The following is a copy of a letter to be sent to the Allegheny County Sanitary Authority:

"January 21, 1949.

The Allegheny County Sanitary Authority,
County Office Building,
Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

ATTENTION - Mr. John F. Laboon,
Chairman.

Dear Mr. Laboon:

This letter will acknowledge the receipt of the proposed Agreement, "November 1948", which was submitted to The Town Council of The Borough of West View for its consideration and execution with The Allegheny County Sanitary Authority.

Each Member of The Town Council and the Burgess has read the proposed agreement as well as the Borough Manager and the Solicitor.

We believe that the discharge of untreated sewage into the streams of this Commonwealth should be eliminated or curtailed in order to prevent pollution and to improve the health, safety and welfare of the community at large.

However, we do not feel that we can sign the proposed agreement, in good conscience, for the following reasons:

FIRST: The contract provides for the transfer of the title of our entire sewage system to the Authority without compensation, subject to the condition that the system will be returned to the municipality on the 31st day of the first calendar year following the calendar year during which the disposal system shall be completed and put into operation, provided, however, that if a final judgment of a court of record determines that the sewer system must be owned by the Authority in order for it to impose sewage service charges, the, and in that event, the municipality shall reconvey the system without compensation to the Authority. The Borough of West View has made tremendous investments in its sewage system and we do not feel that we can convey all of our sewage lines, without compensation, subject to being returned to us, but also subject to the further condition that we may be required to reconvey the system to the Authority.

SECOND: The proposed contract provides that the municipality shall pay its proportionate cost of the following expenses beginning with January 1, 1950:

- (a) The municipality's proportionate share of the cost of the current expenses of the Sanitary Authority and the cost of preparing the detailed plans and specifications.
- (b) The municipality's proportionate share of the amount required in each such month or quarter year for paying the current expenses of the Sanitary Authority for the interest on all bonds executed by it.
- (c) The municipality shall pay its proportionate share of the amount required to create such reserves for such purposes as may be required by the resolution authorizing the issuance of such bonds or in the trust indenture securing the same.

We believe that this series of provisions of the proposed agreement are oppressive and place a responsibility upon the municipality for something it has not received and for something it has no assurance it will ever receive.

THIRD: Notwithstanding the requirement that we must convey our sewage system to the Authority, we are required during the entire term of the agreement, to control at our sole cost, the expense of maintaining and operating our sewage system.

FOURTH: The agreement, as drawn, provides that each municipality shall bear its proportionate share of the cost of operating and maintaining the system as well as the costs of administration of the Authority. We believe that each municipality should only be responsible for the treatment of sewage from their own municipality and no municipality shall be required to bear any portion of the expense of operating the Authority caused by reason of failure of one of the sister or participating municipalities to pay its full share of the cost of operation.

FIFTH: We sincerely believe that all public corporations, all charitable or non-profit institutions and all political sub-divisions should be exempt from the payment of sewage charges.

SIXTH: The proposed contract further provides that the Sanitary Authority shall have the right, under and to the extent provided by the Act of May 16, 1923, P. L. 207 as amended, or any subsequent law authorizing the filing of liens for its sewage, to file a lien for an unpaid sewage service charge. The Authority is then required to prepare and submit to the governing bodies of the several municipalities on or before February 1, April 1, July 1 and October 1, of each year, a list of all delinquent accounts, showing the face amount of each account, the penalty thereon, the interest accrued and the cost of filing the lien therefor and the cost of assigning the same to the municipality. The contract then requires the municipality, within sixty days thereafter, to pay to the Authority the face amount of all the delinquent accounts, plus the amount of cost incurred by the Authority in filing the liens, together with the cost incurred by the Authority in assigning the same to the municipality.

We believe this to be an unconstitutional delegation of legislative powers. We fail to see why any of the several municipalities belonging to the Authority should guarantee the payment of the sewer rentals, more particularly since the Authority has the power under the Act of 1945 to file liens against real estate for the collection of delinquent accounts.

SEVENTH: While the agreement provides that the amount of sewage service charge shall be computed by the quantity of water used in or upon each individual parcel or plot, it reserves unto the Authority the right to use a different method of determining the charges, and under the agreement, the alternative method is exclusive with the Authority.

EIGHTH: The proposed agreement further provides that the several municipalities shall, upon notice from the Authority, make such repairs as the Authority directs, and in the event of failure of the municipality to do so, then the Authority is granted the right to enter upon the system and make the repairs and to charge the municipality therefor. No restriction is imposed upon the power of the Authority to order repairs and that power in the Authority is without limitation.

We intend to explore and examine every possible method of treating our sewage and to comply with the provisions of the law and with the regulations of the Sanitary Water Board, but we do not feel the proposed contract in its present form can be executed by our municipality.

We understand that many other municipalities have taken exception to the form of this agreement. We feel that the several objections

set forth herein together with such other objections as may have been expressed by other municipalities, should receive the consideration of the Authority and particularly with its bond counsel. It is our sincere hope that upon further study, a contract could be evolved which would be acceptable to the municipalities and satisfy the requirements of the bond underwriters.

Reference is made to your letter of January 25, 1949, concerning the stop signs at Montclair Avenue and Wellington Drive.

The latter street, by virtue of its location, has become a thoroughfare. You have attempted, in the interests of safety, to stop traffic on the major street, in order to discourage its use.

The provisions of Section 323.1 do not specifically include this use of stop signs, and it may be that such use could not be upheld in court. Section 301 states that they shall conform to the Manual.

It seems that some other means of attaining your object should be available, if you want to make travel on Wellington Drive safer. We note that you have a 25 mile speed limit on it. This limit is only to be used in a business section, and Wellington Drive is evidently a residence district. We doubt, therefore, whether the 25 mile limit can be upheld in court. It would appear that a 35 mile limit should be established to comply with the vehicle code.

It is suggested that the use of slow signs be considered. One of the warrants for using them, according to Section 324.11, is at "Intersections which do not warrant a stop sign but are sufficiently hazardous to require a reduction in speed".

No signs will be effective without supervision of the police. Also the use of dubious signs can become very unpopular and cause much trouble.

The Borough of West View, during the past year, has been

concerned with the problem raised by the State law prohibiting the discharge of raw sewage into the streams of the Commonwealth.

