Mr. Frank Ittel, representing Wellington Heights Association, questioned Mr. Phillips as follows: "Are you here as the owner of the property or the Agent?"

Mr. Phillips reviewed the transaction of the sale of the property by Wellington Heights Land Company, and said that the titles are being held by Judge Guenther.

Since acquiring the land, six of the lots have been sold to individuals.

Mr. Ittel asked questions RE; garages and he was advised the garages were to be under the porches, that the cost price of the double houses would be \$17,000.00, with the exception of the duplexes on Perry Highway, and the ones on Highland Avenue would be close to \$15,000.00.

Vaughn and Brown will build the homes and Murrer and Phillips will control the full building of them. Brown and Vaughan will control the sale - the minute a pick goes into the ground, the deed immediately goes to Brown & Vaughan.

We are now in the process of getting priorities and ready to go into the big six on the Perry Highway and the three lots next to the gas station and on Highland Avenue next to the field house.

A new set of plans were made with the 5 foot from lot line.

Mr. Cording, of Marquette Drive, asked what assurance is there that the buildings in the interior will be single dwellings. The answer was that it so stated in the letter and if there is any other assurance

you want from us, in writing or in any other way at all, we will give it to you.

Mr. Phillips also said "We plan to control the entire building on all the vacant lots and we do not want to sell any of them with the exception of one lot which we consider unfit."

Mrs. Julius Graf, 609 Perry Highway, stated "I was under the impression no building could be built on the fifty foot lot due to the utilities running through lot at No. 605 Perry Highway."

Mr. Hogner, 537 Perry Highway, expressed an opinion that he did not approve of the double entrances as shown on the plan and also the roofing material that it was proposed to use.

Mr. Phillips advised that the matters would be taken under advisement, but that the double entrances as shown were very attractive after completion - this same design had been used on some homes in Washington, D.C.

Mr. Jansen, Marquette Road, stated that when they bought their lot, there were certain restrictions in the deed and it seems that those coming in now should be tied down to the same restrictions and it should be guaranteed about the building restricting only single dwellings, the same as when we bought our lots.

Also, at the time Mr. Jansen built, you were not allowed to use anything but slate or tile roof.

Mr. Phillips stated a study of the plan was made and they felt you "Just could not build a 2-family dwelling on Marquette Road."

Mr. Jansen states - "There are certain lots which face on Marquette Road which run through to the Drive. The buildings were to face on Marquette Road. What would prevent anyone from building on Wellington Drive instead of Marquette Road?"

Mr. Phillips answered - "It would not be the thing to do, to build on the Drive, and we would recommend to Mr. Brown that we build on Marquette Road on account of garage driveways, etc."

Mr. Jansen - "There were a great many restrictions in our title, and as I have said before, these people are still tied to these restrictions."

Mr. Phillips - "We are enough in control of this thing that we will give you any guarantee you want that single family dwellings only will be built on the interior lots."

Mr. Rousseau - 401 Jamaica Avenue states - "I want to call your attention to lots 3-4-5-25 and 27 along the old frog pond. Our building on Number 6 extended 12 feet below the cellar floor, or 20 feet below Perry Highway. The same condition existed on Judge Montgomery's house and the Pennzeil. Under present day building costs I certainly doubt if they can build these houses at \$14,000.00 figure and do it properly. The foundation at 537 Perry Highway cost us \$2,000.00." He further stated - "Anoth point I want to bring out in connection with this is that on Lot 33 we were required to set the house back 30 feet to the garage door. It is important to hold back 30 feet as there is a proposal for widening Highland Avenue, which will cut 15 feet from that side of Highland Avenue." Mr. Rousseau further states - "Anything that is agreed upon for the balance of the lots should be made a matter of public record by a restricted deed for the records."

Mr. Phillips stated - "I think the proposal of widening Highland Avenue is a good thing for us to know because we do not want the buildings to go out too close to Highland Avenue. If need be, I believe we could redesign those dwellings and possibly put the garage door entrance to the side or move the building back a little more. We will be glad to agree to that."

Mr. Rousseau stated - "It might be worth while considering dividing those lots into larger lots and fewer lots."

