
BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW - REGULAR MEETING - JANUARY 12, 2017



Minutes of the regular meeting of the Town Council of the Borough of West View held in Council Chambers at 441 Perry Highway, Pittsburgh, PA 15229, on Thursday, January 12, 2017. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Vice President Bryan Kircher, followed by a moment of silence. The Mayor introduced Members of Webelo Cub Scout Pack #377 and asked the Members to come forward and lead the meeting in the pledge of allegiance to the flag. All of the Webelo's were presented with certificate of attendance awards and thanked and applauded by all. The Mayor requested Melanie Anne Zeitler join him at the podium, where he presented her with a certificate of excellence for her recent honor of the Girl Scout Gold Award, which is the highest award to be received. Melanie was applauded by all.

The Mayor swore in Part Time Police Officer Jeremy Shoup and he will begin working this Saturday. Officer Shoup was congratulated and applauded. The Mayor had Joseph Assisi join him at the podium, where Joe was presented with the Governor's appointment declaration, officially designating Joe as the Emergency Management Coordinator for the Borough. Joe was congratulated and applauded. Roll Call – Chief Fromlak conducted roll call. Members of Town Council present were: Vice President Bryan S. Kircher, Members Donald E. Mikec, Robert D. Schellhaas, Eugene Borio and Scott Miller. Also attending were: Mayor J. R. Henry, Chief of Police/Secretary/Manager Bruce A. Fromlak, Assistant Secretary Patricia A. Rapp, Solicitor Michael J. Witherel, Engineer Robert E. Zischkau, Junior Council Member Monica Snyder and Junior Council Member Nick Rossmiller. President William F. Aguglia and Member M. Kimberly Steele were absent.

Motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of Town Council on December 8, 2016 made by Mr. Schellhaas was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for net pay and payroll withholding for \$170,212.93 made by Mr. Mikec was seconded by Mr. Borio. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments to vendors for \$72,623.91 made by Mr. Miller was seconded by Mr. Schellhaas. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for liquid fuel fund expenditures for \$4,645.92 made by Mr. Borio was seconded by Mr. Mikec. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for building fund expenditures for \$13,649.06 made by Mr. Schellhaas 1was seconded by Mr. Borio. Motion approved and ordered.

Reports from the Officers – Mayor's report – J. R. Henry, Mayor, reported the total receipts for December 2016 for motor vehicle code violations was \$4,245.00 and was \$51,476.73 total for the year 2016. Chief of Police Bruce A. Fromlak, Secretary/Manager – The Chief updated Council on the Ridgewood Bridge paint issue and the wall reconstruction at Center and Norwich. Solicitor – Michael J. Witherel reported on the zoning appeal and the actions that are being taken against the owner of the Ann Arbor property. Engineer – Robert E. Zischkau – Mr. Zischkau said the Borough will withhold partial payment to the Contractor on the Ridgewood Bridge until the issues with the paint are totally resolved. Mr. Zischkau will keep Council apprised of the progress for the corrective action regarding the run-off along North Park Road and said PennDot is willing to help by providing the materials necessary.

Report from the Fire Chief – Vice President Kircher said a new Fire Chief, Justin Assisi, was elected for the West View Volunteer Fire Department, to be sworn in January 12th at their department meeting. Mr. Kircher extended his thanks to Mark W. Scheller and recognized Mark for his commitment while serving as Chief for the past 4 years. Mr. Kircher said the Borough owes Mr. Scheller their debt of gratitude.

Reports from the Committees – Finance Report – Bryan S. Kircher requested Jr. Council Member Nick Rossmiller read his monthly report. Mr. Rossmiller said the Delinquent wage tax collection deposits totaled \$464.50 in December. A total of \$96,874.45 was deposited into the Borough's general fund checking account by Keystone Collections. Our liquid fuel checking account had a balance of \$34,416.14 as of December 31st and earned \$33.42 in interest. Our building fund money market account had a balance of \$18,524.53 as of December 31st, earning \$4.57 in interest. Our General Fund money market account had a balance of \$292,566.62 as of December 31st, earning \$90.45 in interest. December's Real estate tax collections totaled \$8,707.44. There were no local service tax collections in December. Business/Mercantile collections totaled \$2,676.50, with the Borough receiving \$1,388.26. Property & Purchasing – Eugene Borio reported on the proposed purchase of the 2016 Pelican Street Sweeper that is on tonight's agenda for Council to consider.