Representatives of our Borough have met with representatives of the Allegheny County Sanitary Authority. We have caused to be prepared a complete analysis of the report of the Allegheny County Sanitary Authority dated January, 1948.

We have received and have studied the proposed agreement prepared by The Allegheny County Sanitary Authority which was submitted to the several municipalities in Allegheny County for execution. Because of the administrative, as well as the legal questions that were precipitated from the proposed agreement, we directed our Borough Manager, Mr. Doh H. Graham, to make a further study with respect to our sewage treatment problem.

While we have not yet reached any positive conclusion, Mr. Graham's report indicates that the proportion of cost of a sewage treatment plant declines as the number of prospective users increases. Because The Borough of West View has created a general authority known as The Municipal Authority of The Borough of West View, which presently serves water to your community and because of the engineering facilities available to them and because they presently have a list of the names of the water users and know the exact consumption of the users, it has been decided by the Borough of West View to refer this matter for further study to the Municipal Authority of The Borough of West View.

Without definitely committing you to participate with us, will you please advise us, by return mail, as to whether or not your community would be interested in participating in a sewage treatment plant that would be erected, constructed, operated and maintained by our Municipal Authority. However, we do not intend that our Authority be obligated to serve your municipality until a study has been made to determine the feasibility of a local plant. The sole purpose of this inquiry is to determine whether or not you are interested in having a study made of your sewer problem in conjunction with the sewer problem of the several adjoining municipalities to determine the feasibility of a local plant.

The cost of this survey, if made, will be borne by The Municipal Authority without any obligation upon your Borough.

REPORT

The Finance Committee has considered the request for an increase in salaries by the Members of the Police Force.

It is the desire of the Committee to have a workable Budget as economical as possible and still endeavor to give the taxpayers a progressive year. With prices at an all time high, we do not recommend that any major improvements be started, but rather to plan for a long time improvement plan for the progressiveness of our Borough with reference to unpaid streets and alleys.

We feel that with living costs declining, as shown by the Labor Department Index, and unemployment increasing in many of our industries, that a levelling off period may get out of control, and we may be heading into a slight depression.

With the Budget as now proposed, we can accomplish our improvements with slight sacrifices at various points, but if any increases were granted in salaries and wages, it would necessitate an increase in the tax millage. A Tax Millage increase at this time may prove to be hard on our property owners in view of the increase of $37\frac{1}{2}$ percent in County Taxes.

While we appreciate the efficiency of all Borough Employees, after much thought and consideration, the Committee feels that any pay increases at this time would be out of line. The Committee took the following points into consideration in its study of the Budget;

Nation's Price Index down 2.5% in February. The Police Force Members' request was based on Nation's Price Index.

Nation's bread basket down \$1.83 in March.

Farm support prices increased from 500 million dollars last year from $2\frac{1}{2}$ billion dollars at present.

Jobs throughout Pennsylvania decline after an all time high, which was in October, 1948. This is true of the entire nation.

"Food Prices Lowest in Years." - says Labor Department.

Two A. F. L. Unions sign contracts with four department stores in Pittsburgh with no increase in pay.

The present trend seems to be to 'Hold the line' in all Labor Circles.

THEREFORE, the Committee recommends that the Budget as proposed for the year 1949 be adopted. This Budget provides that the Tax Millage and salaries and wages remain as they were for the year 1948.

In regard to the problem raised by the contents of the sanitary sewer backing up into the cellar of Mr. Joseph Chraska's house

please be advised that it is the opinion of your Solicitor that the Borough of West View has sustained no liability in this regard.

I base my opinion upon the fact that the sanitary sewer was in place before the house in question was erected; that under normal conditions there is no back flowing of sewage into the cellar of the house; that only during a period of heavy rains do the storm waters enter the sanitary sewer thus causing the back up of sewage; the house in question was constructed at a level which is too low to stop the sewage from backing up during a period of excessive rain. It is my opinion that had this property been constructed at the proper level there would under no conditions be a back up of sewage.

I do not feel that the Borough is liable for a condition which exists because of the low level which the house is built.

Obviously it is not faulty construction on the part of the sanitary sewer because the condition does not exist under normal circumstances.

Therefore, I advise you in view of the above facts that the Borough of West View assumes no liability in this case.

 "The Committee wishes to impart to you that it has had several conferences with Members of the Board of Directors of The Municipal Authority of The Borough of West View, with particular respect to the proposed building project.
 The Committee recommends that the ordinance "Designating a Building Project for the Municipal Authority of The Borough of West View" be adopted as prepared.
 However, after reviewing the plans that have been prepared by the architect for the Authority, the Committee recommends to Council that it be authorized to give further study to determine the exact needs of the citizens of The Borough of West View for a room or rooms on the second floor of the proposed building for public purposes. It is the opinion of the Committee that only after this investigation has been completed would they be in a position to negotiate with the Authority with respect to space for public purposes on the second floor of the

building.

The Committee recognizes the need for such space for public purposes on the second floor of the building for meetings and recreation. However, the Committee also recognizes the financial limitations of The Borough. The Committee wishes it to be expressly understood that the adoption of this ordinance does not constitute an irrevocable commitment on the behalf of The Borough of West View to enter into a long term lease for space on the second floor of the proposed building, but, rather, concludes that these matters must be resolved by further investigation with respect to the needs and accommodations required by The Borough of West View, and the estimated costs."

REPORT

"July 22, 1949

The Municipal Authority of the
Borough of West View,
West View, Pennsylvania
Gentlemen:

Supplementing my report of May 25, 1949 and in view of the letter of the Sanitary Water Board of July 8, 1949 to the Borough of West View requiring the Borough before August 31, 1949 to enter into an agreement with the Allegheny County Sanitary Authority or to retain consulting engineers to design an independent sewage treating plant, I desire to report further as follows:

The Borough complied with the intent of the Sanitary Water Board's letter of July 8, 1949 in its letter of April 21, 1949 to the Sanitary Water Board stating that the Borough had authorized West View Authority to cause a sewage treatment study to be made and that Charles Haydock, Consulting Engineer, was working on the problem and could be contacted for further information.