Judge Montgomery - "I ask Council to take into consideration that the Montgomery property is affected most. I anticipated I would stare into the rear of perhaps three houses on Highland Avenue but I did not expect to stare into twice that many and did not take into consideration having one rear entrance on my front lawn."

Mr. Phillips said - "We expect to purchase lot No. 26 from the Banking Department. Then we will come back to The Borough and change Lot No. 26 and No. 27 to be fronting on Montclair. The corner lot would then be on the same building line as the Judge's, one entrance on Montclair, one on Highland and one in the back. We feel we want to put this land to its highest and best use and we did not dive into this matter without study."

Mr. Ittel states - "We are unanimous in our objection to the double houses and want to go on record as opposing the application for any double houses whatsoever."

Mr. Walter Brenneis - "In the buildings that have been constructed in the last eight or ten years, we have endeavored to run the brick from the ground up so that the basement walls are not exposed. Could you run the

brick down to the ground on Perry Highway and between Montclair and Perry Highway on Highland?"

Mr. Brown, of Brown & Vaughan stated that they had a development out in McCandless Township and that they invite anyone to see that development and that he believed it will meet the answers to these objections that have just been mentioned, that they have been in business for a number of years and it has been their policy and intent to always uphold the community and erect the same type as previous buildings.

Mr. Phillips said that in closing, there have been three things brought out, i.e., foundations and roofs, entrances and moving the dwellings back from Highland Avenue. These matters will be given study and consideration.

Mr. Frank Armour stated - "I have just purchased a home at Jamaica & Highland Avenues and expect to move in next Saturday. I purchased on the basis there are restrictions and I hope they will be upheld."

Mr. C. L. Fisher stated he had bought two lots on the Perry Highway last November and that he has an agreement which states that a 2-family dwelling can be erected and he checked the matter at the Borough Hall before he bought the lots. He asked what recourse he has if he cannot build the 2-family house. When asked by Mr. Phillips from whom he purchased the lots, he stated from Bob Hamburg.

Mr. Keeler from Montclair Avenue asked Mr. Phillips "Do you intend to build all brick or are some to be stone and some brick?"

Mr. Phillips answered - "Probably all brick. If some way can be worked out whereby we can get some stone, I am certainly ready to state we will do so."

Mr. Hogner stated that some of the elevations show the second story to be of stucco and Mr. Phillips is to be asked to prepare a letter to stipulate what the elevations will be like.

Mr. Supple, Marquette Road, asked Mr. Phillips: - "What do you plan to do with the excavation dirt? Will it be planned to dump the dirt over there or will it be removed from the Plan?"

Mr. Phillips answered, "We will need the dirt in building in the hollow, and if there is more than enough, it will be hauled away."

At intervals during the Meeting, Mr. Graham asked that if anyone in the group cared to state something or ask a question of Mr. Phillips, that they feel free to do so.

He also asked Mr. Ittel if he or some of the Members of his association would care to meet in private with Mr. Phillips to discuss the matter, and if so, they were free to use the Committee Room to do so.

After repeating the above request for anyone who had anything to say, to please do so, Mr. Graham adjourned the meeting.

Time of adjournment was 9:15 P M.

Information given by Mr. Frank Ittel:

The covenants contained in the deed from the Land Company to Charles Steinhauser et ux (for lots 109 and 110) are typical and are as follows;

"The party of the first part hereto reserves the right to use the rear five feet of the above described lot for the purpose of installing sewers, water, gas, electric lines or other utilities with the right of access to same for the purpose of constructing, repairing or removing the same.

"THIS CONVEYANCE is made subject to the following covenants and restrictions which shall run with the land until the First day of January 1970 and no longer:

"(a) No building erected on the within described premises shall be used as a business establishment or for business purposes or for any purpose adjudged a nuisance.

"(b) Only one dwelling of single family type shall be erected on the above described lot and no garage shall be erected on said lot except the same shall be built in combination with said dwelling. Said dwelling house shall cost not less than \$10,000.00 and shall be constructed only of brick, stone or concrete and conform to the building line on said plan.

"(c) Plan for said dwelling is to be submitted to and approved by the seller as to exterior design and architecture before construction is started.

