,759.00 alterations for both the Municipal Building and the Municipal Garage Building.

Roll Call - Ayes: Messrs Baker, Smith, Stanger and Grey.
Nays: None.

Mr. Giffin further stated that he would withhold the preparation of specifications until the priority certificate was secured.

Alfred Smith .. Mr. Alfred Smith, from the audience, addressing Council, asked when he might expect payment for services rendered in connection with alterations in the basement of the Borough Hall.
Motion by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Baker, that the President, of Council be appointed a Committee of one to confer with

the Solicitor and formulate the proper plan of action to force the Controller to approve the payment of the just bills of The Borough. Carried and so ordered.

Duquesne Light.... Motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that the Ordinance for furnishing electric lights for the streets of The Borough of West View be held over to the next Regular Meeting of Council. Carried and so ordered.

Mrs. Doehla President William Grey reads a communication from Frank I. Gollmar, Solicitor, as follows:

"Members of Council,
West View, Pa.

Gentlemen:

I have been advised by the attorney representing Mrs. Doehla that she is still on crutches and while they are not disposed to make a case out of this, they do not, at this time, care to admit that the injuries are not such as would require settlement. I will keep in touch with this matter and advise you from time to time."

5% Victory Tax... Chairman William Grey reads letter from Frank I. Gollmar, Solicitor, as follows:
"Memo to Mr. McCall from Mr. Gollmar:
RE - 5 Percent Victory Tax

As I interpret the regulation, the 5 percent should not be deducted on any monthly salary or retainer fees where the amount is less than \$52.00. If the amount weekly is less than \$12.00, this is also true.

In those cases where the Borough pays fees which are strictly professional, such as the Architect's fee, the Borough does not make any deduction. The duty is on the party receiving the money to file his return."

Motion by Mr. Baker, seconded by Mr. Smith, that Mr. Gollmar's Memo be received and filed. Carried and so ordered.

Railway Tracks Committee, presented a report relative to the condition of the street car tracks from Horse Shoe Bend car stop to the upper entrance of Park.
Motion by Mr. Stanger, seconded by Mr. Baker, that the report be accepted and filed and that the Borough Manager be instructed to notify the Pittsburgh Railways Company of the unsafe conditions as outlined in Mr. Winter's report and inform the Street Railways Company that corrections are to be made immediately.

was never consummated and therefore this is now a moot question. But even if the furniture had been retained by the Borough, I am of the opinion, based on law, that the Members of Council could not have been surcharged. I suppose this question arose because Mr. William Grey, a Member of Council, had voted for the purchase of this furniture. Mr. Grey was formerly Vice President of the Amalgamated Association International. He ceased to be Vice President and a member of that organization on June 30, 1942, when, by resolution duly adopted at a national convention of the Association, it was merged with the United Steel Workers. At the time of the purchase of the furniture by the Borough, Mr. Grey was not a member of either the Amalgamated Association or of the United Steel Workers.

The proceeds of the sale of this furniture, had the contract been consummated, would have inured to the benefit of the United Steel Workers. Since both the Amalgamated Association and the United Steel Workers are a non-profit corporation, under no circumstances would Mr. Grey have had any interest in the financial profit, if any had been made.

I am informed by Mr. McCall, the Borough Manager, aside from all this, that the purchase was made from Mr. Louis Leonard, who was formerly Secretary and Treasurer of the Amalgamated.

As stated above, the question is now moot, the contract was never consummated, and the Members of Council cannot nor could they have been surcharged by reason of the purchase of the furniture. The penalty provided in the Act is not for surcharge.

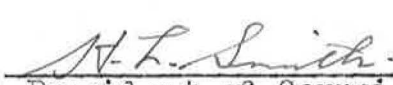

Gentlemen:

I am returning, without my approval, Budget Resolution No. 334 and Ordinance No. 821, this being the Salary Ordinance, for the reason that the Salary of the

Borough Manager is fixed in both the Budget Resolution and in the Salary Ordinance at \$195.00 per month. The Ordinance now in effect fixes the salary of the Borough Manager at \$3600.00 per year. When I signed the ordinance setting up the Municipal Authority it was represented to me, by Members of Council, that the Borough would never be required to pay anything by reason of the Municipal Authority.