As I stated in my progress report, this is an exceedingly involved situation, not only as to economics and policy, but also in view of the unusual form of construction proposed by Allegheny County Sanitary Authority to locate intercepting sewers in the River beds and the possible effect of such construction on the water supply of the West View Authority.

It is my opinion that the Authority's water supply is now the best in the district and that the construction originally proposed in the bed of the Ohio River near Neville Island would impair and perhaps ruin the Authority's Water supply, reducing it to the aesthetic qualities of the City of Pittsburgh supply. The protest of West View Authority and West View Borough to the Sanitary Water Board against the proposed construction was dismissed and the case has been appealed to the Dauphin County Court but not yet reached.

West View Authority has received no definite information as to the plans presently proposed by the Sanitary Authority. Newspaper reports indicate that the presently proposed system is much smaller than originally contemplated, but that the location of the treating plant and the type of construction including building sewers in the Rivers is the same. No definite recommendations can be made until the plans and rates of the Sanitary Authority are available.

The Boroughs of Avalon, Bellevue, BenAvon, Ben Avon Heights and Emsworth and the Township of Kilbuck on the Ohio River side and The Borough of West View and the Township of Ross on the Girtys Run side have evidenced interest in having West View Authority study their sewage treatment problem.

The size of treatment plant independent of the Sanitary Authority depends on the identity and number of contributing municipalities. It is not possible to design individual plants until it is definitely known how many municipalities desire service. All of these municipalities are water customers of the West View Authority so that all and others who were not solicited or have not requested West View Authority to consider their sewage problems, would suffer impairment of water supply if West View Authority is correct that the proposed construction would damage the Authority Water supply. I believe that these municipalities should again be advised of the danger to their water supply.

It is important to note that if West View Authority is incorrect in contending that its water supply may be impaired by the Sanitary Authority's construction, no harm will be done, while if the Sanitary Authority is incorrect and its construction impairs West View Authority's water supply, irreparable damage may be done. West View Authority and West View Borough have carried the burden of attempting to preserve the Authority's valuable water supply for the benefit of the entire seventeen municipalities that are served in whole or in part with West View water. The City of Pittsburgh is the only municipality among the seventeen which has an independent source of water supply.

It appears likely that the unit capital and operating costs for a plant to serve the two Girtys Run municipalities, where the Girtys Run Joint Trunk Sewer is available as an interceptor, can be constructed more economically than a plant to serve the six Ohio River municipalities where construction of an interceptor would be required.

It would not be practical to consider one plant to serve the two groups of municipalities as the cost of a gravity tunnel would be too great and the practical difficulties of pumping sewage against a head of about five hundred feet appear to be insurmountable.

Important questions of policy are involved and it will be necessary for the municipalities to decide whether, if necessary, they would be willing to pay more for sewage service from an individual plant or plants which would be locally owned and controlled than they would have to pay the Sanitary Authority at the rates presently to be proposed and of which I have not yet been informed. Every effort should be made to preserve the position of the Municipalities without prejudice so that they can join or abstain from the Sanitary Authority.

Newspaper accounts indicate that all of the municipalities which have signified their interest in having West View Authority investigate their sewage treatment problems are included among the municipalities which are to be served by the latest revision of the Sanitary Authority plant.

I have not been advised whether the legal objections of The Borough to the Sanitary Authority contract have been resolved.

The problem is further complicated by the statement of Avalon that it is not interested in a biological plant but only in a chemical plant. The Lewis chemical plant at Lebanon, Ohio has recently been inspected. This type of plant is proposed by Capitol Engineering Company which I understand has solicited all of the municipalities included in the West View group. The Infilco Plant

at Daytona Beach, Florida has also been inspected recently.

The Sanitary Authority proposes to build a biological type plant for primary treatment only.

The order of the Sanitary Water Board to all of the Allegheny County municipalities requires only primary treatment. This order might be modified to require complete treatment if the Girtys Run municipalities should decide to discharge their effluent into Girtys Run. If the effluent should be discharged into the Girtys Run Joint Trunk Sewer, the Sanitary Authority might make demand for payment for the entire flow in this Trunk Sewer.

In view of all of these conditions, I recommend that:

1. The Sanitary Authority be formally advised of the investigation in progress, that an effort will be made to reach a decision before August 31, 1949 and that some or all of the municipalities which have recorded their desire to have West View Authority investigate their sewage problem may or may not desire to associate themselves in the Allegheny County Sanitary Authority project.
2. The Borough of West View or West View Authority should not enter into any agreement with the Sanitary Authority while it has an action pending against the Sanitary Authority in respect of a form of construction which it believes will imperil the quality of the Authority's water supply, and that the Sanitary Water Board and the Allegheny County Sanitary Authority be so advised.
3. That the Sanitary Water Board again be advised that the West View Authority is studying the sewage problem of the municipalities recited above by the authorization of West View Borough and that Charles Haydock is the Consulting Engineer.
4. The municipalities served by West View Authority again be advised of the anticipated danger to their valuable water supply and the actions taken by West View Borough and West View Authority to protect the purity of the supply.

Gentlemen:

I am returning herewith Ordinance No. 905, which I have vetoed. I should like to explain to you my reasons for this action.

I personally have great confidence in the Municipal Authority of The Borough of West View and I respect its accomplishments. However, in my opinion, the ordinance as drawn is far too broad. The Ordinance provides for the erection of a building or buildings without limitation as to number or purpose.

The ordinance does not restrict the location where the building or buildings are to be erected, whereas the location has already been determined by The Authority in its acquisition of lots numbers 226 to 239 inclusive, on the westerly side of the Perry Highway, in the Northeast Bellevue Plan of West View.

It is my opinion that the number of buildings should be restricted and the purpose or purposes of the building and the location thereof defined.

If a new ordinance is drawn limiting and defining the building project more explicitly, I will approve it, but I cannot conscientiously approve it in its present form for the reasons mentioned herein.

These suggestions are made by me to protect the rights of Council, in the future, in controlling the actions of any future Authority.

REPORT

This letter is the Manager's report covering the emergency work as to cost and repairs to both the Sanitary and Storm sewers in Cecil Alley from Center Avenue northerly for a distance of 100 feet, more or less.

A storm of July 17 caused waters from both the sanitary and storm sewers to back up into the cellars of adjacent commercial buildings creating a definite health hazard as well as property damage and emergency work was required to correct such condition.