Public Works Report – Robert D. Schellhaas – Mr. Schellhaas said the Public Works crew completed 22 work orders in December. The Crew collected 45 bags of leaves and had taken them to North Park. Mr. Schellhaas said the Crew used 366 tons of salt in December. Police & Public Safety Report – William F. Aguglia (absent) Mr. Miller reported on the 2016 Police statistics, with the Department handling 4,428 calls. Vice President Kircher had no Budget/Administration Report. Fire & Water Report – Donald E. Mikec said the West View Volunteer Fire Department handled 30 calls during December 2016. Public Relations & Recreation Report – M. Kimberly Steele was absent. The Chief added information on the Powell Park tree removal and the Columbia Avenue park equipment that is needed. Junior Council Members – Monica Snyder & Nicholas Rossmiller – Monica reported on the Keystone High School exams and the Pizza with Pat, including Tom Baker. Monica is eligible for the Student of the Year award at North Hills and is raising funds for Leukemia on February 12 at Jergel's Rhythm Grille in Warrendale from 2:30 until 7 and Chris Jameson will be performing. Nick Rossmiller reported there would not be school on January 16th and the Band Banquet will be held on the 29th. The Middle School play, Peter Pan, will be performed January 26-28. Council congratulated Monica for her Student of the Year nomination.

Audience – There was no participation. There was no unfinished or new business and Vice President Kircher moved onto the Agenda. Item #1 - Council to consider Resolution #1449. Motion to read #1449 made by Mr. Miller was seconded by Mr. Schellhaas. Motion approved and ordered. Monica Snyder read #1449, which is a Resolution establishing a rate of compensation for the Real Estate Tax Collector for years 2018 through 2021. Motion to approve #1449 made by Mr. Mikec was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. Mayor Henry recognized Mrs. Schwarzmeier for her service. Item #2 - Motion made by Mr. Borio was seconded by Mr. Schellhaas to appoint William F. Aguglia to the West View Water Authority Board, for a 5-year term, through December 31, 2021. Motion approved and ordered. Item #3 – Motion to appoint Fran Opiela to the Recreation Board for a 5-year term, through December 31, 2021 made by Mr. Schellhaas was seconded by Mr. Mikec. Motion approved and ordered. Item #4 - Motion to appoint Daniel Dannenmueller to the Vacancy Board, a yearly appointment, through December 31, 2017, made by Mr. Borio was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. Item #5 - Council to consider an appointment to the Ross/West View Emergency Services Authority for a 5-year term, through December 31, 2021. Motion to appoint James Miller made by Mr. Mikec was seconded by Mr. Schellhaas. Motion approved and ordered, with Vice President Kircher abstaining. Item # 6 – Motion to appoint William Aguglia and Bruce Fromlak to the Three Rivers Wet Weather Demonstration through December 31, 2018 made by Mr. Borio was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered.

Item #7 – Council to consider the purchase of a 2016 Pelican Street Sweeper through CoStar Contract #25-004 for \$216,425 Lease, minus the \$35,000 trade in of the 2009 Sweeper. This would be a 5-year lease at approximately \$39,000 each year. Motion to approve made by Mr. Miller was seconded by Mr. Borio. Motion approved and ordered. Announcements – Mayor Henry took this time to recognize and thank William King for his 40 years serving on the Water Authority Board and requested a letter of recognition be sent on behalf of his retirement. Adjournment – With no further business to come before Council, Vice President Kircher requested a Motion to Adjourn. Motion made by Mr. Borio was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. The meeting adjourned at 7:29 p.m.

Minutes of the regular meeting of Town Council held Thursday, February 9, 2017, in Council chambers at 441 Perry Highway, Pittsburgh, PA 15229. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Aguglia, followed by a moment of silent prayer and the pledge of allegiance to the flag. Roll call was conducted by Chief of Police Bruce A. Fromlak. Members of Town Council present were: President William F. Aguglia, Vice President Bryan S. Kircher, Members Donald E. Mikec, M. Kimberly Steele, Eugene Borio and Scott V. Miller. Member Robert Schellhaas was absent. Also attending were: J.R. Henry, Mayor, Chief of Police / Secretary / Manager Bruce A. Fromlak, Assistant Secretary Patricia A. Rapp, Solicitor Michael J. Witherel and Junior Council Member Nick Rossmiller. Engineer Robert Zischkau, Fire Chief Justin Assisi, and Junior Council Member Monica Snyder were absent.

Motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on January 12, 2017 made by Mr. Kircher was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for net pay and payroll withholding for \$150,230.90 made by Mr. Kircher was seconded by Ms. Steele. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments to vendors for \$428,109.94 made by Mr. Mikec was seconded by Mr. Borio. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for liquid fuel fund expenditures for \$4,651.37 made by Mr. Miller was seconded by Mr. Borio. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve building fund expenditures for \$8,853.49 made by Mr. Kircher was seconded by Ms. Steele. Motion approved and ordered.