I know that the Municipal Authority agreed to pay the Borough Manager \$150.00 per month for his services as Secretary. His remaining salary from the Borough, therefore, would be \$150.00 per month, instead the Budget Resolution and the Salary Ordinance both fix it at \$195.00 per month. This is an increase cost to the Borough of \$45.00 per month. I know that the Borough Manager is rendering additional services as acting manager to the Municipal Authority, giving at least three hours of his time each day to this work. It seems to me that if the Borough Manager is to receive extra compensation by reason of extra services which he is giving to the Municipal Authority that the Municipal Authority and not the Borough should pay him for these extra services.

I have no objection to any man being paid whatever he is worth, but under the arrangement now existing between the Borough and the Municipal Authority, the Borough Manager is giving three hours less service each day to the Borough than he did before.

I want to see both the Borough Manager plan and the Municipal Authority succeed, but I think each should have its own responsibilities and each should assume the same.

For the above reasons I am vetoing both the Budget Resolution and the Salary Ordinance.

It shall not be lawful for any burgess, or Member of Council of any Borough, or any officer, agent or employee thereof, to be in any way interested, either directly or indirectly, in any contract for the sale of furnishing of any supplies or material to be furnished to or for the use of such borough involving the expenditure by the Borough of more than \$25.00 in any one month, or more than \$300.00 in any year, or to receive any reward or gratuity from any person interested in such contract or sale; nor shall any burgess, Member of Council, officer, agent or employee of any borough be a member of any partnership, or stockholder or official of any corporation, or an agent or employee of any individual, partnership or corporation in any way interested in any contract for the sale or furnishing of any supplies or material to be furnished to or for the use of, or any work to be done for such borough involving the expenditure by the borough of more than \$25.00 in any one month or more than \$300.00 in any year; any person violating these provisions, or any of them, shall forfeit his office or appointment in such borough and also shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

Provision of private branch exchange service and the relocation of the two free telephones under the Borough of West View Ordinance, to your new municipal headquarters necessitates the erection of two poles on private property.

In accordance with our tariffs, customers are required either

1. To furnish, erect and maintain the necessary poles in accordance with the Telephone Company's specifications or
2. To pay the Telephone Company charges for furnishing and erecting the necessary poles, as follows:

"Where poles are to be furnished and erected, either new or as replacements, a construction charge of \$18.00 applies for each pole with necessary anchors and guys. However, if the poles are to be used for carrying electric light and power circuits as well as telephone circuits and larger poles, or more expensive construction is required than would be used for supporting telephone circuits exclusively, the customer is required to pay the actual cost of furnishing and erecting the poles, plus 10% for administration, but in no case shall the charge be less than \$18.00 per pole. Such poles shall be maintained, and replaced when necessary, in accordance with the Telephone Company's specifications, by the customer or at his expense."

The estimated cost of providing the poles required on private property at the new Borough building location is \$35 per pole.

Will you please let me know promptly which alternative you wish to follow?

Since all our requests to John Schar of the West View Ice Company have been completely ignored for the past ten years, concerning the perpetual noise and disturbances of his Diesel engine, I now appeal to you as the Burgess of West View, to find out if there cannot be a way to muffle the straight exhaust and in so doing allow us a night's sleep. I am safe in saying there is not a Diesel engine in Pittsburgh that has been allowed to keep up such a racket day and night for the best part of six months each year.

We have owned this home for twenty six years and as a taxpayer of that long standing, I feel it is due time a little consideration be paid me now.

The exhaust of that engine is a perpendicular pipe ten or twelve feet high without a sign of any kind of a muffler.

The side window of my bedroom actually rattles at times, from the vibration of the engine - a condition which is very unpleasant and nerve racking at night.