When it was determined that it would be impossible to open said sewers by conventional methods of rodding and flushing, it became apparent that the pipes must be crushed and that uncovering by excavation was the only method of correction.

Verbal approval to proceed with the work was given by Council Members Herrington, Ford, Kress and Winter, and Burgess Baker, and the Solicitor, Mr. Brandt.

Mr. Clair Kunze, a local contractor, was hired to bring in his power shovel and trucks and to proceed immediately to uncover said sewers.

Due to the depth of these sewers, the close quarters to work in (between A & P Market and Hardware store), and the type of fill, covering the lines, it was necessary to haul the earth covering away from the site and to stock pile it nearby. When the pipes were uncovered, we found:

1. The storm lines (15" and 18") were crushed in many places and various size pipes had been laid in the same flow line of some of the trunks, (apparent cause of first stoppage) and that in one or more places the lines actually had an uphill flow.
2. The sanitary line (18") trunk in every joint of pipe uncovered was fractured so badly that the line could be described as completely crushed.

As a result of these findings, we were forced to lay two complete new lines (i. e., the storm and sanitary)/ The main trunks were replaced with 24" diameter pipe (Terra Cotta, double strength for the sanitary and reinforced concrete for the storm." Two new manholes, three new catch basins, retaps for house connections and 100 feet of 15" R. C. storm line had to be provided. Surface grades also had to be changed, in order to properly control future storm waters into the new catch basins. Listed below is a recapitulation of costs of work, materials and equipment rental expenditures on this emergency job.

As of this report, there are two things yet to be completed, on the overall job; i. e., 2 catch basins and a section of concrete sidewalk along side of the hardware store. Walk cannot be replaced until fill becomes better settled.

Attention is called that there was a strike in progress of the drivers at building supply houses during this work, and a slight increase in cost of acquiring some materials existed. As an example, we had to dispatch three trucks to Stratton, Ohio, to get terra cotta pipe, a truck to Zelienople to get sand and gravel, and the ready mix concrete (through the approval of the Drivers' Union) came from Pavia Construction Company at Verona.

However, I believe the total cost of this work was most economical and the cost was considerably less than it would have been had we been able to advertise for a contract in the event an emergency had not existed. A rough sketch is attached to show locations of the work performed, but a permanent plan is being prepared for the plan files. No plans were available to show locations of existing sewers at the beginning of this job. We trust this report meets your approval.

SEWAGE TREATMENT PROJECT

In accordance with your instructions, I have studied the sewage treatment problems of West View and its adjacent municipalities.

I recommend that to comply with the order of the Sanitary Water Board and aid in purifying the Rivers, all of these municipalities participate in the Allegheny County Sanitary Authority Project, providing that the form of construction adopted by the County Authority is such that West View Authority's Water Supply cannot be damaged and that the form of contract required by the County Authority is acceptable to the Solicitors for the several municipalities.

In the event that the County Authority is unwilling satisfactorily to reassure West View and its sister municipalities and West View Authority that West View Authority's water supply will not be imperiled, then I recommend that legal measures be taken to prevent the Sanitary Authority from undertaking any construction that may damage the Authority's water supply, that efforts be made to have other municipalities served by West View Authority join in such efforts to protect the purity of this valuable water supply, and that West View and its sister municipalities construct separate sewage treatment plants to comply with the order of the Sanitary Water Board.

Construction of separate plants would entail costs and require rates in excess of those proposed by the County Authority in its latest or plan Z, dated July 1949, which, however, is stated not to be final.

SEWAGE TREATMENT PROJECT.

Gentlemen:

In accordance with instructions received at the Board Meeting on April 19, 1949, I have studied the sewage treatment problems of West View and certain of its nearby municipalities in accordance with action of West View Borough Council at its Meeting on April 12, 1949. All of these municipalities receive water service from West View Authority. I made progress reports on May 25, 1949 and July 22, 1949.

The Sanitary Water Board of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania adopted a Resolution on January 17, 1945 notifying numerous industries and municipalities, including West View and many of its neighbors who receive water service from the West View Authority, to file plans for the collection and primary treatment of their sewage. The Borough of West View was advised of this action by letter of May 16, 1945.

The objectives of sewage treatment and cleaning up the Ribers are highly desirable in the public interest and are entitled to the full support of the municipalities. They are a part of the rising standards of American Living, but will require the expenditure of substantial funds for construction and substantial annual costs for operating expenses and debt service charges.

Allegheny County Sanitary Authority was incorporated March 12, 1946 and offered to study the sewage treatment problems of the 102 Allegheny County Municipalities affected by the Sanitary Water Board order of January 17, 1945.

West View and its neighbors participated in the County Authority studies and contributed the allocations of State and Federal funds which were then available to them to assist in payment of the costs of the County Authority studies.

The County Authority reported in January, 1948, recommending construction of a single treating plant to serve about one hundred municipalities at an estimated cost of \$82,000,000 based on July, 1947 prices for a biological type treatment plant, which appears to be the type of plant most acceptable to the Sanitary Water Board. Only primary treatment is required at this time but further treatment must be contemplated.

The County Authority estimated that the rates for sewage treatment would range from 18 cents to 7 cents per 1,000 gallons of sewage per quarter from one customer and that 17% of the householders would average fifty cents per month. The average West View Authority domestic customer used 52,600 gallons of water in 1948, which at the 18 cent rate would cost about \$9.50 per annum for sewage treatment, or 44% of the \$21.46 average annual West View domestic customer's water bill.

The January, 1948 report of the County Authority, which appears to have cost about \$650,000, was approved by the Sanitary Water Board, but was not accepted by the municipalities.

The 1948 County Authority plan contemplates constructing the main intercepting sewers in the beds of the Rivers. Believing that such construction would imperil the purity and safety of West View Authority's valuable water supply, which I believe is the best raw water in the district, a protest was made to the Sanitary Water Board and a Hearing held on April 21, 1948. The Board rejected the protest by its adjudication and Order of September 23, 1948. West View Authority appealed this decision to the Dauphin County Court at No. 187, Commonwealth Docket, 1948, but the case has not yet been reached.

