The Borough Councilmen elected on the 16th Inst. met for organization at the Martsof residence, those present were:- F.C. Martsof, J.W. Beers, John Menzies, J.W. Schmitt, Rodenz Heyl, A.H. McKeullen and H.C. Galbreath.

Upon assembling F.C. Martsof was duly elected President by a unanimous vote.

Edward House was duly elected Borough Secretary, receiving majority of votes.

Application of Mr Chas. K. Robinson presented for Borough Solicitor.

Nomination for Borough Solicitor was then made and Chas. K. Robinson being only one nominated it was moved by J.W. Beers that H.C. Galbreath cast the ballot, the ballot was cast for Chas. K. Robinson who was declared duly elected for term ending first Monday in March 1906 at a salary of one hundred fifty dollars. (150⁰⁰) for the Council term.

Moved by J.W. Beers seconded by J.W. Schmitt that Borough Secretary receive a nominal salary of one dollar per month. passed unanimously.

Moved and seconded that future meetings be held first Monday in each month, passed. unanimously.

Members adjourned.

May 27th 1905

A special meeting was convened for the purpose of considering ordinances, those present being: F.C. Meatsolf, J.W. Beers, Lotemz Hays, J.W. Schmitt, A.H. Mc. Mullen, H.C. Galbreath, and John Muzzio. The President in the chair.

Rules of Council presented by Solicitor as follows:

Rule 1. The hour of regular Council meetings shall be at 8 o'clock P.M., the regular meetings of Council shall be held on the first Monday of each month at the Council Chamber, or such other place as may be agreed upon. Special meetings may be called by the President whenever he may deem it expedient. In the absence of the President, or upon his refusal to do so, the Clerk shall upon the written request of four members, call special meetings: At all Special meetings of Council, the business for which it is called together shall be taken up immediately after roll call (The object of the meeting to be stated by the President) after which, with unanimous consent of the whole Council, other business may be taken up in the same order as at regular stated meetings.

Rule 2. The President shall call the Council to order: in the absence of the President the members shall appoint a President pro tempore, who shall discharge the same duties as President. If upon calling the roll, it shall appear that there is not a quorum in

attendance, and if no quorum shall appear in thirty minutes thereafter, the members present shall take a recess, and the President may direct the Chief of Police, or other Police officer or Constable, to compel the attendance of the absent members: The President shall preserve order, he shall decide questions of order without debate, subject to appeal to Council, and on which no member shall speak more than once, the President speaking last: The question of Council shall be "Shall the decision of the Chair stand as a judgement of Council?" which question shall be put by the Clerk.

Rule 3. Any member desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and respectfully address the President, and, being recognized, shall confine himself to the subject under debate, avoiding all personalities, indecorous or offensive language, and no member shall be referred to in any debate by name unless for violation of order, and then only by the President.

Rule 4. Any member making a motion shall rise, and no motion shall be considered in debate until it shall have been stated by the President, and, when demanded by any three members, it shall be reduced to writing and read, before the same shall be debatable.

Rule 5. When a question is before Council no motion shall be in order except to adjourn, to lay on the table, for the previous

question, all of which shall be decided without debate; to postpone to a certain time, to divide, to refer or amend, which motion shall severally have precedence in the order herein arranged.

Rule 6. Before putting any question the President shall ask "Is Council ready for the question?" if no member shall rise to speak, he shall put the question and declare the result:

When the question is to be decided by yeas and nays, the Clerk shall call the roll, noting the vote of each member, and hand the result of the vote to the President, who shall announce the same to Council; all votes so taken shall be recorded on the minutes.

Rule 7. No motion for reconsideration shall be entertained unless made by a member voting with the prevailing side in the first instance and shall not be in order unless made within sixty (60) days after the vote to be reconsidered was taken, and before final action shall have placed the matter beyond recall.

Rule 8. On motion seconded and carried, Council may resolve itself into a Committee of the whole but the proceedings thereof shall not be journalised except so far reported by the Committee.

Rule 9. There shall be eleven standing Committees, to be appointed by the President, and to be composed of (3) three members each, and the various Committees shall attend

To such business as may be referred to them by Council, and shall also have reasonable power to attend to other business without instructions of Council in cases of emergency.