Reports from the Officers – Mayor's Report – J.R. Henry, Mayor – The Mayor reported the motor vehicle code violations for January 2017 totaled \$2,804.94 and reported on the CONNECT meeting he had attended. Chief of Police/Secretary/Manager Report — Chief Bruce A. Fromlak reported the Police statistics for January, with 402 calls responded to in January and reported on the progress of the wall construction at Norwich and Center. The Chief said the Borough has been withholding the final payment to the contractor until the corrections are finalized on the Bridge. Report from the Solicitor Michael J. Witherel – Solicitor Witherel had no report. Vice President Kircher advised on the approximate \$300,000 increase in the payments to vendors this month, as it was the final payment to the contractor for the 2016 Paving Project. Engineer – Robert E. Zischkau was absent and Fire Chief Justin Assisi was absent. Reports from the Committees – Finance Report – Bryan S. Kircher - Vice President Kircher read the finance report for January 2017 as follows: Delinquent Wage tax collection deposits totaled \$50.00 in January. A total of \$41,320.64 was deposited into the Borough's general fund checking account by Keystone Collections. Our liquid fuel checking account had a balance of \$34,425.19 as of January 31st and earned \$9.05 in interest. Our building fund money market account had a balance of \$18,529.40 as of January 31st, earning \$4.87 in interest. Our general fund money market account had a balance of \$283,267.93 as of January 31st, earning \$76.31 in interest. January's real estate tax collections totaled \$14,469.26. Local service tax collections totaled \$3,188.39 in January, with the Borough receiving \$2,881.82. Business/Mercantile collections totaled \$33,522.59, with the Borough receiving \$16,826.30.

Mr. Borio had no report for Property & Purchasing and there was no Public Works report. There was no Police & Public Safety report, no Budget/Administration report and no Fire & Water report, though Mr. Mikec said he has received many positive comments on the construction of the Norwich wall. M. Kimberly Steele had no report for Public Relations & Recreation. Junior Council Member Nick Rossmiller read the Public Works report, saying the Crew finished 30 work orders in January, removed 3 fallen trees and used 230 tons of salt on the roadways. Nick read the written report from Fire Chief Assisi, which detailed the good condition of the Fire

Department apparatus and reported the Department had responded to 34 calls in January. Chief Assisi had also updated the IOS with the Department.

Audience – President Aguglia welcomed any Resident to address Council. Jim Barr from 200 Frankfort questioned Council why the December 2016 minutes were not online, why the Chief had not put out bids for the wall, if the dog park was being considered and could the Martsolf bridge be made into a fenced in dog park? Mr. Barr wanted to take shears with him when he walks his dog to cut people's overhanging branches and reported the overhang on the Borough's steps behind Betsy Ann Candy. The Mayor advised the legislature has changed regarding raising the threshold for bids/quotes to \$19,600 and Solicitor Witherel added 3 quotes received are satisfactory. The Mayor said the Martsolf Bridge is blocked off because it is unsafe and the Borough is pursuing grant money to dismantle the bridge. The Mayor cautioned Mr. Barr it is unwise for him to randomly to cut any Resident's overgrowth and he should report these matters to the Chief. Mr. Barr was in front of Council for 9.44.07 minutes. There was no unfinished business or new business and President Aguglia moved onto the Agenda.

Item #1 – Council to consider authorizing the advertisement for bids for the Borough's 2017 Paving Program. Motion by Mr. Kircher was seconded by Mr. Miller to authorize the bids. Motion was approved and ordered. Announcements – Mr. Kircher questioned the streets being considered for paving in 2017. The Chief said both him and Mr. Assisi had gone over the streets and came up with a tentative list. The Chief read the following streets being considered for paving: Bronx from Highland to Center, Bronx from Center to Princeton, Clairmont from Lansing to Norwich, Mount Vernon from Norwich to Ridgewood, Ridgewood from Richland to Oakwood, Ridgewood from Oakwood to the Bridge, Wellington Drive from Perry Highway to Highland and Amherst Avenue from Kenyon to Cornell. Vice President Kircher said this was an ambitious wish list, which is subject to change.

With no further business to come before Council, President Aguglia thanked everyone for attending tonight's meeting and requested a Motion to adjourn. Motion to adjourn made by Mr. Kircher was seconded by Mr. Mikec. Motion approved and ordered. The meeting adjourned at 7:20 p.m.



Minutes of the regular meeting of the Town Council of the Borough of West View held Thursday, March 9, 2017, in Council chambers at 441 Perry Highway, Pittsburgh, PA 15229. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Aguglia, followed by a moment of silent prayer and the pledge of allegiance to the flag. Chief Fromlak conducted roll call. Members of Town Council present were: President William F. Aguglia, Vice President Bryan S. Kircher, Members Donald E. Mikec, M. Kimberly Steele, Robert D. Schellhaas, Eugene Borio and Scott V. Miller. Also attending were: J. R. Henry, Mayor, Chief of Police Bruce A. Fromlak, Secretary/Manager, Assistant Secretary Patricia A. Rapp, Engineer Robert E. Zischkau, Attorney Matt Kalina, and Junior Council Members Monica Snyder and Nick Rossmiller. Solicitor Michael J. Witherel and Fire Chief Justin Assisi were absent.

Motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of Town Council on February 9, 2017 made by Ms. Steele was seconded by Mr. Mikec. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for net pay and payroll withholding for \$151,577.24 made by Mr. Kircher was seconded by Mr. Schellhaas. Motion to approve payments to vendors for \$143,525.66 made by Mr. Borio was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for liquid fuel fund expenditures for \$4,650.73 made by Mr. Mikec was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for building fund expenditures for \$27,447.20 made by Ms. Steele was seconded by Mr. Mikec. Motion approved and ordered. Reports from the Officers – Mayor's Report – J. R. Henry, Mayor reported the February 2017 motor vehicle code violations totaled \$4,773.51.

Report from the Chief of Police/Secretary/Manager – Chief Bruce A. Fromlak reported the Borough issued 7 property maintenance letters in February and 6 residences had complied. The Columbia Parklet upgrades will include 4 swings, inclusive of a handicapped swing and equipment for an approximate \$7,500 cost. A flyer from Alcosan is on the Borough's website, detailing the specifics for financial aid for the Alcosan Clean Water Assistance Fund Program to help families pay their Alcosan bills. The Chief advised Council on a scheduled pre-construction meeting for the upgrade of the intersection at Highland and Perry. Chief Fromlak said the February 2017 Crime statistics had 369 calls for service with 80 citations being issued, including 7 criminal arrests, 9 accident reports and 7 ordinance violations. The Chief reported on the Project Lifesaver Program for Alzheimer and Dementia patients and said the Borough was one of the first in Allegheny County to use the Program in recovering a lost patient in the Plaza. The Chief corrected Agenda Item 3 – the correction is subdividing 1 lot into 2 to erect 2-Single Family homes.

Report from the Solicitor – Attorney Kalina had no report for Council. Report from the Engineer – Robert E. Zischkau advised that PennDot plans to provide the stone for the remediation of North Park Road, reducing the cost of the bids by this amount. The Mayor advised the North Park Road bid was received and is being awarded through West View Authority Waste Water Department, not through West View Borough. Fire Chief Justin Assisi was not in attendance but had filed a written report to Council. Reports from the Committees – Finance Report – Bryan S. Kircher reported a total of \$68,001.06 was deposited into the Borough's general fund checking account by Keystone Collections. There were no delinquent wage tax collection deposits in February. Our liquid fuel checking account had a balance of \$34,433.11 as of February 28th and earned \$7.92 in interest. Our building fund money market account had a balance of \$13,533.58 as of February 28th and earned \$4.18 in interest. Our general fund money market account had a balance of \$219,206.77 as of February 28th, earning \$56.84 in interest. February's real estate tax collections totaled \$2,813.18. February's local service tax collections totaled \$12,000.19 and the Borough received \$10,846.31. Business/Mercantile collections totaled \$5,920.10, with the Borough receiving \$2,965.06.

Property & Purchasing Report – Eugene Borio reported on the Borough receiving its new Pelican street sweeper and the proposed purchase of a 2017 Ford utility AWD vehicle through a SHACOG Purchasing Alliance Quote, to be considered as Agenda Item #4. Public Works Report – Robert D. Schellhaas reported the Public Works Department completed 18 work orders in February and have been cold patching the holes in the Borough's roadways. The Crew used 117 tons of salt in February and repaired the storm drain on Center at Township Road. Police & Public Safety Report – William F. Aguglia had Mr. Miller report to Council on the Simtac firearms training for Borough Officers and the Chief advised the training is paid for by the Allegheny County District Attorney's office. Budget/Administration Report – Mr. Kircher had no report for Council. Fire & Water Report – Donald E. Mikec said the West View Volunteer Fire Department had responded to 25 calls in February, with a year-to-date total of 59 calls. Public Relations & Recreation Report – Council Member Steele had no report for Council. Junior Council Member Report – Monica Snyder & Nicholas Rossmiller – Monica thanked Council for their support for her Leukemia fundraiser, raising over \$50,000 total, with Monica raising

\$7,200 and reported on the Copper Industry essay contest, with Monica winning. March 3rd was Cabaret night, with 200 attending and 31 students performing. February 27th through March 3rd was cancer awareness through the School and the Junior Prom will take place on March 17th. Nick Rossmiller said the SAT's were held on Saturday, March 11th and reported on the Basketball Tournament. The Elementary Band Concert will be held on March 22nd and the Senior High musical "Me & My Girl" will begin March 23rd and run the 24th, 30th and the 31st.