Early this year the Borough of West View wrote to ten of its neighboring municipalities stating that it was considering making a study to determine the feasibility of a local sewage treatment plant and inquiring whether the said Boroughs would be interested in participating in sewage treatment that would be erected, constructed, operated and maintained by West View Authority. Favorable replies were received from seven municipalities.

West View Borough advised the Sanitary Water Board, on April 12, 1949, that it had authorized West View Authority to study sewage treatment separately from the County Authority project and that Charles Haydock was engineer for West View Authority.

The Sanitary Water Board on July 8, 1949 advised that on June 20, 1949, the Mayor of Pittsburgh had advised the Sanitary Water Board that the City of Pittsburgh would accept a project proposed by the County Authority for the construction of a Central sewage treatment plant to serve a group of 44 municipalities and granted West View until August 31, 1949 to furnish evidence to the Board that West View had executed an agreement with the County Authority or had engaged a consulting engineer to prepare plans for separate treatment.

West View Borough's letter of April 21, 1949, was substantial compliance with the Sanitary Water Board's letter of July 8, 1949.

The contract proposed by the County Authority was not available until after August 31, 1949. No municipality can obligate itself to execute an agreement, the terms of which are not known.

The County Authority on September 12, 1949 submitted its proposed contract to West View Borough and probably also many other municipalities and advised that the contract must be executed before November 1, 1949, otherwise West View Borough would be excluded from Project Z.

The plan approved by the City of Pittsburgh is known as Project Z, July, 1949, estimated to cost \$41,525,000 to serve 44 municipalities. It has been modified to serve a total of 59 municipalities at a total cost of \$47,186,400 and at the same rates for service. The cost of preparing construction plans is to be paid for from a \$2,000,000 loan to the Authority by the City over a two-year period.

Rates for sewage treatment contemplated by Project Z range from 15 cents to 6 cents per 1,000 gallons, a reduction from the 18 cents to 7 cents rates contemplated by the January, 1948 Report.

The average West View Authority customer would pay about \$7.90 per annum for sewage service under this rate, while he would have paid about \$9.50 at the rate originally proposed.

The latest report and estimates submitted by the County Authority is still Project Z, July, 1949, but Managing Engineer E. E. Bankson, of the County Authority, stated on September 15, 1949 that no final decision as to the form of construction or the location of the sewers had yet been made and probably would not be made for sometime.

The subaqueous sewers complained of by West View Authority and West View Borough in the January, 1948 report can readily be eliminated by a change in design. Some or all may have been changed in Project Z, which states that cost estimates for interceptor sewers are based on construction of deep rock tunnel sewers as contrasted to the subaqueous locations proposed in the prior Report, but this is not necessarily a final decision and is stated verbally by the Managing Engineer of the County Authority to be subject to change.

The municipalities which have evidenced their interest in having West View Borough and West View Authority study their sewage treatment problems can be divided into two groups - West View Borough and Ross Township along Girtys Run, and Bellevue, Avalon, BenAvon, BenAvon Heights and Emsworth Boroughs and Kilbuck Township along the Ohio River.

There are substantially no industries in these communities and a design quantity of 100 gallons per capita per day has been assumed also that the sewage will be the same as that contemplated in the County Authority's Report, although analyses of samples collected by the County Authority as shown in its Report indicate that the sewage from these districts is not as concentrated as the 275 parts per million suspended solids and 300 parts per million five day biochemical oxygen demand used in designing the County Authority Project.

The Girtys Run Joint Trunk Sewer is an already constructed interceptor for the Boroughs of West View and Millvale, and the Townships of Ross and Shaler, concerning which I made a Report on December 26, 1945, which Report recommended that West View Borough participate in the County Authority studies and reserve judgment as to participation in the final plan. Ross Township has indicated its desire to have West View consider its sewage treatment. No reply was received from Millvale and Shaler.

A sewage treatment plant for the Borough of West View alone would be quite small and would be more expensive to construct and operate and result in higher annual charges than if the Borough joined with the County Authority.

A sewage treatment plant to serve West View and Ross combined would be much larger but would still be more expensive to construct and operate and result in higher annual charges than if the municipalities joined with the County Authority and it would be necessary to make provision for economically increasing its size as Ross is growing so rapidly. There is little room for growth in West View Borough unless apartments are constructed or Highland Country Club or West View Park abandoned and devoted to residential and commercial purposes.

A plant to serve the Borough of West View alone could be satisfactorily located at the lower end of the Borough. A plant to serve West View and Ross could preferably be located in Ross Township near the Shaler Line.

Both plants would provide the treatment required by the

pending order of the Sanitary Water Board and would use separate portions of Girtys Run Joint Trunk Sewer as interceptor and outfall sewer. West View and Ross have definite rights in the Joint Trunk Sewer by reason of the Agreement of May 10, 1932, but if a separate plant should be constructed and Millvale and Shaler elect to join the County Authority, the County Authority might endeavor to enforce payment for treating the sewage of West View and Ross which had already received the only treatment required by the Sanitary Water Board Order but which sewage could not be rejected nor the prior treatment efficiently used by the County Authority.

Alternates would be a separate outfall or complete treatment using Girtys Run as an outfall. Complete treatment would further increase both construction and operating costs.

A treatment plant to serve the Ohio River municipalities would require the construction of an interceptor sewer, just as would be required by the County Authority Project. These municipalities in general are well built up and cannot be expected to grow rapidly except as apartment houses may replace individual homes. Kilbuck Township has considerable good building ground, although the amount is small compared with Ross or McCandless Townships.

A treatment plant to treat the sewage of these Ohio River municipalities would be comparable in size with the plant presently required to treat the sewage of West View and Ross and the same general conclusions would hold as are recited above, except that there is no outfall problem owing to the proximity of the Ohio River.

Chemical treatment plants are less expensive to construct and more expensive to operate than biological plants, but can be constructed and operated at lower annual costs for service than biological plants, assuming that both type plants are economically designed and efficiently operated. Few chemical type treating plants have been constructed recently as modern practice greatly favors biological type plants.

Capitol Engineering Corporation of Dillsburg, Pennsylvania has called on a number of the municipalities in the Pittsburgh District regarding sewage treatment and is a strong proponent of the Lewis Process or chemical treatment. A Lewis Process Plant was constructed about 1940 at Lebanon, Ohio by altering an existing plant. This plant was inspected on June 17, 1949. Several reports on the process have been studied and representatives of the Ohio Department of Health were interviewed on the trip. The Pennsylvania Department of Health has approved the construction of two small Lewis Process Plants in Pennsylvania, one of which is now in operation.

