WHEREAS, the Borough of West View jointly with the West View Water Authority entered into an Interim Consent Order and Agreement (COA) dated December 2015 with Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PA D.E.P.), AND

WHEREAS, said COA required, the Borough of West View to submit a Source Reduction Study by December 1, 2017 containing certain required information, AND

WHEREAS, in the COA, ACHD required that the Source Reduction Study identify areas within, the Borough of West View system with "high" Infiltration/Inflow (I/I), AND

WHEREAS, said COA neither defined "high" I&I/flow nor specified reporting units, AND

WHEREAS, in the COA, PA D.E.P. recognized that municipalities/authorities and ALCOSAN should work together to develop flow targets, specifically providing that municipalities/authorities should have the ability to modify their Source Reduction Studies to incorporate flow targets once they are established by ALCOSAN in consultation with the municipalities, AND

WHEREAS, to facilitate the development of cost-effective and affordable standards by which ALCOSAN and the municipalities could address flow reduction strategies, 3 Rivers Wet Weather (3RWW) established the Wet Weather Working Group (3WG) and the Source Flow Reduction and Flow Target Subcommittee (SFRFT), AND

WHEREAS, the SFRFT has provided a forum for ALCOSAN and the municipalities in the ALCOSAN customer service area to work collaboratively to discuss technical matters, policy issues, and implementation strategies related to the development of a universally-acceptable municipal approach defining high I&I/flow and to achieve source flow reduction in both separate and combined systems, AND

WHEREAS, the result of such collaboration, promulgated in the SFRFT Interim Report dated February 16, 2017 (included as an appendix in the Source Reduction Study), was the proposal of an adaptive management approach which takes into consideration the prioritization, cost-effectiveness, and affordability of source reduction projects proposed to meet said threshold with the ultimate goal of supporting the successful implementation of ALCOSAN's Interim Wet Weather Plan (IWWP), AND

WHEREAS, , the Borough of West View Source Reduction Study incorporates the SFRFT Interim Report's proposed approach which provides a cost-effective and affordable structure by which the municipalities in the region can address source reduction.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW, COUNTY OF ALLEGHENY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, OPTING TO PROHIBIT SITING OF CATEGORY 4 CASINOS WITHIN SAID MUNICIPALITY.

WHEREAS, on October 30, 2017, House Bill 271 was signed into law amending the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development and Gaming Act at 4 Pa. C.S. Section 1101, et seq., authorizing a number of gambling expansion opportunities within the Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS, one such opportunity is found in the creation of up to ten Category 4 slot machine licenses which would operate between 300 to 750 slot machines and eventually up to 50 gaming tables; and

WHEREAS, generally under said law, no Category 4 location can be located within 25 lineal miles of an existing Category 1, 2, or 3 casino facility, with the exception that an operator of a Category 1, 2, or 3 casino facility may locate a Category 4 casino within 25 lineal miles of its own Category 1, 2, or 3 facility; and

WHEREAS, Section 1305.1(A.1) of the Act is entitled "Municipal Option", and provides the municipality the option to prohibit, or opt of, the siting of a Category 4 facility within said municipality.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the Borough of West View that the municipal option as defined in said Act is hereby exercised, and said municipality elects to prohibit or opt out of the siting of a Category 4 facility within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of West View.

housing code of the Borough, has been designated by the department responsible for enforcement of the code as unfit for human habitation; such structure is a fire hazard, or otherwise dangerous to the safety of person or property; utilities, plumbing, heating, sewerage or other facilities have been disconnected, destroyed, removed, or rendered ineffective from such structure, so that the structure is unfit for its intended use; such structure is unoccupied and has been tax delinquent for a period of more than two years; and/or such structure is vacant (but not tax delinquent), and has not been rehabilitated within one year of receipt of notice to rehabilitate from the appropriate code enforcement agency.