Audience – President Aguglia welcomed any Borough Resident to address Council. Peggy Kramer from 6 Amherst Avenue requested the Borough consider putting a stop sign at Amherst and Lehigh due to speeding vehicles. The Mayor said both he and the Chief will look into this matter, as they are considering the placement of 4-way stop signs at Ridgewood and State Alley. Ms. Kramer was in front of Council for 2.04.04 minutes. Jim Barr from 200 Frankfort thanked the Mayor for his clarifications, questioned Ms. Steele on the upcoming Crime Watch Meeting, and questioned if the new street sweeper was being operated correctly, as it has a very loud squeal. Mr. Barr spoke of his desire to have sod placed on the Martsolf bridge with a fence to turn it into a dog park, talked about his dog finding a steak on Perry, noticed how bright vehicle's headlights are while he is walking his dog at night, noticed how vehicles are speeding and wondered if Council couldn't convert the Martsolf bridge into a dog park, would they consider putting a pedestrian walkway at the upper portion of Richland? Mr. Barr was in front of Council for 7.07.18 minutes. Chief Fromlak said the Police have issued 80 speeding citations but cannot use radar to cite speeders until new legislation is pushed through addressing the legal use of radar for Municipalities.

There was no unfinished business and no new business and President Aguglia moved onto the Agenda. Item #1 – Council to consider an appointment of a Delegate and an Alternate Delegate to the MRM Property and Liability Trust. Motion to appoint Donald Mikec as Delegate and William Aguglia as Alternate was made by Ms. Steele and seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. Item #2 – Council to consider an appointment of a Delegate and an Alternate Delegate to the MRM Workers' Compensation Pooled Trust. Motion by Mr. Kircher was seconded by Mr. Schellhaas to appoint William Aguglia as Delegate and Donald Mikec as the Alternate. Motion approved and ordered. Item #3 – Council to consider approving the Planning Commission recommendation for the subdivision of the lot 350-P-260 into two in order to erect 2-single family homes located at the intersection of Wellington and Highland. Motion to approve the Planning Commission recommendation to subdivide 350-P-260 into 2 lots was made by Mr. Kircher and seconded by Ms. Steele. Motion approved and ordered. Item #4 – Council to consider approving the SHACOG Purchasing Alliance quote WV-K8A17 for \$29,580 from Woltz & Wind Ford for the purchase of a 2017 Ford Utility Police Interceptor AWD. This vehicle would replace a 2013 Ford Police SUV and motion to approve made by Mr. Borio was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered.

There were no announcements. President Aguglia thanked everyone for attending tonight's meeting and requested a Motion to adjourn. Motion to adjourn made by Mr. Miller was seconded by Mr. Borio. Motion approved and ordered. The meeting adjourned at 7:28 p.m.

The Borough's electric costs will drop from .0628¢ to .0588¢, saving the Borough approximately \$704 per year on electricity costs. Chief is looking into getting natural gas savings through the CONNECT auction. The Chief, along with Joe Assisi and Rich Rapp, will attend meetings regarding utilities coordination and one calls in order to keep utility companies from excavating recently paved streets. This is a good initiative, one of a kind program that will save many municipalities future reparation costs after they have paved roads. The Chief said the Borough received dividends of \$14,716.27 from MRM property and liability and \$46,785.91 from MRM Workers' Compensation. The Chief reported on the Martsolf Bridge and the new electronic sign at #3 Firehall, which is currently experiencing technical difficulties. Chief announced the Borough was awarded as being a recipient of the ALOM 2017 Banner Community Award.

The Chief reported the Police had 370 calls for service, issued 49 traffic citations, and handled 12 criminal arrests, 8 accident reports, and 5 ordinance violations in March. Report from the Solicitor – Michael J. Witherel – Mr. Witherel remarked the Borough was instrumental in bringing about the MRM pooled trust, which has refunded over \$19 million to participating municipalities since its' inception. Engineer's Report – Robert E. Zischkau reported on the paving bids received yesterday for the Borough's 2017 paving program, which are to be considered under the Agenda. Mr. Zischkau advised Council concerning the stringer/bridge damage on the Martsolf Bridge, which will be fixed and subsequently inspected in June. Mr. Zischkau said payment to the contractor is being withheld until completion and said the last thing to do will be to paint the bridge once the weather remains steady above 40°. Mr. Mikec questioned an estimate on completion of the bridge work and Mr. Zischkau said hopefully he will know a completion date by the next meeting of Council.