Infilco recently constructed a chemical treatment plant at Daytona Beach, Florida, which was inspected on July 6, 1949, at which time the designing engineer was interviewed and also engineers of the Florida Board of Health.

An Infilco type plant would probably cost less to construct and operate than a Lewis type plant. Both would cost more per customer per annum than participation in the County Authority Project, but there would be the responsibilities and hazards of ownership and management which would not exist if the municipalities participated in the County Authority Project.

West View Borough and its neighboring municipalities are in the difficult position of having to decide how to comply with the order of the Sanitary Water Board, the purpose of which is to accomplish a highly desirable objective while the method of construction to accomplish this highly desirable objective appears to be favored by the Sanitary Board which is such that West View Borough and

West View Authority believe it to be dangerous to the purity of its water supply and are so contending in court and for which water supply there is no substitute available of equal quality.

West View Borough cannot properly participate in a Project which it has protested before the Sanitary Water Board and which is being protested in Court by West View Authority.

After considering all of the above, I recommend that the Borough of West View agree to participate in the County Authority Project, providing that the forms of construction are such that the purity of West View Authority's water supply will not be imperiled and that West View Authority is satisfactorily assured that its water supply will not be damaged and further that the contract proposed by the County Authority is approved by the Solicitor for West View Borough.

In the event that West View Borough and West View Authority cannot be satisfactorily assured that the natural purity of their raw water supply will be unimpaired by construction of the County Authority Project, then I recommend that the Borough, and as many of its sister municipalities as so desire, construct separate sewage treatment plans, the design of which would have to be approved by the Sanitary Water Board.

I also recommend that the municipalities which expressed interest in separate sewage treatment receive copies of this Report and that all of the municipalities receiving water service from West View Authority be advised of the danger to their water supply and that their cooperation be solicited to protect the purity of the Authority's valuable water supply from danger of contamination by the construction proposed by the County Authority.

WHEREAS, in the said report of Charles Haydock, he recommended that The Borough of West View comply with the order of the Sanitary Water Board and aid in purifying the rivers, provided the form of construction adopted by The Allegheny County Sanitary Authority is such that the source of water supply of the Municipal Authority of The Borough of West View is not imperiled or damaged:

It is, therefore, regularly moved by Mr. Ford, seconded by Mr. Stroje, that the Solicitor of The Borough of West View be authorized, empowered and directed to communicate with the Solicitor of Allegheny County Sanitary Authority for the

OPINION OF CARL BRANDT, SOLICITOR OF
THE BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW, IN RE:
ORDINANCE APPROVING THE REPORT OF THE
MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY OF THE BOROUGH OF
WEST VIEW FOR A BUILDING PROJECT

THE BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW, hereinafter designated as The Borough, is a municipal corporation situate in Allegheny County, Pennsylvania. It was incorporated on the 24th day of May, 1905.

On the 6th day of October, 1942, the Borough adopted Ordinance No. 814 which created THE MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW, hereinafter designated as the Authority, in accordance with and under the terms and provisions of the Municipal Authority Act, 1935, July 28, P. L. 463, as amended.

Thereafter the Authority purchased and acquired all of the water lines, pumping station facilities, reservoirs, franchises and rights of way of the PITTSBURGH SUBURBAN WATER COMPANY which

it has operated continuously from November 13th, 1942. The Authority has, since the acquisition of the water business of the PITTSBURGH SUBURBAN WATER COMPANY, maintained, under a written Lease, its principal office or place of business at 516 Lincoln Avenue, Bellevue, Pennsylvania.

The Authority has represented to the Borough that the facilities at 516 Lincoln Avenue are inadequate to meet its requirements. It has expressed a desire to move its principal office to a more convenient place where facilities are sufficiently large enough to accommodate its needs. The Authority, pursuant to its desire to relocate its principal office and to acquire accommodations sufficient to meet its needs, acquired the title to lots Nos. 225 to 239 inclusive, in the Allegheny Bellevue Land Company's Plan of Lots called "Northeast Bellevue" having a total frontage of Four Hundred forty-five and 82/100 (445.82) feet on the westerly side of the Perrysville Road and a depth of approximately one hundred thirty (130) feet.

On August 5th, 1949, the TOWN COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW, in recognition of the needs of the Authority and the desirability of an integrated shopping center and parking area in the Borough, authorized the Authority to acquire, hold, construct, improve, maintain, operate, or lease, either as lessee or as lessor, a building in the BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW to be devoted, wholly or partially, for public uses and revenue producing purposes on the said ground.

The Authority, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 906, caused plans and specifications to be prepared for the erection of a building on the said land by SORBER AND HOONE, Registered Architects; it caused plans for the excavating and grading of the site to be prepared by R. T. BECKER, Registered Engineer; it caused plans to be prepared for the relocating of a sewer which crossed the said premises and which would have interfered with the erection and construction of the said building and finally it caused plans to be prepared for the erection and construction of a fence by the PITTSBURGH STEEL COMPANY on the westerly side of the side.

The Authority advertised for bids for the relocating of the sewer, the erection of the fence, the excavating and grading of the proposed site and for the erection and construction of the proposed building.

The Authority submitted the plans and specifications of the said building, and the plans for the excavating and grading of the said premises to the TOWN COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW.

On September 14, 1949, the Authority received bids for the excavating and grading of the said site and for the cost of erecting and constructing the said building. It had originally received bids for the erection of the fence and the relocating of the sewer. The total cost of the erection and construction of the building, including the excavating of the proposed site, as evidenced by the said bids, was Two hundred fifty-eight thousand five hundred thirty-three (\$258,533.00) Dollars. The cost of the land, the cost of erecting the fence, the cost of relocating the sewer, the paving of the parking area, engineer and architect's fees and twelve months estimated interest is Fifty-six thousand six hundred eighty-nine and 75/100 (\$56,689.75) Dollars making a total of Three hundred fifteen thousand two hundred twenty-two and 75/100 (\$315,222.75) Dollars.

