







November 15


"Don't Frown Just Laugh and Clown" was the Seniors motto at their barn party in Murdock's barn.

CLASS HISTORY



We, the first graduating class of West View High School are now preparing to leave our Alma Mater. This approaching event creates in us a feeling of bewilderment combined with a certain importance which probably is quite similar to that with which we entered upon our high school career.

Our high school life began in 1935, when West View was still a Junior High School. From the very first day, however, the class began to build the foundation which has been so durable.

The coming of our Sophomore year reminded us that we had but one year to remain in West View, for at this time the borough was sending its students to high schools in the surrounding districts to finish their last two years of school.

Mystery prevailed in our class play "Tiger House" and brought several talented actors into the limelight. The dramatic operetta "Lela Wala" was an outstanding success.

On May 25, 1937, the Promotion Exercises of the tenth grade were held in the Junior High School auditorium. "The History and Foundation" of the West View School was the general theme chosen for all speeches. And so we prepared to leave West View.

However, in the late summer of 1937 we received a notice that we would continue our high school career in West View, for the borough was planning a high school.

In our Junior year we began to conquer the new fields of athletics, forensics, and dramatics. Our school grew rapidly, and consequently our curriculum and faculty were enlarged. It was during this year that we established our first debate club, which was highly honored by being admitted to the National Forensic League. This year also introduced





the first West View football team which, although late in starting practice, pulled through with three wins out of eight games played. Baseball and golf were added to the athletic program, and they too proved equally successful. At all the games and activities West View's newly organized band could be heard as they marched along in their crimson and gold uniforms.

This same year, 1937, our class organized for the first time, and elected Charles Wilson, president; Charles Wissner, vice-president; and Paul Dodson, treasurer. Naturally the most outstanding social event of the year was the Junior Prom at the Highland Country Club.

September 1938! We are Seniors! Our class now numbers one hundred and twenty. We feel the responsibility of setting an example for the under-classmen with no lack of confidence; we hold our enviable position under the sponsorship of Miss Daubenspeck and Mr. Metzger. Our debaters continue to uphold their splendid record; our teams again display that fighting spirit and good sportsmanship so characteristic of West View; and our many other activities find us at the top.

We have made this year one of hard work and activity. Our class officers were elected early in September, and those obtaining the honors were Lee Link, president; John Casciotti, vice-president; Florence Hamburg, secretary; and Harold Lutz, treasurer. These officers have worked hard throughout the year for our welfare and prosperity. Our yearbook staff was chosen in October, and work was started. Among the outstanding social successes of the year was the Westvian Dance and Card Party; The Senior Play, "Little Women"; Class Day; the Junior Prom; and finally the grand Senior Dinner Dance.

As the last of these happy years draws to a close, we leave to our Advisors and Faculty our appreciation for leadership, guidance, helpfulness, and friendliness. On the other hand, we take with us all the hope, ambition, courage, and spirit of fair-play which we have attained throughout our school life. So we look forward hopefully to success in our future undertakings. We don the Cap of Life.

"I Get Along Without You Very Well" is the theme song the day finals are given for the end of the semester.






JUNIOR CLASS

A great deal of the credit should go to both the regular and reserve line.






BASKETBALL---Junior Varsity




CHEERLEADERS

MINOR SPORTS