"(d) No fence shall be erected on said property other than hedges and decorative shrubbery which may be planted and cultivated."

Excerpts from Adjourned Meeting of the Town Council of The Borough of West View, held Wednesday Evening, April 17, 1946, in the Council Chamber at the Municipal Building.

The President of Council, after calling the Meeting to order and roll call, announced the purpose of this Adjourned Meeting is to consider the appeal of Murrer & Phillips from the decision of the Building Inspector's refusal to grant building permits for eighteen 2-family dwellings in Wellington Heights Plan of West View. He announced - "We would like to have this meeting conducted in parliamentary manner, and each side shall be given a chance to be heard."

Mr. Tryon .. representing Murrer & Phillips, said - "I am the attorney for the applicant, do you want to take testimony?"

Mr. Phillips advised - "We submitted our application and the letter which accompanied the applications for the permit for building the eighteen 2-family dwellings and we have complied with every requirement of the Building Code and the Zoning Code."

Motion by Mr. Herrington, seconded by Mr. Kress, that the letter which accompanied the applications and the amendments be entered upon the Minutes of this Meeting and become a part of the record.

Carried and so ordered.

Dear Mr. Graham:

I am writing this letter in explanation of the application for permits filed in the name of Brown and Vaughan for permission to build two-family dwelling houses upon certain lots in the Wellington Heights Plan in the Borough of West View. The plans and specifications and plot plans are now in your possession.

Brown and Vaughan were influenced in their decision to build two-family dwelling houses upon these lots by the fact that both Perry Highway and Highland Road, upon which these lots front, are important traffic arteries and for that reason are better adapted to two-family dwelling houses than they are to a desirable type of single family home. Their judgment in this respect has to some extent been confirmed by the fact that there are already two two-family dwelling houses erected upon the Perry Highway frontage.

They are further influenced in the same direction by the fact that at the corner of Perry Highway and Highland Avenue is a gasoline station and it must be obvious to any thoughtful person that the dwellings to be erected adjoining or adjacent to a gasoline station should be in the nature of an investment property rather than a desirable type single family dwelling. Certainly no one is likely to build a nice single family home within a lot or two of a gasoline station.

The proposed two-family dwellings you will observe from the plans and specifications are architecturally attractive and functionally sound. They have even been designed to present the appearance of a particularly handsome single family dwelling house by resorting to the device of a single front entrance on Perry Highway, with the same treatment for several of the proposed dwellings on Highland Avenue. In no way can it be said that the proposed units will detract from the neighborhood in which they are to be built; on the contrary they will be found to add greatly to the appearance of the community.

With respect to the ^{remaining} available lots in the plan it is proposed that the dwellings to be erected will be single family homes of attractive appearance, comparable with many of the homes now existing in the plan.

It is the intention of Brown and Vaughan to begin work as quickly as possible and present plans are to have construction under way not later than April 1, 1946. We shall, therefore, greatly appreciate action on the application for the permits as soon as possible.

permits covering eighteen two-family residences along the Perry Highway and Highland Avenue in the Wellington Heights Plan of Lots.

It is my understanding that paragraph (A) has been discussed and answered by Mr. Tryon, attorney representing Brown and Vaughan, Inc. Referring to paragraph (b), we wish to advise that we will comply with the building line, and that the garages, as shown on the plans as being located under the porch platform, will not extend over the 30 ft. building line of Highland Avenue. In answer to paragraph (c), please be advised that the owners or those who might have an equity interest are Herman Windt, Blair F. Gunther, and Brown and Vaughan, Inc., who have made a bona fide offer to purchase the eighteen lots on which building permits have been requested.

Mr. Phillips - "We are still asking for the building permits because they are in accordance with the Building Code and the Zoning Code.

Mr. Frank Ittel - "I represent the Wellington Heights Association and also the respective owners there. May I ask if the letters become a part of this Meeting without reiteration at this time?"

Mr. Ford replied that we all know what those letters contain.

Motion by Mr. Kress, seconded by Mr. Herrington, that the transcript of the Building Inspector's Hearing be placed upon the Minutes.
Carried and so ordered.
(Transcript of Building Inspector's Hearing of April 1, 1946, is attached hereto.