There was no report from Mr. Borio for Property & Purchasing, from Mr. Aguglia for Police & Public Safety, or from Mr. Kircher for Budget / Administration. Public Works - Robert D. Schellhaas reported the Crew handled 25 work orders in March and had been busy with cold patch and used 89 tons of salt in March. Fire & Water Report – Donald E. Mikec said the West View Volunteer Fire Department had 28 calls in March, with 87 year-to-date, averaging 29 calls per month and Mr. Mikec reminded everyone of the Friday, March 21st Cash Bash at the Firemen's Banquet Hall. Public Relations & Recreation Report – M. Kimberly Steele reported on the May Crime Watch meeting, with a Vector Security Representative to address the meeting on Monday, May 8th. Spring Cleanup will take place on Saturday, April 22nd from 9:00 a.m. until noon. No electronics will be collected or accepted. Junior Council Member Report – Nick Rossmiller was absent and Monica Snyder addressed Council regarding the school's current spring break and said APEX exams will be May 1-5 and 8-12. School is off on May 16th for Election Day and Friday, May 26th is the last day of school and Graduation.

Audience — President Aguglia welcomed any Borough resident to address Council. Sandy Truver from 36 Montclair requested guidance or advice from Council on a serious raccoon problem. Chief Fromlak said he will check with the Public Works Department, as they rat abate, but the Chief is unsure regarding trapping/removing raccoons and will look into this matter. Ms. Truver was in front of Council for 3.15.54 minutes. Jim Barr from 200 Frankfort said he couldn't hear the Solicitor and then needed someone to explain the MRM pooled trust dividends Mr. Witherel had addressed, which the Mayor re-explained. Mr. Barr asked if this trust had anything to do with Borough pensions and the Mayor said no and re-explained the yearly trust dividends. Mr. Barr questioned the report concerning the CONNECT auction for one call system for utilities, which the Mayor re-explained. Mr. Barr was in front of Council for 6.12.55 minutes. There was no unfinished or new business and President Aguglia moved onto the Agenda. Agenda Item #1 – Motion to read Ordinance #1493 was made by Ms. Steele and seconded by Mr. Kircher. Motion approved and ordered. Jr. Council Member Snyder read #1493, which establishes stop signs at State and Ridgewood and Amherst and Lehigh and establishes no parking on the east side of Carlisle between Adrian and Oberlin. Motion to adopt #1493 made by Mr. Mikec was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered.

Item #2 – Motion to appoint Rich Rapp and Frank Conley to the two appointments to the West View Shade Tree Commission for three-year terms, through April 10, 2019 made by Mr. Mikec was seconded by Ms. Steele. Motion approved and ordered. Item #3 – Council to consider the bid results for the 2017 Paving Program. Mr. Zischkau addressed Council on the 9 bids received on Tuesday, April 12th. The low bidder was Victor Paving, Inc. in the amount of \$307,581, contingent upon available funding, with a Program completion date by July 31st. Both the Mayor and Mr. Kircher commented and Vice President Kircher said \$250,000 had been budgeted and may be able to use Bond money for the additional \$57,581. Motion to approved made by Ms. Steele was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. With no announcements, President Aguglia thanked everyone for attending, wished everyone a blessed and happy Easter and requested a Motion to adjourn the meeting in honor of the memory of Dan Rooney. Motion to adjourn made by Mr. Kircher was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered.

Motion to approve payments for liquid fuel fund expenditures for \$4,671.30 made by Mr. Borio was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for building fund expenditures for \$4,546.19 made by Mr. Mikec was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered.

Reports from the Officers – Mayor's Report – J. R. Henry, Mayor – The Mayor was met at the podium by Mr. David Seifried. The Mayor read a commendation for Mr. Seifried, Owner of LaBelle Beauty Salon on Center Avenue for over 50 years. Mr. Seifried was congratulated and applauded by all. The Mayor said the total receipts for April's motor vehicle code violations were \$4,572.34. The Mayor reported on the CONNECT Congress resolutions that were recently passed and the Mayor hopes Council reviews the resolutions and thanked both President Aguglia and Chief Fromlak for attending the CONNECT meeting. Motion to approve payments for net pay and payroll withholding for \$158,671.41 made by Mr. Borio was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments to vendors for \$136,267.95 made by Mr. Mikec was seconded by Ms. Steele. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for liquid fuel fund expenditures for \$4,688.13 made by Mr. Schellhaas was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve the Minutes of the regular meeting of Town Council on September 14, 2017 made by Mr. Miller was seconded by Mr. Mikec. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for net pay and payroll withholding for \$166,921.82 made by Mr. Kircher was seconded by Mr. Schellhaas. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments to vendors for \$182,953.13 was made by Mr. Schellhaas and seconded by Mr. Mikec. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for liquid fuel fund expenditures for \$4,688.13 made by Mr. Borio was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for building fund expenditures for \$1,530.78 made by Mr. Mikec was seconded by Mr. Kircher. Motion approved and ordered.

