**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW, COUNTY OF ALLEGHENY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, APPROVING THE TRANSFER OF RESTAURANT LIQUOR LICENSE NO. R-9636 INTO THE BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW FROM STOWE TOWNSHIP.**

**WHEREAS**, Act 141 of 2000 ("the Act"), which amends the Commonwealth's Liquor Code, authorizes the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board to approve, in certain instances, the transfer of a Restaurant Liquor License across municipal boundaries within the same county regardless of the quota limitations provided for in Section 461 of the Liquor Code, if sales of liquor and malt or brewed beverages are legal in the municipality receiving the license; and

**WHEREAS**, the receiving municipality issues a resolution approving the transfer of the license outside the municipality to inside the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, amendments to the Liquor Code stipulate that prior to adoption of a resolution by the receiving municipality, at least one hearing is held for the purpose of permitting interested parties to state their concerns regarding the transfer of a Restaurant Liquor License into the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, an application for transfer filed with the PLCB under the Act must contain a copy of the resolution adopted by the municipality approving the transfer of the Restaurant Liquor License into the receiving municipality.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, SPBW, LLC, has requested the approval of the Borough of West View Council for the proposed transfer of Pennsylvania Restaurant Liquor License R-9636 to its facilities within the Borough of West View, with the understanding that said transfer must be approved at a later date by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Borough of West View Council, finds that the transfer of Restaurant Liquor License Number R-9636 into the Borough of West View by SPBW, LLC, will not adversely affect the welfare, health, peace and morals of the Borough or its residents.

available for the removal of such structures, and


**WHEREAS**, the Town Council of the Borough of West View is desirous of obtaining such funds.

- ✓ Because of the physical condition or use, such structure is regarded as a public nuisance at common law  
or has been declared a public nuisance in accordance with local housing, building, plumbing, fire and  
related codes.
- ✓ Such structure, because of the physical condition, use or occupancy, is considered an attractive nuisance  
to children (including but not limited to abandoned wells, shafts, basements, excavations, and unsafe  
fences or structures).
- ✓ Such structure, because it is dilapidated, unsanitary, unsafe, vermin-infested or lacking in the facilities  
and equipment required by the housing code of the Municipality, has been designed by the department  
responsible for enforcement of the code as unfit for human habitation.
- ✓ Such structure is a fire hazard, or otherwise dangerous to the safety of person or property.
- ✓ Utilities, plumbing, heating, sewerage or other facilities have been disconnected, destroyed, removed, or  
rendered ineffective from such structure, so that the structure is unfit for its intended use.







## RESOLUTION #1458

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST VIEW, HEREBY JOINING WITH OTHER SIMILARLY AFFECTED MUNICIPAL BODIES WITHIN THE ALCOSAN SERVICE AREA TO HELP CREATE A UNIFIED APPROACH TO SOURCE REDUCTION EFFORTS, AND ADOPTING A SOURCE REDUCTION STUDY AS REQUIRED BY THE PHASE I CONSENT ORDER AND AGREEMENT.

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of West View jointly with the West View Water Authority entered into an Interim Consent Order and Agreement (COA) dated December 2015 with Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PA D.E.P.), AND

**WHEREAS**, said COA required , the Borough of West View to submit a Source Reduction Study by December 1, 2017 containing certain required information, AND

**WHEREAS**, in the COA, ACHD required that the Source Reduction Study identify areas within , the Borough of West View system with "high" Infiltration/Inflow (I/I), AND

**WHEREAS**, said COA neither defined "high" I&I/flow nor specified reporting units, AND

**WHEREAS**, in the COA, PA D.E.P. recognized that municipalities/authorities and ALCOSAN should work together to develop flow targets, specifically providing that municipalities/authorities should have the ability to modify their Source Reduction Studies to incorporate flow targets once they are established by ALCOSAN in consultation with the municipalities, AND

**WHEREAS**, to facilitate the development of cost-effective and affordable standards by which ALCOSAN and the municipalities could address flow reduction strategies, 3 Rivers Wet Weather (3RWW) established the Wet Weather Working Group (3WG) and the Source Flow Reduction and Flow Target Subcommittee (SFRFT), AND

**WHEREAS**, the SFRFT has provided a forum for ALCOSAN and the municipalities in the ALCOSAN customer service area to work collaboratively to discuss technical matters, policy issues, and implementation strategies related to the development of a universally-acceptable municipal approach defining high I&I/flow and to achieve source flow reduction in both separate and combined systems, AND

**WHEREAS**, the result of such collaboration, promulgated in the SFRFT Interim Report dated February 16, 2017 (included as an appendix in the Source Reduction Study), was the proposal of an adaptive management approach which takes into consideration the prioritization, cost-effectiveness, and affordability of source reduction projects proposed to meet said threshold with the ultimate goal of supporting the successful implementation of ALCOSAN's Interim Wet Weather Plan (IWWP), AND


**WHEREAS**, , the Borough of West View Source Reduction Study incorporates the SFRFT Interim Report's proposed approach which provides a cost-effective and affordable structure by which the municipalities in the region can address source reduction.

Penndot intends to improve SR 19 from Segment 0440 Offset 1626 to Segment 0460 Offset 0902 and SR NA from Segment NA Offset NA to Segment NA Offset NA, through roadway alterations or resurfacing ("Project"), as more fully described in Exhibit A: and