Mr. Tryon requested a copy of that transcript and the request is to be granted.

Mr. Brandt, Borough Solicitor, read the paragraph of that transcript which referred to the owners of the property on which the houses are to be built.

Mr. Kress asked if \$17,000.00 is to be the selling price of the dwellings or the cost price. Mr. Phillips answered that the priorities are for \$17,000.00, which is the cost price.

Mr. Ford stated that it was a matter for the applicants and the protestants to decide if they care to have this matter go through the Board of Adjustment or through this Council.

Mr. Tryon stated - "The Building Ordinance provides that the appeal from the decision in refusing the permits can be made to this Council within five days. Your Zoning Ordinance says the appeal can be taken to the Board of Adjustment. In order to forestall any legal difficulties, I wrote a letter to the Board of Adjustment, informing them that the Building Inspector had turned down the permits, and pointed out the discrepancies in the two codes, and stated that we were willing to let this hearing stand in lieu of an appeal to their Board, if they so desire. If they want it to come before the Board of Adjustment, we will do so. We will do it either or both ways - whatever you want."

Mr. Brandt stated - "In my opinion, since the original hearing was held by the Building Inspector, the appeal lies from the refusal under the Building Code, and should be heard by the Town Council." He continued - "But because of the letter which you wrote, I suggested to Council tonight that if the applicants and the protestants feel that the proper board is the Board of Adjustment, and were willing to so stipulate, we will transfer the hearing to the Board of Adjustment. My opinion was and still is that this is the proper place."

Mr. Tryon - "As long as we receive word that we will have a legal right to take this to court, it is all right to have the matter before this Council. If it is necessary to take an appeal from this decision to court, we do not want it thrown back in our face."

Mr. Tryon was told they would have that right.

Mr. Ford then asked if the protestants have anything additional to offer that was not brought out at the Building Inspector's Meeting.

Mr. Ittel called on Mr. V. W. Nettletrour, who stated he has been in the real estate business for seventeen years. When asked in what areas or territories, he stated he operated in Mt. Lebanon, etc.

Mr. Ittel asked - "Are you familiar generally with real estate in The Borough of West View?" Reply was "Yes".

Question by Mr. Ittel - "Have you sold properties in the plan?" Answer "No".

Question by Mr. Ittel - "Have you had any in the past?"

Mr. Nettletrour - "I have had one for sale."

Mr. Nettletrour also said - "I felt that people that were in the plan and adjacent to it know a lot more about it than I know, but I have always admired it as a strictly residential district. one of the best, in fact, the best

in The Borough.

Question by Mr. Ittel - "Are you familiar with the application for the building of eighteen 2-family double houses along Perry Highway and the lots on which they desire to build?"

Mr. Nettleur answered "Yes".

Mr. Ittel - "In your opinion would it be advantageous or detrimental to the plan to build these houses?"

Mr. Tryon "I would like to object to that question as it has nothing to do with the Building Inspector's refusal to grant the permits."

Mr. Ford refused the objection and stated we wanted to hear all of the facts from both sides.

Mr. Nettleur - "I believe double houses are detrimental to a residential district."

Mr. Ittel - "Do you believe in this particular instance?"
Answer - "Yes".

Mr. Ittel asked - "In your experience, have you found double houses in a residential area a detrimental factor in selling single dwelling houses in that area?"

Mr. Nettleur's answer - "They have an affect on the selling price when selling single dwellings."

Mr. Tryon Asked Mr. Nettleur - "Would you call this a strictly residential district? Are you familiar with the gas station on the plan and the double houses in the plan?"
Mr. Nettleur's answer - "Yes".

Mr. Tryon "They are in the same plan. What would you suggest next to that gas station, single family residences?"

Mr. Nettleur answered - "Personally I do not own property next to the gas station, and would not want either double houses or single houses next to a gas station."

Mr. Tryon "Then building the double houses would be an advantage to the community?"

Mr. Nettleur - "Not necessarily."

Mr. Tryon "Do you know how many double houses in that plan on the Perry Highway?"

Mr. Nettleur "I know of two, but they do not give the appearance of a double house."

Mr. Tryon "Have you examined the applications? Have you examined the blue prints?"