On different occasions during his life, my husband, Lloyd Brant, had requested Mr. Schar, as a gentleman, to quiet this engine with a muffler but was informed that would be detrimental to the machinery as it would heat it unduly. So we have endured the continual racket as best we could for at least six months of each year - day and night.

Please give this letter your kind consideration. I assure you it will be greatly appreciated by us in our home. There surely must be an ordinance in this borough to handle this complaint.

Councilman garding the Status of Mr. Harry Smith as a Councilman of
Smith The Borough of West View: the Solicitor quoted the following from a similar case which was tried in the case of an employee of The Duquesne Light Company serving as Councilman in Millvale Borough:

"Rates for electric light and power are controlled by the Public Service Commission; and uniform for all consumers for purchasers are without competing sources of supply. If any Borough in the area served by the Duquesne Light Company desires current for light or power, it must pay the rates, on file with the Commission and it must obtain its supply from the company or go without. Electric current is not the subject of the contract in the ordinary and usual sense of the word. It has been removed from the field of commercial competition and the doctrine of Laissez Faire no longer applies. Service of such a utility is a monopoly regulated by Government. It is not a matter for negotiation, bargain and sale upon which contracts, in the ordinary and usual sense of the word, are passed. Nor can it be classified as "supplies and materials" as those words are commonly understood. In our judgment, the sale or furnishing of supplies or materials does not include the or sale of furnishing of electric current for light and power and no disqualifying interest on the part of the defendant has been shown that would subject him to the penalty of the amendment."

The decision of Judge Morrow in the Ebner case was a criminal procedure. The question there was whether or not Mr. Ebner was guilty of a misdemeanor as provided in the Act. The Court held that he was not guilty and consequently I must advise you that this decision would be a proper answer on any charge that might be brought against Mr. Smith.

Mr. Smith is not guilty of a misdemeanor.

The contract of The Borough of West View with the Duquesne Light Company is legal even though Mr. Smith may have approved it as a Councilman or approved payments thereunder and that he has not forfeited his right to serve as a Member of the Town Council of the Borough of West View.

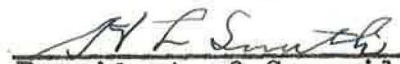

"West View, Penn'a.

August 4, 1943.

President of Council,

West View, Penn'a.

Sir:

In January 1942, the writer was installed through the vote of the people to the Office of Controller. It has been a pleasure to handle the responsibilities which this work carried with it, as long as the activities of the controller would fully safeguard the interests of the people.

However, in the latter part of 1942, The Borough of West View acquired the properties of the Pittsburgh Suburban Water Service Company through the Municipal Authority. This is now therefore, by far the largest single property interest of the Borough.

The writer has been advised by attorney that he is, by law, the designated authority of the Borough to examine the records of the Municipal Authority. This is a serious responsibility and one which it is my duty to meet.

But to meet it, I must be permitted to get to the books of the Municipal Authority.

I have gone to the office of the Authority - as instructed by their manager -- during business hours to see the records and was denied the privilege. Then I appealed to the Authority to see the records on a Saturday afternoon and was again denied this privilege.

Then the majority of Council -

Mr. Baker,

Mr. Ford

Mr. Winters

Mr. Smith

voted to rescind an action of council which had designated the Controller to examine these records.

By law, of course, council has no jurisdiction in the matter anyway; yet, this action indicated clearly the position Council takes.

This action taken together with the attitude of the Authority makes it perfectly clear that both bodies are determined that the present Controller, elected by the people, will not be permitted to review the records of the Authority without a bitter court action.

Under ordinary circumstances, this would be a happy opportunity to, once again, bring a victory to the people of West View. But since I am a defense worker and since my schedule has very recently been stepped up, I am not going to take the time required for a drawn out court action.

Under these circumstances, I feel impelled to let the Authority and the majority of council have their way.

As stated above, under the circumstances, I will not become involved in a drawn out law suit, nor will I bear the responsibility which the law imposes for making reasonable checks on the transactions of the Water Company when the possibility of looking at their records is denied me.

Therefore, I hereby resign the Office of Controller, effective immediately.