The Authority has submitted to the TOWN COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH firm commitments for the renting of the said premises at a total annual rental of Thirty-one thousand six hundred (\$31,600.00) Dollars which includes an annual rental to be guaranteed by the BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW in the sum of Eleven thousand five hundred (\$11,500.00) Dollars.

The Authority has submitted the proposed project to investment bankers to determine whether or not Bonds issued for the erection and construction of the said building could be underwritten. It appeared from the report of the investment bankers that the annual Bond requirements including Bond retirement and interest charges, and maintenance costs, are Twenty-three thousand eight hundred ninety three and 46/100 (\$23,893.46) Dollars, leaving approximately Eight thousand (\$8,000.00) Dollars each year, from the income, which could be deposited in a reserve account. It is estimated that, based on the proposed annual income, that the Bonds would be retired in approximately twenty-two years.

The BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW presently occupies a tract of land situate on the easterly side of the Perry Highway having a frontage of one hundred eighty (180) feet and a depth of two hundred two and 31/100 (202.31) feet together with three and 302/1000 Acres (3.302) at the rear of the said lots, which has erected thereon a two and one-half story brick veneer building and garage in which it presently maintains its several borough offices. Members of the TOWN COUNCIL of the Borough have, from time to time, received numerous complaints from citizens of the Borough regarding the inaccessibility of the Borough Hall and its surrounding land.

The Members of the TOWN COUNCIL of the Borough have, from time to time, received several inquiries as to the availability of the said premises owned by the Borough in which it presently maintains its borough offices for sale to be used for the erection thereon of a substantial number of units of garden apartments. The members of the TOWN COUNCIL are of the opinion that the Borough would profit most from the said land by selling it to be used for the erection and construction of garden apartments. The building of such apartments would increase the assessed taxable value of the Borough and would substantially enhance the income from real estate taxes.

The members of the TOWN COUNCIL of the Borough are of the opinion that the said land presently occupied by it upon which it maintains its borough offices could be sold, transferred and conveyed for a sum greatly in excess of its cost to the Borough.

Furthermore, the members of the TOWN COUNCIL of the Borough have, from time to time, received numerous inquiries from citizens of the Borough as to the availability of recreational facilities and a meeting place for the citizenry of the Borough.

The Authority has informed the Borough that there is space available in the proposed public building in which the Borough could house and maintain its several borough offices and discharge the duties of the Borough at a place which would be more convenient and more accessible to the general public and where additional accommodations would be available for recreational purposes.

The Authority has indicated its willingness to rent two and one-half storerooms on the first floor of the proposed building, having a frontage of sixty-two (62) feet and a depth of fifty-nine (59) feet, and a room on the second floor of the said building fifty-nine (59) feet in depth and one hundred (100) feet in width, in which the Borough can maintain its several offices to discharge its Borough functions and provide recreational facilities. The Authority has further agreed that, should the Borough not require all of the proposed space for borough and recreational purposes, that it shall have the authority and the power to sublet the same and to receive the income therefrom.

The Borough has been further informed that it could sublet the two and one-half storerooms on the first floor, should they not be needed for Borough purposes, at an annual rental of six thousand nine hundred (\$6,900.00) Dollars and that tenants for the same are available. This would thereby reduce the annual obligation of The Borough from eleven thousand five hundred (\$11,500.00) Dollars to Four thousand six hundred (\$4,600.00) Dollars.

The Town Council of the Borough has requested me, as its Solicitor, to furnish it with an opinion as to the legality of the proposed Lease with the Authority.

DISCUSSION

The execution of the proposed Lease between the Borough and the Authority Public Building Project precipitates the following legal questions:

FIRST: DOES THE BOROUGH HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE LEASES?

SECOND: IF THE BOROUGH HAS SUCH POWER WHAT LIMITATIONS, IF ANY, ARE IMPOSED UPON IT?

THIRD: ARE THE OBLIGATIONS TO BE ASSUMED BY THE BOROUGH UNDER THE LEASE AN INCREASE OF ITS INDEBTEDNESS IN VIOLATION OF ITS CONSTITUTIONAL DEBT LIMIT?

FOURTH: DOES THE BOROUGH HAVE THE POWER TO SUBLET SUCH PART OF THE LEASED PREMISES WHICH MAY NOT BE PRESENTLY REQUIRED BY IT FOR EITHER BOROUGH OR RECREATIONAL PURPOSES?

FIRST: DOES THE BOROUGH HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE LEASES?

Boroughs are statutorily empowered to obtain, by Lease real or personal property deemed to be to the best interests of the Borough. Act of 1947, July 10, P. L. 1621, Section 40, 53 P. S., 13,311.

The execution of the proposed lease between the Borough and the Authority is for the best interests of the Borough in that Borough offices will be maintained at a place within the Borough which is more readily accessible and in closer proximity to public transportation. It is necessary and incidental to proper governmental function that Borough offices be maintained, and thus a Lease of space by a Borough in which it may maintain its offices comes within the purview of Borough powers.

Furthermore, the proposed sale of the present land and buildings which house the Borough offices will not only result in a profit but the erection of garden apartments thereon will increase the taxable income of the Borough.

Boroughs are statutorily empowered to obtain by Lease property for the purpose of making, enlarging and maintaining places of recreation. Act of 1933, May 18th, P. L. 818, Section 1: 1947, July 10th, P. L. 1621, Section 82.

Under its broad and specific powers, the BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW does have the authority and the power to execute a Lease with the Authority of the BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW for space to be used by Borough offices and recreational purposes.

SECOND: IF THE BOROUGH HAS SUCH POWER WHAT LIMITATIONS, IF ANY, ARE IMPOSED UPON IT?

The Legislature of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has seen fit to place a limit on the amount which may be spent on recreational facilities. The Borough is limited in the amount that it might obligate itself in the acquisition, enlarging and maintaining places of recreation to one and one-half mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of all property, offices, professions, and persons in the Borough upon which Borough taxes are levied, within a period of three (3) years, without the consent of the majority of the electors. Act of 1943, May 27th, P. L. 674, Section 5; 1947, July 10th, P. L. 1621, Section 82. It is, within the power of the BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW to lease the proposed facilities for Borough and recreational purposes, provided that the annual rental for that portion of the property occupied for recreational purposes does not exceed Four thousand seven hundred thirty-three and 14/100 (\$4,447.33 14/100) Dollars per year which is one-third of one and one-half (1 1/2) mills of the current assessed valuation.