The different Committees shall be known and have jurisdiction as follows:-

1. Committee on Finance - Shall have supervision of all Tax Levies, assessments, and other matters of financial nature.
2. Committee on Claims. - Shall have supervision over all Claims and litigation.
3. Committee on Public Safety. - Shall have supervision of matters relating to Public Safety, not delegated to Fire and Police Committees.
4. Committee on Light. Shall have supervision in matters relating to Street light and light for municipal buildings.
5. Committee on Ordinances. - Shall have supervision over all matters relating to ordinances.
6. Committee on Printing - Shall have supervision over all matters relating to official and public Printing.
7. Committee on Borough Property - Shall have supervision of the municipal building.
8. Committee on Police. Shall have supervision over the Police Department.
9. Committee on Fire - Shall have supervision over the Fire Department.
10. Committee on Water. Shall have supervision over the Water Department.

11. Committee on Streets & Sewers. — Shall have supervision over the street and sewer department.

The reports from Committees shall be in writing and the paper referred to shall be returned with the report, provided, however that nothing in this rule shall prevent the introduction of minority reports.

Rule 10. Every ordinance shall receive three readings in Council previous to its passage, but no ordinance shall have more than two readings at one meeting unless by consent of each and every member of Council, when the question shall be; "Shall the rule be suspended and the ordinance read a third time?"

Rule 11. Rules of Council may be suspended by consent of two thirds of the members present, and such further rules as may be deemed necessary from time to time may be adopted by a two third vote of Council, but these rules shall not be repealed or amended, unless the proposition to repeal or amend be submitted to Council at least one regular meeting previous to action thereon, when if two thirds of the full Council vote for the proposition it shall be adopted.

Rule 12. Robert's Manual shall be the authority referred to upon all questions of order not noted in these rules.

J.W. Schmitt moved A.H. McMullen seconded that rules presented be adopted. which was unanimously carried.

Ordinance No 1 Dogs. was presented and read. Moved by H.C. Galbreath seconded by A.H. McMullen that ordinance pass first reading carried and ordinance read.

Moved by J.W. Beers seconded by J.W. Schmitt that ordinance pass second reading, carried and ordinance read.

J.W. Beers moved A.H. McMullen seconded that rules be suspended and ordinance to have third reading which was unanimously carried and the ordinance was read a third time.

J.W. Schmitt moved and A.H. McMullen seconded that ordinance pass third and final reading ^{which was} carried unanimously.

O. 1. Ordinance No 1. Dogs. 1. That every dog or bitch going at large within the Borough of West View shall have around his neck a collar composed wholly or in part of metal, on which metal shall be inscribed the name of the owner; and the owner or possessor of every dog within the Borough shall annually or at before the first day of May have the number and description of the dog or dogs owned by him or her registered with the Borough Clerk, and shall pay a fee to the said Clerk, for the use of the Borough, of fifty cents for the first dog, one dollar for the first bitch, and one dollar for every other dog and two dollars for every other bitch owned or possessed by

him or her. or which is suffered to remain on his premises. Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the Burgess from authorizing persons removing or coming into the Borough after the first day of May in each year to register their dogs; or any person within the Borough who may purchase or obtain any dog after that date to register the same. The owners of all dogs and bitches shall register the same within sixty days after the enactment of this ordinance.

2. Nothing contained in the foregoing section shall authorize any bloodhound to run at large within the Borough at any time without being securely muzzled, nor any dog known to be of cross or vicious habits, nor any dog showing signs of rabies, nor any dog belonging to a house in which smallpox exists. No bitch while in heat shall be suffered to run at large but the owner of such bitch or any person controlling or exercising any agency over the same, or at whose house or premises the same may be allowed to remain, shall securely and safely keep the same, and prevent her from running at large.

3. Any person violating any provision of the two preceding sections shall forfeit and pay a fine of not less than (2) two Dollars or more than (10) ten Dollars, and any dog or bitch found

running at large, contrary to the provisions of said sections is hereby declared a public nuisance, and the Constable, Police, and such persons as the Burgesses may appoint for that purpose shall kill and remove the same, and shall receive from the Borough a fee of fifty cents for killing, removing, and burying each dog or bitch.

Ordained and enacted into a law this twenty seventh day of May one thousand nine hundred and five.

Ordinance on Sidewalks was presented and read.

Ordinance No. 2. Sidewalks.

1. The breadth and width of each and every Sidewalk or pavement on each and every street, avenue and alley now opened, or that may hereafter be opened

within the limits of the Borough of West View shall be as follows viz:- on all streets, avenues and alleys of the width of thirty (30) feet or more the distance from curb line to property line shall be equal to $\frac{1}{5}$ or one fifth of width of street from property line to property line.