Motion by Mr. Grey, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that the bunks in the cells be hinged and hung on chains suspended from the wall.

Carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Stanger, seconded by Mr. Winter, that the bunks be covered with sheet metal or made of metal.

Carried and so ordered.

Motion by Mr. Grey, seconded by Mr. Stanger, that a committee be appointed to investigate to see if someone would accept the stained glass door in the chapel of the new building.

Carried and so ordered.

Chairman Smith appointed Mr. Grey as a Committee of One to carry out this motion.

Motion by Mr. Stanger, seconded by Mr. Winter, that the Special Building Committee be authorized to secure labor and material to replace the art glass in front of the New Municipal Building (4 small windows and door) with Glass Block at an approximate cost of \$170.00.

Also, the monthly wages of employees be increased 15% above present rate; catch basin cleaner to be paid a differential above laborers.

Working hours to be scheduled from 8:00 A M to 4:30 P M. Overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and

onehalf Sundays and holidays being included at time and one half.

President's

Report The following report was read to Council by President Harry L. Smith:

"December 14, 1943.

To The Town Council of The Borough of West View:

As this is the last Regular Meeting of this Council, which has been in existence since January 1, 1942, I feel that some form of report should be made by the President of that Council.

In that time, due to resignations and deaths, it has been necessary for Council to select and appoint two Members of Council, a Tax Collector, Controller, Treasurer and Solicitor. In this time four secretaries have been appointed and since a precedent was established in the appointment of Mrs. Naomi Guckert to that position, I wish to take advantage of this opportunity to say that she has proven to be one of the most efficient secretaries this Borough has ever had. I am constantly receiving comments from the public to this effect.

The appointments of Mr. Ford and Mr. Baker to fill vacancies on Council have given to this body the much needed experience which they possess.

The creation of the Municipal Authority and the subsequent acquisition of The Pittsburgh Suburban Water Company undoubtedly was the high point of the past two years. This action will be returning dividends to West View long after this Council's memory has faded.

The purchase of the "Villa Schwitter" and the transformation into the modern Municipal Building in which we are now holding our first Meeting is another high spot of the last two years. I might suggest to you that all efforts be made to continue with the improvements to the garage and grounds and

that some thought be given to making available for the use of the public, some part of the third floor. There have been several requests for this service and since this building belongs to the people it seems to me it should be made available to them.

While our experience with the City Manager did not turn out as we had hoped, it did prove that this is the only way to operate a Borough and I am sure that among the applications you are now considering, we will find the answer to our troubles.

While this Council has made progress in other directions, we have done very little towards street improvement and sewerage. I sincerely hope that the next Council will be able to point with pride to their achievements with those items. In this connection, I would like to suggest the appointment of a Special Council Committee to work with men to be appointed by the various civic organizations of The Borough in formulating a post war improvement program. This committee should be appointed by the President of the New Council and should lose no time in establishing definite plans and program.

A special study should be made of our sewers, and plans made to lay new ones or to increase the size of existing lines.

Thought should be given to our street lighting. Not only are we far short of the necessary number of lights but the entire street lighting system is a relic of the days when West View was a cow pasture.

Erection of street signs is another badly needed improvement.

West View is fortunate in having one of the most efficient Volunteer Fire Departments in the country. They are handicapped by lack of an adequate alarm system. This should be installed at the earliest possible moment.

Provision should be made for the purchase of a new truck to replace the presently owned Ford which has outlived its usefulness.

I suggest that a vigorous campaign be waged to collect delinquent taxes and municipal claims. In these times of large incomes we should be able to collect a large percentage of the money due the Borough. During the last year delinquent tax collections in Pittsburgh and Allegheny County was much higher than at any time in the past, but in West View, these collections sank to the lowest level in ten years. It seems to me that some plan by which the Solicitor would be made responsible for the collection of delinquent taxes would eliminate delay and duplication of work.

It has been a pleasure to serve as your Chairman and I wish to extend my thanks for the cooperation you have given me. May your next two years be successful and serve as the starting point of a new deal for