Mr. Nettleur "Yes".

Mr. Tryon "Do they have the appearance of a single family dwelling?"

Mr. Nettleur "That was on the plan I saw - they looked like that."

Mr. Nettleur then sat down.

Mr. Ittel then called Mr. Hogner, and asked "Do you live in Wellington Heights?" Answer - "Yes".

Mr. Ittel "Do you own your property?"

Mr. Hogner "Yes".

Mr. Ittel "Where is your property located?"

Mr. Hogner "We live in one of these 'so called' double houses on Perry Highway."

Mr. Ittel "On lots 6 or 7?"

Mr. Hogner "Yes".

Mr. Ittel "You know the vacant lots between your property and the gas station, there are three, these applications are for building double houses on these lots. Have you examined the plans for these houses?"

Mr. Hogner "Yes"

Mr. Ittel "What is your occupation?"

Mr. Hogner "Architect."

Mr. Ittel "Are you prepared to say the approximate cubic feet content of the proposed double houses of six rooms?"

Mr. Tryon "I would like to object to that question because there is nothing in the building code which refers to the number of cubic feet content of a dwelling."

Mr. Ford refused the objection.

Mr. Hogner "The costs are based on the cubic content."

(He then mentioned 31 to 33 thousand cubic feet.)

Mr. Ittel "What is the cost of the proposed six room double houses 31 to 33 thousand cubic feet?"

Mr. Hogner "At the application cost, which I believe is \$14,000, as stated on the double houses, that would amount to approximately 47¢ per cubic foot."

Mr. Ittel "Are you familiar with the cubic content of your home and is it the same as the other home occupied by two families?"

Mr. Hogner "Yes".

Mr. Ittel "Are you familiar with the cost of construction of those houses?"

Mr. Hogner "I have heard from Mr. Rousseau \$22,000. If it had not been for the footings, it would have been 45 or 46¢ per cubic foot instead of over 50¢."

Mr. Hogner then explained about the depth of footers due to the houses having been built on what was known as the old frog pond.

Mr. Ittel "Do you understand that the same conditions on footers as on lots 6 and 7 are on the other lots?"

Mr. Hogner "It is hearsay, but I understand that."

Mr. Ittel "You understand that is what caused the necessary cost of footers of 6 and 7?"

Mr. Hogner "Yes".

Mr. Ittel "Are you familiar with the difference in building costs today and in 1931? How do building costs then compare with today?"

Mr. Hogner then showed a chart and explained as follows:

Page 77, April 17, 1946

Building costs today are indexed 320 against 212 in 1931. 1931 were about 25 lower than 1929.

Mr. Ittel "Is your house the type that is known as a double house by architects?"

Mr. Hogner "That is a good question. Those buildings were obviously built to show up as a single house with one entrance. The second floor has a communicating door leading one to the other. This indicates the intent was to build more or less of a single house."

Mr. Ittel "Are you familiar generally with the other houses in Wellington Heights?"

Mr. Hogner "Yes".

Mr. Ittel "Do you know of any other double houses in the plan that would be referred to as double houses?"

Mr. Hogner "No"

Mr. Ittel "Are the two you just mentioned the only two that are built for two families?"

Mr. Hogner "The two I have just mentioned are the only two."

Mr. Tryon to Mr. Hogner - "Have you read the building code of West View?"

Mr. Hogner "No, but I know all general building codes."

Mr. Tryon "Do you know if this application is for two family dwellings or double houses?"

Mr. Hogner "No, but I understand it was for 2-family dwellings."

Councilman Herrington then questioned Mr. Hogner regarding the figures on the chart. The result of the questions was that Mr. Hogner is of the opinion that building costs are about fifty percent higher now than in the 1929 to 1931 period.

Mr. Tryon to Mr. Hogner "On these two houses we have been referring to, how many kitchens in each building?"

Mr. Hogner "Two."

Mr. Tryon "How many bathrooms?"

Mr. Hogner after a remark about the number of bathrooms in a residence, answered "two".

Councilman Herrington to Mr. Hogner: "Did I understand you to say that those houses have one communicating door on the second floor?"