On all streets, avenues and alleys of a less width than (30) feet and more than (20) feet, walk or pavement shall be four feet wide, measuring from property line to the outer edge of curb and on all streets, avenues or alleys of the width of twenty feet, each side or foot walk shall be two feet wide; Provided, that on streets, avenues and alleys of less than (20) twenty feet in width there shall be no sidewalk or pavement. Provided that nothing in this act shall be held to apply to streets, avenues or alleys that are already paved.

2. That the stone used for curbing any and all of the sidewalks in said Borough shall be of good hard sandstone of equal quality to the stone of the "Bdon or Peepoth Quarries. They shall not be less than ^{four} ~~6~~ inches long, ^{except for turns and corners} ~~twenty four~~ inches deep, 6 inches thick on the top when dressed, except where the street, avenue, or alley is thirty feet or less in width in which case it shall be four inches thick on the top when dressed, and in every case not less than five inches thick not less than twenty-seven inches long on the bottom. They shall be dressed

fifteen inches deep on each end, 6 inches on the top, "or 4 inches as the case may be", three inches on the side next the sidewalk and picked 8 inches deep on the front.

3. All sidewalks and boardwalks shall be four feet or more in width, except where the street, avenue or alley is twenty feet or less in width. All boardwalks shall be supported on three stringers or more, the outer two of which shall be placed not more than two inches from the outside of the walk.
4. All owners of ground fronting or abutting on any street, avenue or alley in said Borough be and they are hereby required to grade, curb and pave the sidewalks in front of their properties on each & every street, avenue and alley within this Borough in front and at the side of his, her or their or its respective property within sixty days after they shall have been duly notified according to law so to do.
5. Whenever an owner or owners are not residents of the Borough or are unknown or cannot be found said notice shall be served by leaving a copy with the occupant, if the premises be occupied, or, if unoccupied or vacant, or unseated land, then by posting a copy of said notice on the premises.
6. The grade of all sidewalks shall be the same as, and correspond with,

the grade of the street, avenue, or alley wherein they are located. The curbing shall be of the kind herein before prescribed, & shall be placed to correspond with the curb line as it may be established by the Borough Council.

7. The Borough Engineer shall furnish said owner, free of charge, the necessary grades, curb lines and instructions to enable them to fulfill the requirements of this ordinance.

8. Should any sidewalks need repairing, the Burgess shall, upon his own view, or by direction of Council, cause written notice to be served "which notice shall be served as herein before set forth" on the owner of the abutting premises, requiring said owner to repair the same within (Ten) 10 days from service of notice and upon failure of such owner to have the same repaired within such time, then the Burgess shall cause the same to be done, and shall collect the cost thereof with twenty per cent advance. Thereon, from such owner according to law.

9. If any of said owners shall neglect or refuse to comply with the requirements of this ordinance within the time specified after having been notified as aforesaid, then it shall be the duty of the Burgess to cause the same to be done at once, and to collect the costs thereof with

Twenty per cent advance thereon from said owner, according to Law.

10. Every person who shall occupy the front shop, house or building fronting on any sidewalk in the Borough shall cause the foot way along the premises so occupied to be swept and cleansed at least once in each week, to wit, on Saturday of each week before 9 o'clock in the morning and when snow shall fall, shall remove the same within twelve hours after the same shall cease to fall. Any person who shall neglect or refuse to comply with the foregoing provisions shall, upon conviction thereof, pay a fine not less than one dollar nor more than Ten Dollars and all costs.
11. Every person who shall drive or cause to be driven on and along any sidewalk or foot pavement in the Borough any coach, wagon, Buggy, carriage, cart, or other vehicle, or shall wilfully lead, ride, drive or cause to be lead, ridden or driven any horse, mule, cow, or other cattle thereon, or shall throw any dirt, dung, ashes or rubbish into or upon the same, shall upon conviction thereof pay a fine of not more than Five Dollars & costs for each offense.
12. Hereafter it shall be unlawful to throw or place any building material or rubbish from a building just

completed, or other articles of a like nature upon any sidewalk in the Borough provided that coal or fuel may be placed there for a time not exceeding ten hours, but all such material and articles shall be placed upon the street, and "except in case of building material" the same shall be removed therefrom within twenty four hours from the time they were so placed, every person failing to comply with any of the foregoing provisions shall, for each offense, upon conviction thereof, pay a fine of not less than two dollars nor more than twenty dollars, and all costs and the expense of removing the same if removed by the Borough.