THIRD: ARE THE OBLIGATIONS TO BE ASSUMED BY THE BOROUGH UNDER THE LEASE AN INCREASE OF ITS INDEBTEDNESS IN VIOLATION OF ITS CONSTITUTIONAL DEBT LIMIT?

The total indebtedness of a municipality cannot exceed seven (7) percent of the total taxable property situated within the Borough, nor may a municipality provide for an increase of its indebtedness in excess of two (2) per cent of the total taxable property situated within the Borough without the approval of a majority of the duly qualified electors. Pennsylvania Constitution, Article 9, Section 8.

In the instant case we need not be concerned with these limitations because the execution of the proposed Lease between the Borough and the Authority will not create a debt of the Borough.

It is now firmly established in Pennsylvania that the Bonds issued by an Authority are not the debts of the incorporating municipality. It is also well settled that a long term Lease from an Authority to a Municipality does not create a debt against the Municipality in violation of the constitutional debt limit of the municipal subdivision. This is true because, in the event or a default on the Lease, neither the bondholders nor the Authority have any recourse against the municipality but they are restricted, under the Municipal Authorities Act, as amended, to look to the revenues derived by the Authority. See Kelly - v - Earl, 325 Pa. 337 (1937).

There is no danger in the case before us that the Borough might not be able to meet its liability under the proposed Lease. The Town Council has been informed that there would be sufficient demand by tenants to insure the Borough of an annual income of Six thousand nine hundred (\$6,900.00) Dollars from the rental of the two and one-half storerooms on the first floor should they not be presently needed for Borough purposes.

It is interesting to note that the current millage in WEST VIEW BOROUGH is only twelve (12) mills and that the Borough has the authority to levy taxes up to and including fifteen (15) mills. The three mill differential between the present millage and the maximum millage based upon the current assessment, would enable the Borough to increase its annual revenue approximately Twenty-nine thousand (\$29,000.00) Dollars which would be more than adequate to meet any unforeseeable liability under the proposed lease.

FOURTH: DOES THE BOROUGH HAVE THE POWER TO SUBLET SUCH PART OF THE LEASE PREMISES WHICH MAY NOT BE PRESENTLY REQUIRED BY IT FOR EITHER BOROUGH OR RECREATIONAL PURPOSES?

A Municipal corporation can function only through the powers granted by the legislature in its Charter of incorporation, or those powers incident or related thereto as essential and necessary to carry out the declared objects contained in such express powers. If there is doubt as to the existence of authority to do a certain act not expressly authorized, or whether an act is fairly referable to any delegated powers, the doubt is to be resolved against its existence. See Bloomsburg Land Improvement Company - v - The Borough of Bloomsburg, 215 Pa. 452, 64 A. 603 (1906). However, this rule does not apply where to do so would restrict the municipality in the exercise of its governmental functions which are necessary and incident to the best interests of the citizens of the municipality.

It is well settled that a municipality may not take a Lease of property merely for the purpose of deriving revenue therefrom by subletting. But such would not be the case with respect to the execution of the proposed lease between the Borough and the Authority. This Lease is not a revenue gaining measure on the part of the Borough. The Borough will only sublet that space which is not presently needed for the purpose of the Borough government. It would be anomalous to give the Borough the power to acquire this property by Lease and then prohibit it from subletting such part that would not immediately be needed for Borough purposes.

While it is true that the Borough has not been given the express authority, either by its Charter or by Statute, to take a Lease of property and then to sublet the same, it appears that the Borough would, incident to its express general power to acquire property for the best interests of the Borough, have the authority to sublet such space not immediately needed for public purposes. It has been held in the case of Graham - v - Philadelphia, et al, 332 Pa. 513 (1939) that if parts of public property, including a public building, are not used for municipal purposes, or are not continuously so used, the municipality may permit others to use such part, provided no public use is interfered with thereby.

We are of the opinion that since the proposed use of the demise premises is to be used primarily for the discharge of the usual Borough functions and secondly as a place of recreation, that if in the leasing of such premises there is space available that could be sublet by the Borough and income received therefrom that the incidental subleasing thereof does not constitute an Ultra Vires Act.

Our opinion is based upon the assumption that the rents due the Authority from the Borough shall be restricted, for payment, to the "current Revenues" of the Borough.

Finally, our legal conclusion that the proposed lease is lawful is based upon the theory that the subletting of a portion of the demised premises, by the Borough, is incidental to the discharge by the Borough of its general Borough functions. However, should it be determined that the subletting of a portion of the demised premises is not incidental to the Borough's general powers and is primarily for the purpose of raising revenues, then our opinion would be otherwise.

The Borough Manager gave the following verbal report:

"After having studied the major problem as to whether the Borough of West View should join with the Allegheny County Sanitary Authority for the treatment of sewage of The Borough of West View, I believe it is most feasible to do so. In this study, much consideration was given to the possibility of West View and/or some of the adjacent communities to build a disposal plant for our own treatments. The construction of small plants and the maintenance operation of them is more costly per capita. I have observed small plants in operation in other communities, and although efficient when constructed, they often become neglected and a general nuisance.

I whole heartedly subscribe to the desire to take action necessary to clean up the streams of the Commonwealth, and as a result, all raw sewages will have to be treated before entering such streams. To fulfill this demand of the State Water Board, any action necessitates undue hardships on every community and the individual of the municipality.

To enter into an agreement with any group or to undertake it as a Borough function would require an obligation of certain handicaps and these handicaps would be about the same to the Borough or its residents regardless as to who the agreements were with. The Allegheny County Sanitary Authority agreement is very exacting. However, I can see no other out than acceptance. I have read Mr. Haydock's report and findings which he made for the West View Authority, and I concur in the generalities of his report. I believe his cost analysis are proper and for me to further discuss them would be duplication.

I understand that any agreement we would make with the said Authority will voice our objection to their undertaking any construction program that will jeopardize the purity and quality of water of the West View Authority, and with this objection cited, I feel West View should join with other communities of the County and have the Allegheny County Authority undertake the problem."