Mr. Hogner "Yes, there is a door between the two houses on the second floor and one door leading to the attic. If I want to get to the attic for things I have stored there, I have to go up through that attic door."

Councilman Herrington - "As a point of information for myself, would this communicating door mean this is a single house?"

Mr. Hogner "It was obviously planned to be a one family dwelling?"

Mr. Tryon "Was that a method of evading the deed restrictions or the building code?"

Mr. Hogner "It might have been."

- Mr. Ittel "I wish to call attention to the fact that in the examination of the various deeds for properties sold by the Wellington Heights Land Company, during the entire time they had title, there was only ~~one~~ deed that indicates a double house could be built. That happened to be where Dr. Miller's house is and it is a single house. The remaining deeds all have covenants, with the exception of five or six which were sold for another purpose, all restricted to one family dwellings. It seems clear that as far as Wellington Heights are concerned, they all will hold out for single family dwellings." Mr. Ittel started to read some of the restrictions in the deeds.
- Mr. Tryon interrupted as follows: "I would like to object to this Council hearing or considering any restrictions in the deeds. We have applied for a building permit and complied with the building ~~code~~ and all its requirements. Therefore, I should like to make an objection to you referring in this testimony to these restrictions."
- Mr. Ittel "No other property owner, either immediately or secondarily from the Land Company, could have built a double house on the property, so that the people who have invested their money there are still limited to single dwellings by virtue of those deeds and the applications are made on deeds that are covered by the covenants."
- Mr. Tryon "We have met all the requirements and if these people in this plan have any legal question, this is not the place and I am objecting to any testimony being received."
- Mr. Ittel Then remarked that Council is sitting to do the equitable thing - he referred to the assessed valuations of the properties there now, etc.
- Mr. Tryon remarked that if this hearing is in contemplation of a new zoning ordinance, etc, and ended by saying "This hearing is based on our appeal from the Building Inspector's refusal to grant a permit. The question is whether or not we are entitled to the building permits."
- Mr. Ford "We have the right to approve or reject your permits and in order to do so, we must have all the facts and it is for that reason we are here."
- Mr. Ittel read some of the covenants in the deeds.
(Mr. Ittel is going to send a copy of the covenants and restrictions to Council for our records.)
- Mr. Ittel "There is one thing I want to say. I believe we have 65 homes or close to that in our plan and we have felt it necessary to have a little financial assistance in

this matter. We have contacted every owner up there and up to the present time, there are at least fifty who have expressed their willingness to join the Association in contesting these applications as against only two who have objected. I point this out to bring out the unanimity of the people in Wellington Heights in this matter."

Mr. Ford asked if the applicants had anything more to say.

Mr. Tryon "Other than I believe at this other hearing, my clients agreed to put on slate roofs, bring bricks down to the ground and change the front entrance ways to brick instead of the verticle panels. One other thing I would like to point out. We have pictures of these houses as drawn by the architect, and, assuming for the time being that we eventually lose this case, under existing priorities, I have the right to tell this Council that you would be much better off in this community by having the houses for which we make application than you would with the one family dwellings. This is merely an explanation as to what you can build under existing priorities and still meet all the requirements of the 'so called' single family dwelling that you can get at the present time."

There was then a recess to allow time for everyone to view the architect's plans, etc.

Meeting called back to order at 10:40.

Mr. Phillips made the statement he would arrange for an inspection trip so that the houses could be seen.

Motion by Mr. Kress, seconded by Mr. Hutchins, that due to the lateness of the hour, the volume of testimony, and because the opportunity has been given to Council to inspect houses of the same type as proposed, that the decision in the appeal of Murrer and Phillips be postponed until Friday Evening, April 26, 1946, at 8:00 P M, giving us the opportunity to study the testimony so that we may better be able to give a fair decision.

WEST VIEW BOROUGH COUNCIL MEETING

April 26-1946

Minutes of an Adjourned Meeting of The Town Council of The Borough of West View held Friday Evening, April 26, 1946, in the Council Chamber at the Municipal Building.

Meeting was called to order at 8:55 by President of Council, Mr. R. G. Ford.

Roll Call

Was answered by the following Members of Council:
Messrs Herrington, Kress, Stanger and Ford.