13. No street washer, stop cock, water pipe, or connection, gas pipe connection, casing, upright pipes, or box, whether composed of wood, metal, terracotta or any other material whatsoever shall in any case extend above the surface of the pavement or street immediately surrounding the same but shall be so placed that the top thereof shall conform to and be identical with the immediate surrounding surface of said pavement or street. Every person, plumber, or corporation that shall hereafter place or maintain in any street, avenue, alley or sidewalk any street washer, stop cock, water pipe, or connection Gas Pipe connection, casing, upright pipe

or box, or any other obstruction to the free use of the streets, avenues, alleys, and sidewalks of the borough contrary to the provisions of this section of the ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, pay a fine of not less than Five Dollars nor more than Twenty Five Dollars and all Costs.

Nothing in this ordinance shall prohibit any property owner from making a properly constructed driveway across walk abutting his property.

H.C. Galbreath moved & J.W. Beers seconded that ordinance pass first reading. carried. J.W. Beers moved and A.H. McMillan seconded that Title be read and presented for second reading.

J.W. Schmitt moved and J.W. Beers seconded that ordinance pass second reading. carried.

Peace Ordinance no. 3 was presented & read. Ordinance no. 3. Peace. 1. That (a) all persons

who shall behave themselves in a lewd, indecent or lascivious manner in the streets or other public places in said Borough, and (b) all persons visibly intoxicated or drunken, and (c) all common prostitutes and common swindlers, and (d) all persons who abuse their families, and (e) all suspicious persons who can give no reasonable account of themselves, and (f) all habitual disturbers of the peace, and (g) all persons wilfully making or

causing to be made any loud, boisterous or unseemly noise or disturbance to the annoyance of the peaceful residents near by, and (h) all persons wilfully making or causing any outcry or other disorder, and (i) all street vendors and other persons who shall by crying aloud, blowing horns or otherwise in their traffic, sale or delivery of merchandise, annoy the public, and (j) all persons making use of loud and profane cursing and swearing or any indecent or unbecoming conduct tending to disturb the peace and good order which should prevail in the said Borough, and (k) all persons wilfully raising any false alarms of fire and (l) all persons maintaining or conducting any public stand or place to bet. on any boat race, ball game, or other sport, and all persons practising any gambling or swindling game, ~~in public~~, and (m) all persons who may be engaged in the commission of any unlawful act tending to imperil the personal security or endanger the property of the citizens, shall be deemed disorderly persons and guilty of disorderly conduct and shall, upon conviction thereof, before the Burgess, or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough forfeit and pay a fine or penalty of not less than one dollar and not exceeding one hundred dollars, with costs of suit, and on default of payment of said fine or penalty and costs, may be sentenced and

committed to the Borough lock-up for a period not Exceeding five days, or to the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty days. 2. All fines or penalties for the violation of this ordinance shall be paid over to the Borough Treasurer by the Burgees or Justice of the Peace receiving the same.

A. H. McMullen moved and H. C. Galbreath seconded that ordinance pass first reading - carried.

J. W. Beers moved and H. C. Galbreath seconded that Title be read and presented for second reading. carried. A. H. McMullen moved J. W. Beers seconded that ordinance pass second reading carried.

Animal Ordinance No. 4. was referred back to ordinance committee.

Ordinance 5. Building Permits was referred back to ordinance committee. Ordinance No. 4. Animals was presented and read.

Ordinance No. 4. Animals:-

1. The running at large of any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, swine geese and other animals or domestic fowl is hereby prohibited. Every person who shall suffer any of his horses, cattle, sheep, swine, goats, geese, or other animals or domestic fowl "except dogs" to run at large in the Borough of West View shall for each offense, upon conviction

thereof, forfeit & pay for each of said animals so running at large, a fine of not less than one dollar nor more than five dollars; and every one of said animals so found running at large shall be considered a public and common nuisance, and it shall be the duty of the Policeman, Constable, or any of them to seize and take into custody and impound every of the aforesaid animals so found running at large, and to give the owner if he be known notice thereof; but if the owner be not known and if after four days public notice no person shall come forward, claim the same, and pay the said fine and all costs and charges attending the seizing and keeping thereof, then the said animals shall be sold at public sale by the Officer who seized them and the proceeds appropriated to the use of the Borough.

2. Every person who shall be guilty of leaving his horse, mare or mule, or horses, mares or mules, standing in any public highway in the Borough and going away from them into any store, house, office, or other place where said animal or animals would be out of his control, without having said animals securely tied, or without leaving some one to take charge of them, shall upon conviction thereof pay a fine of not less than one dollar nor more than Ten Dollars.