Aguglia – President Aguglia had no report for Council. Fire & Water Report – Donald E. Mikec – Mr. Mikec said the West View Volunteer Fire Department responded to 47 calls in September and will have their pumps and hoses inspected. Mr. Mikec announced the Fire Department's fundraising event – Paint with a Twist – and it will be held on October 26th. Public Relations & Recreation – M. MINUTES - SPECIAL WORKSHOP MEETING - REGULAR MEETING - NOVEMBER 9, 2017

Minutes of the special workshop meeting of Town Council held Thursday, November 9, 2017, in Council Chambers at 441 Perry Highway, Pittsburgh, PA 15229. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President William F. Aguglia, followed by a moment of silent prayer and the pledge of allegiance to the Flag. Chief Fromlak conducted roll call. Members of Council present were: President William F. Aguglia, Vice President Bryan S. Kircher, Members Donald E. Mikec, M. Kimberly Steele, Robert D. Schellhaas and Scott V. Miller. Also attending were: Mayor J.R. Henry, Chief of Police Bruce A. Fromlak, Secretary/Manager, Assistant Secretary Patricia A. Rapp, Solicitor Michael J. Witherel, Engineer Robert E. Zischkau and Junior Council Member Andrew Bensch. Fire Chief Justin Assisi and Junior Council Member Michael Do were absent. Member Eugene Borio arrived at 6:05 p.m.

Chief Fromlak read the legal advertisement for the workshop meeting, advertised in the Post-Gazette North on October 27th, stating the regular meeting will immediately follow and the purpose is for Council to discuss the proposed 2018 Budget, with no other business is to be considered. The Chief thanked the Budget Committee - Mr. Kircher, Mr. Aguglia and Ms. Steele – along with Cathy Mann and Patty Rapp, for their support and assistance with developing the proposed budget. The Chief reported the Budget is tax neutral and will maintain all services with no tax increase for 2018.

Projected revenues and expenditures are \$3,822,634 for 2018, inclusive of final year options of both uniformed and non-uniformed union contracts, with a 3% per hour increase in 2018, along with a UPMC Health Care Plan increase of 3.5% over 2017, with an estimated premium of \$251,300 annually, with no changes in the current coverage. Year-to-date monetary accounts are as follows: \$554,574 in general fund checking, \$175,230.39 in general fund money market, \$13,576.62 in the building fund money market and \$217,919.72 in liquid fuel fund checking. The Chief budgeted \$250,000 for the 2018 paving project and the streets under consideration are – Hempstead from Lakewood to Chalfonte – Mineola from Center to Highland – Norwich from Center to the dead end – Oakwood from Center to Ridgewood – Oakley from Park to Martsolf – Yale from Stanford to Kenyon – Park from Center to Frankfort – Stanford from Princeton to Amherst – Stanford from Vassar to Harvard and Wellington from Perry Highway to Highland.

The Chief noted other major account changes for 2018, such as \$1,729,021 in real estate taxes, \$905,000 in earned income taxes, \$62,850 in local service taxes, \$33,000 for business privilege tax, \$20,000 for auditing services, \$21,600 for the Solicitor and \$25,000 for the Engineer. For the fourth year in a row, the Chief does not anticipate the need for a TAN loan for 2018. Allowances have been made within expenditures for a new 2018 Police Utility Vehicle to replace the 2013 with over 95,000 miles, allows \$56,500 for an F-350 Ford with plow and salt package purchase, allowing \$30,000 toward the Aerial payment and \$20,000 toward the 22 light replacement with LED's at Schell Field.

Chief compared year-to-date 2017 figures to proposed 2018, noting major account changes, as follows: Real Estate current \$1,616,000 to \$1,729,021, Earned Income Tax current \$829,000 to \$905,000, Local Service Tax current \$54,000 to \$62,850, Business Privilege Tax current \$30,000 to \$33,000, Auditing Services \$20,000 current to \$20,000 in 2018, Other Engineering Fees current \$25,200 to \$25,000 and Fire Vehicle Repair would remain at \$8,000. The Chief said the Dollar General Store signed a lease extension until June 30, 2021 at \$3,000 per month, Steeltown Firearm's lease negotiations are progressing, being expired March 31, 2017 at \$700 per month, and it is their intention to remain. Schorr Bakery lease expires December 31st at \$490 per month and is under consideration due to the Owner's health. PNC Bank's lease expires November 30th at \$3,833.33 per month and Chief has Coldwell Banker Real Estate Services working on leasing this space, being confident they can rent this space. The Chief received a \$19,500 quote for the replacement of the building generator. The Chief projects an increase in Liquid Fuels Fund to \$189,817 in 2018, an approximate \$9,500 increase over 2017.

Vice President Bryan S. Kircher thanked the Chief for all of his work on the 2018 proposed Budget, and addressed the annual healthcare premium. Mayor Henry questioned the Chief's aggressive increase in real estate tax and earned income tax, adding there is better collection of income tax through the State. The Mayor felt everyone had done a

fabulous job on the proposed budget preparation. With no further discussion, the budget workshop meeting ended at 65 5 6:20 p.m.