3. Every person who shall be guilty of feeding or milking any cow or goat on any highway of the borough, shall upon conviction thereof pay a fine of not less than one dollar not more than Five Dollars.
4. Every person who shall be guilty of tying any horse, mare or mule, or horses, mares or mules, to any shade or ornamental trees ^(or other public places) planted in any public highway in the Borough, or so near to the same that said animal or animals can reach said tree and bite or bark the same, shall upon conviction thereof pay a fine of not less than one dollar not more than Twenty Dollars.
5. No person except farmers shall be permitted to engage in the business of raising hogs and no hog pen shall be placed within a distance nearer than (300) three hundred feet of the house of any neighbour, a farmer is by this ordinance defined to be one who is actually engaged in the business of tilling the soil or grazing or both for a living.

J.W. Beers moved and J.W. Schmitt seconded that Ordinance A. Animals pass first feeding - carried.

J.W. Beers moved and Lorenz Hyl seconded that Title be read and presented for

Second reading - carried.

J.W. Beer moved and McMullen seconded that ordinance pass second reading - carried. Ordinance No. 5. Building Permits was presented and read.

Ordinance No 5. Building Permits:-

1. Before any person shall commence the construction or erection of any building within the Borough of West New, he shall file with the Borough Clerk an application for a permit for the erection of the same describing the size and character of such building and probable cost of said building, of what materials to be constructed, and when and where it is to be erected, which application shall be signed by the owner or his authorized agent, if not in violation of law or of any Borough ordinance, the Clerk shall issue a permit therefore upon the payment of the sum of One Dollar for the use of said Borough. Provided that nothing in this ordinance shall be held to apply when contract has been given for building of house before passage of this ordinance.

2. Any building erected without a permit as aforesaid shall subject the owner to a penalty of not less than Five Dollars nor more than Fifty Dollars to be recovered with costs as debts of like amount are recoverable.

J.W. Beers moved and H.C. Galbreath seconded that Title be read and presented for second reading.

Leornz Steyl moved and H.C. Galbreath seconded that ordinance pass second reading. carried.

A.H. McMullen moved J.W. Schmitt seconded that Committee on Public Safety arrange for site and erection of Borough Lockup. carried.

Resignation of G. J. Knight Auditor was presented, and accepted.

J.W. Schmitt moved and J.W. Beers seconded that G. J. Knight be appointed Borough Treasurer. and G. J. Knight being only one nominated it was moved by A.H. McMullen and seconded by L. Steyl that H.C. Galbreath cast the ballot. the ballot was cast for G. J. Knight who was declared duly elected.

A.H. McMullen moved and J.W. Beers seconded that Borough Treasurer's Bond be \$2000⁰⁰ Two thousand dollars - carried.

J.W. Beers moved and J.W. Schmitt seconded that Allegheny Trust Co. be made Borough Depository. carried.

J.W. Schmitt moved and A.H. McMullen seconded that Borough Property Committee purchase safe. carried.

J.W. Beers moved H.C. Galbreath seconded that seal presented be

adopted - carried
 A.H. McMullen moved Le Key seconded
 That resolution passed authorizing Public
 Safety Committee to build Borough Lock up
 be reconsidered. carried

A.H. McMullen moved Le Key seconded

Section 2. That the said the Central and District Printing Telegraph Co. shall replace the streets, highways, footwalks, lanes and alleys of the said Borough upon which it shall erect any of its poles or fixtures as aforesaid in as good condition as they were before said Poles and fixtures were erected thereon; and further that the location of said poles shall be made under the direction and supervision of the Street Committee of the Council of the Borough aforesaid.

at least once each month, to inspect, or have inspected, by one or more of the Police Officers under his control, all poles and suspended wires, such as telegraph, telephone, electric light, electric railway and similar poles and suspended wires in each and every highway in the Borough of West View, and report any and all defects therein to the Town Council in his regular monthly report: Provided, that should any such poles or suspended wires be discovered that require immediate repair or removal the Chief of Police shall report the same forthwith to the Burgess, who shall either require the owner or owners thereof to repair or remove the same within a period of time to be limited by him, or he shall proceed at once to have the same repaired or removed, as, in his opinion, the exigencies of the case and the safety of the public may require, and in case he shall have the same repaired or removed, he shall collect the expense thereof, with twenty per centum advance thereon from the owner or owners thereof.

2. No new pole or suspended wire shall be erected or suspended in any highway in the Borough of West View, without a permit therefore from the Borough Clerk, who shall issue such permit only on written order designating the location, use and owner of such pole or suspended wire, signed by the Street Committee of the Council of the said Borough; and for such permit the

Borough Clerk shall collect a fee of Fifty cents for each and every pole, and at the rate of One Dollar for each and every mile of suspended wire, but no permit to suspend a wire or wires shall be issued for a less fee than Fifty cents, all of which fees shall be for the use of the Borough of West View. Any person or persons, firms or corporations erecting or suspending, or attempting to erect or suspend any such pole or wire without such permit, shall, on conviction thereof, pay a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than twenty five dollars and costs of suit.

3. The owner or owners of each and every pole or suspended wire shall, on or before the first day of November in each and every year obtain a license from the Borough Clerk, for which the Borough Clerk shall collect a fee of Fifty cents for each pole, and at the rate of one Dollar for each mile of suspended wire, but no license for a suspended wire shall be issued for a less fee than Fifty cents, all of which license fees shall be for the use of the Borough of West View. Should such license fee remain unpaid more than thirty days after the first day of November in each and every year, it shall be the duty of the Burgees to collect the same.

Amendments to Ordinance No. 8. Telephones.
Section 5. It is further expressly understood and agreed that the Central District and Printing Telegraph Company, its successors and assigns, shall, during the continuance of the franchise herein granted, furnish for the use of the officials of the said

Borough two (2) Telephones, to be located in such place within the limits of the said Borough as the Council thereof shall designate; these telephones to be used with the same rights and privileges as the other subscribers instruments connected with their Exchange, but only for the transaction of Official Borough business.

Section 6. That whenever the said Borough shall adopt a fire alarm or police telegraph system the said company shall permit the Fire alarm and Police telegraph wires to be run upon all the poles of the said company, without charge, within the limits of the said Borough. All such stringing or attaching of wires shall be done under the supervision of and to the satisfaction of the said company. The said privilege shall not be transferred, or sub-let except with the permission of said Company.

Section 7. In the event of any public improvements being made on, or to any street or streets, and the lines of the said Company interfere therewith, The Central District and Printing Telegraph Co. shall, upon thirty (30) days notice in writing by said Council, make such changes as shall be practical in its lines to avoid interference.

The digging up of any such street or alley or the taking up of any part of the pavement thereof, shall be done under the supervision of the Street Committee of the Borough, or such other competent person or persons as the Burgess may designate. During the progress of such work, all ditches, trenches and excavations and obstructions of every kind shall be carefully protected, guarded day and night.

Section 4. Before issuing the permit the Burgess shall require the owner of the property, or the person firm or corporation, to execute and deliver a good and sufficient Bond to the Borough in a sum not less than Five Hundred

Dollars conditioned to faithfully keep and observe the requirements and provisions of this Ordinance, and to save, indemnify and keep harmless the said Borough against any and all claims for damages to persons or property, occasioned by such work.

Section 5. In case of the absence or disability of the Burgess, the duties herein imposed on him shall be performed by the Clerk of the Borough Council.

Section 2. That the laying, repairing and reclaiming of pipes shall be done under the direction of the Street Committee of said Borough.

That all pipes laid by the Philadelphia Company, its successors and assigns, shall be buried to a depth of not less than two feet beneath the surface, to the top of the pipe, and if the grade of the street, alley lane or highway is established to a depth of not less than (2) two feet below said grade, to the top of the pipes, and shall be laid so as not to injure or interfere with any other pipes, sewers or conduits in said streets, nor shall the privilege herein granted preclude the right of said Borough to authorize the laying of other Gas pipes, sewers, or conduits crossing or paralleling the pipes and lines of said company.

Section 4. That when the laying, repairing or removing of any pipes or lines is begun by said company, it shall be conducted so as to interfere as little as possible with travel in the streets, lanes, alleys and highways, and when the said pipes or lines are being laid, repaired or removed, such work shall be continued to completion without delay, and the streets, paving and curbing shall be placed in so good condition as before the work was commenced.

within the Borough of West View, of the
County and State aforesaid, for the purpose
of conducting electricity through the
said Borough and for the purpose
of furnishing light, heat and power to
the citizens of said Borough.

Section I. Be it ordained and enacted
by the Town Council of the Borough of
West View, and it is hereby ordained and
enacted by the authority of the same, that
consent be, and the same is hereby
granted unto the Allegheny County Light
Co, its successors, lessees, and assigns, to
enter upon the streets and highways of
the Borough of West View, and to erect &
maintain thereon such poles, wires, and
other device, as may, from time to time,
be necessary for the purpose of conducting
its business.