At 6:20 p.m., the Regular meeting of Town Council began. President Aguglia requested a motion to approve the minutes of the special public hearing on October 12, 2017. Motion to approve made by Mr. Mikec was seconded by Mr. Kircher. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on October 12, 2017 made by Ms. Steele was seconded by Mr. Schellhaas. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for net pay and payroll withholding for \$164,048.87 made by Mr. Miller was seconded by Ms. Steele. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments to vendors for \$249,998.43 made by Mr. Borio was seconded by Mr. Mikec. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for liquid fuel fund expenditures for \$4,732.14 made by Mr. Schellhaas was seconded by Ms. Steele. Motion approved and ordered. Motion to approve payments for building fund expenditures for \$2,980.94 made by Mr. Kircher was seconded by Mr. Miller. Motion approved and ordered.

Reports from the Officers – Mayor's Report – J. R. Henry reported the motor vehicle code violations for the month of October 2017 totaled \$5,732.34. Chief of Police/Secretary/Manager – Chief Bruce A. Fromlak reported on the recent Zoning Hearings, approving the demolition of the old Pizza Hut and building an O'Reilly's Auto Parts Store and approving the Garage on 205 Clairmont. The Chief said October's crime statistics calls for service totaled 417, with 73 traffic citations issued, 125 traffic enforcement reports, 12 criminal arrests, 4 accident reports and 4 ordinance violations. The Chief read the traffic trailer report and noted the Borough was awarded the AAA Platinum Award, in partial thanks to Barb O'Lare applying to AAA. Solicitor – Michael J. Witherel had no report for Council. Engineer Robert E. Zischkau had no report for Council. Fire Chief Justin Assisi was absent, having filed a written report.

Reports from the Committees – Finance Report – Bryan S. Kircher read the October 2017 report as follows: Delinquent wage tax collection deposits totaled \$50 for October. A total of \$34,561.67 was deposited into the Borough's general fund checking account by Keystone Collections. Our liquid fuel checking account had a balance of \$217,919.72 on October 31st and earned \$95.48 in interest. Our building fund money market account had a balance of \$13,576.62 on October 31st and earned \$5.95 in interest. Our general fund money market account had a balance of \$175,230.39 on October 31st, earning \$76.78 in interest. Real estate tax collections totaled \$170,835.72 for October. Local service tax collections totaled \$5,550.57 in October and the Borough received \$5,016.89. Business/Mercantile collections totaled \$34,246.83, with the Borough receiving \$17,128.42.

Property & Purchasing – Eugene Borio had no report. Public Works – Robert D. Schellhaas reported the Public Works completed 26 work orders. The Crew has been picking up leaves and have put the spreaders on trucks for this coming winter. Police & Public Safety – William F. Aguglia – Mr. Miller reported the Officers attended an Active Shooter Training and 7 Officers were trained in street survival. Budget/Administration – Bryan S. Kircher had no report. Fire & Water Report – Donald E. Mikec said the West View Volunteer Fire Department responded to 29 calls for the month, bringing the year-to-date total to 377. Mr. Mikec said the Fire Department, along with West View Police Officers, held their annual emergency services day on October 7th. This function was well attended, with 110 children stopping to check out the displays and activities. Public Relations & Recreation – M. Kimberly Steele reported on the annual Halloween Parade. Over 800 children signed up, with 9 dogs and 225 North Hills Band Members. Ms. Steele thanked the Borough Staff and Public Works for their help with this function.

The Chief added information on the October 21st Community Clean Up, with special thanks to Kathy Karnavas and the Pitt Service Students for their participation. Junior Council Member Report – Michelle Do was absent – Andrew Bensch reported on the October 13th Homecoming and said the 2018 Kindergarten packets are ready for Parents. A Speech/Debate Tournament was held and Junior Member Michelle Do took 3rd place. The High School Play will be "Pride & Prejudice" and will cost \$6 for Adults and \$4 for Students. The Students will not have School over Thanksgiving, from Wednesday, November 22nd through Monday, November 27th, returning on the 28th.

Audience – President Aguglia welcomed any Borough Resident to address Council – there was no participation. Mr. Aguglia moved onto Unfinished Business – there was no unfinished business – New Business – there was no new business. Agenda – Item #1 – Council to consider Resolution #1456. Our liquid fuel checking account had a balance of \$218,009.28 on November 30th and earned \$89.56 in interest. Our building fund money market account had a balance of \$13,582.20 on November 30th, earning \$5.58 in interest. Our general fund money market account had a balance of \$154,447.75 on November 30th, earning \$67.96 for November. Real estate tax collections totaled \$47,473.90 in November. Local service tax collections for November totaled \$9,222.85 and the Borough received \$8,336.09. Business/Mercantile collections totaled \$6,598.32, with the Borough receiving \$3,304.16.

Property & Purchasing – Eugene Borio had no report. Public Works – Robert D.