Section II The poles to be erected by the
company shall be straight and of such
height above the ground that the lowest
cross arm thereon shall be twenty five (25)

feet above the street grade, unless the Borough shall place cross arms on said poles below the specified twenty five (25) feet above the grade for the purpose of stringing the lines of its police and fire alarm systems. All poles shall be erected at such points on the streets and highways as Council may, through its Street-Committee direct. The Borough shall have the right, free of cost & expense, to place its police & telegraph lines on said poles.

Section III The Borough grants the privileges of this ordinance on the condition that in case it enters into a contract for electric arc lighting service with the said company, the said company will erect such number of arc lamps as may be contracted for by the Council on any streets and highways traversed by its lines, or extend its lines when required by Council for the erection of additional arc lamps.

Section IV. The Company agrees that the rate for domestic lighting to private consumers, shall at no time exceed the rate charged domestic consumers in the City of Pittsburgh. The company further agrees to supply sufficient current for lighting forty (40) sixteen candle power (16 c.p.) lamps free of charge to the Borough for lighting the Borough buildings for municipal purposes only.

Section V The company shall under its corporate seal, in writing, accept this

ordinance within thirty (30) days after its adoption and further shall pay the cost of advertising, posting and publishing this ordinance.

or dairy farm to remain in a noxious or offensive condition, after he has once been convicted thereof, he shall pay a fine of not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, said fines or penalties to be collected as debts of like amounts are by law recoverable.

Sec I. Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgesses & Town Council of the Borough of West View and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same that the following building regulations be adopted in the Board of West View.

Plumbing Regulations

No outdoor closets or privies will be allowed to be erected within the Board limits

Where there are no sewers, the sewerage shall be carried to a cess pool not less than 12 feet deep and covered with stone or locust posts at least 18" below surface. Sewerage to be carried in vitrified sewer pipe not less than 4" in diameter. All closets to have 4" cast iron soil pipe extending above the roof and above any openings in adjoining walls at least 3 feet. All closets to be properly back vented with 1/4" pipe. All sewerage to have a trap two feet outside the building line.

No cess pool can be placed within 20 ft of the building sewer nor within 3 feet of any property line. All cess pools to be bricked up.

Sec 2. Roof regulations

All roofs of 1/5 pitch or less must have 2x8 rafters 2 feet to centers. All roofs of steeper pitch must have 2x6 rafters 2 feet to centers.

Sec 3. Fire Regulations

All flues or chimneys to be built of good bricks, well ~~weathered~~ mortared & plastered and no stove pipe or pipe made of tile or sewer pipe will be permitted to be run through any roof, wall, partition or ceiling.

Sec 4. Foundations.

All houses shall have stone, concrete brick or tile foundations.

Sec 5. Structural

All joists or pludding to be set 16"

or closer to centers. Joists having a span of over 12 ft to be 2 X 10 on first & second floors & 2 X 8 on third floor. All joists to have one row of bridging in 10 feet and up to 16 feet. 16 feet and up to 20 feet, 2 rows; 20 feet & over to have one row in every 6 feet or fraction of 6 ft.

Sec 6. Permit. The total fee for a building permit shall be \$2.00 and the Board clerk shall receive 25¢ for issuing the same.

Sec 7. These regulations are made to apply to residences & portions of residences only.

Sec 8. All ordinances and parts of ordinances conflicting with ~~the provisions~~ this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed so far as affects this ordinance.

Committee's Report

Report of J. J. the Members of Council
Light Com. Gentlemen

Pursuant to your instructions, the Light Committee have gone over all the streets of the boro to ascertain the number & the location of the lights necessary to light the boro in a fairly reasonable manner.

We found that, at present, there are in use some, forty lamps. There are erected, including those not burning forty five lamps.

We are unable to reduce the number below forty five and in order to make the distribution as equal^{as} as possible, we have marked on the various litho graphs, the relocation of 30 of the above forty five. We have, with the exception of a few of the worst place taken the lights away from the railway tracks.

While we feel that the boro needs this number of lights yet we are loath to recommend the Council to enter into any general agreement with the Allegheny Co Light Co at the present time. The lowest rate we have heard of is \$60. per lamp per year, which is the price Ballou has agreed to pay, but that price was not made by the Allegheny Co Light Co, but by a competitor. The boro is not in a condition financially to even pay that price. If we place forty five lights through out the various plans, at a price of \$60 per light (and we do not know we can get a rate as low as that) it means a total of \$2700. per year or, in round numbers an added millage of nearly three mills. In other words, the man whose home is assessed at \$4000. would have to pay \$12. taxes per year for the benefit of street-lighting. That is prohibitive.

We recommend for the consideration of Council that the Committee on Light be instructed to ascertain the following

facts :-

First - the cost of constructing, equipping, maintaining & operating a municipal light plant.

Second; whether or not, the boro as a municipality would be allowed under its charter, to enter into contracts with the residents for the purpose of supplying commercial or miscellaneous light to local consumers.

Third, to ascertain the cost, per light and the number needed to sufficiently light the boro with gas.

Fourth to ascertain at what price the independent Co. that is getting into Bellevue will light this boro per house, per year.

Fifth to hold a meeting with those persons who are contemplating the erection of a private plant for the furnishing of light, heat & power and see what would be their price for lighting the boro, per lamp.

We recommend in case any arrangement can be made that with the Allegheny Co Light Co that is satisfactory to the boro, that all lights be suspended from arms at least eight feet out from the pole, and further, we recommend, that in this case, the lights they would supply, must have a higher ~~power~~ penetrating power than the lights now being burned.

In the opinion of your committee the present lamps are very weak.

Sec I. Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of West View, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of

the same the the President and Secretary of the Council of the Borough of West View be and they are hereby authorized and directed forthwith in the name and on behalf of the Borough of West View to make and enter into a contract with the Alleyheny Co Light Co for electric arc lighting of the streets and highways of the Borough upon the following terms and conditions.

First That the contract shall be for fifty (50) or more series double enclosed, alternating current electric arc lamps of nominal two thousand (2000) candle power rating each, which shall be supplied with current of not less than seven and one-half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) amperes at a pressure of not less than seventy (70) volts across the arc, or a lamp giving an equivalent amount of light; the term of this contract to be for and during the term of two (2) years from date of completion.

Second The company to furnish and erect all necessary poles, wires, lamps, and appliances upon the streets and highways of the Borough necessary for the installation of electric arc lamps.

Third The company to place its arc lamps on the streets and highways at such points as the Borough may direct; and without cost to the Borough to extend its lines and place any additional arc lamps when directed to do so, in writing,

by the proper Borough official, provided however that such additional lamps are not placed more than five hundred (500) feet distant from any other lamp or are circuit of the Company.

Fourth The Company to keep the lights burning from dusk until dawn each and every night, unavoidable accident excepted.

Fifth. The Borough to pay to the Company for arc lighting service at the rate of seventy Dollars (\$70) per arc lamp per year. The payments for such service to be made in proportionate monthly instalments on or before the fifteenth (15) day of the succeeding month.

Sixth The Allegheny Co Light Co shall within thirty (30) days after the passage and approval of this ordinance notify the Borough of its acceptance thereof and of its intention to supply the municipal buildings of the Borough with light free of charge, and that it will pay expenses incident to the passage and publication of this ordinance.

Authorizing and directing the President and Secretary of the Council of the Borough of West View for and on behalf of the Borough of West View of County of Allegheny, State of Penna, to make and enter into a contract with the Allegheny Light Co to furnish electric arc lighting for the streets and

highways of the Borough of West View.

Sec II. Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of West View, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same that the President and Secretary of the Council of the Borough of West View be and they are hereby authorized and directed forthwith in the name and on behalf of the Borough of West View to make and enter into a contract with the Allegheny Co Light Co for electric arc lighting of the streets and highways of the Borough upon the following terms and conditions:-

First. That the contract shall be for forty five (45) or more series double enclosed alternating current electric arc lamps of nominal two thousand (2000) candle power rating each, which shall be supplied with current of not less than seventy (70) volts across the arc, or a lamp giving an equivalent amount of light; the term of this contract to be for and during the term of three (3) years from the date of connection.

Second The company to furnish and erect all necessary poles, wires, lamps, and appliances upon the streets and highways necessary for the installation of electric arc lamps.

Third. The company to place its arc lights on the streets and highways at such points as the Borough may direct and to extend its lines, without cost to the Borough for placing

any additional arc lamps when directed to do so, in writing, by the proper Borough Official, provided, however, that additional lamps are not placed more than five hundred (500) feet distant from any other lamp or arc circuit of the company.

Fourth. The company to keep the lights burning from dusk until dawn each and every night, unavoidable accident excepted.

Fifth The Borough to pay to the company for arc lighting service at the rate of Seventy Dollars (\$70) per arc lamp per year. The payments for such service to be made in proportional monthly instalments on or before the fifteenth (15) day of the succeeding month.

Sixth The company agrees that it will supply free current for lighting purposes in the Borough buildings as provided in its franchise ordinance and that it will pay all necessary charges in connection with the passage and publication of this ordinance.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances not in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

Ordained, and enacted into a law in Council this 17th day of December A.D. 1907.
