West View is a borough in Allegheny County, Pennsylvania encompassing 1.3 square miles. It is located in the center of Ross Township and is just 6 miles outside of downtown Pittsburgh. It is entirely within the 15229 ZIP code. It has a population of over 6,000.

Through the efforts of land developer Frederick Martsolf, West View was first incorporated in 1905. He wanted to build a community that embodied his "new century" vision of suburbia, a calmer place away from the bustling city. The Borough has a rich history, and perhaps most notably, West View was once home to West View Park, an amusement park which was in operation for over seventy years. Today, West View is better known as one of the safest, greenest, and most family-friendly communities in Pennsylvania. It has consistently ranked high on the list of best communities to live in Pennsylvania. We also hold many community-oriented events throughout the year.

This welcome packet is intended to help make your move to West View a little easier. It contains a wealth of useful information, including contact information, information on services we provide, important documents, tax information, voter information, and much more. West View is a borough in the state of Pennsylvania that operates under a mayor-council government system. There are seven elected councilmembers and a mayor, each elected for 4-year terms. The Borough Manager is appointed by a majority vote of council.

The Borough Council is responsible for governing the Borough and passing legislation pursuant to the best interests of the residents. They are assisted in these efforts by the Borough Manager in addition to other advisory boards and commissions. The Borough Manager enforces and executes the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the ordinances and resolutions of the Borough of West View. They are also in charge of preparing a tentative budget at the end of each fiscal year. The Manager along with other administrative staff are responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Borough.

The Borough Council usually meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 6:00pm in Borough Hall, located at 439 Perry Highway. Special meetings sometimes occur and will be noted on our website. Meeting agendas are posted on our website and on our lobby bulletin board. All meetings are open to the public.

Council meeting minutes are available to read on our website. We are fortunate enough to have all of the minutes digitized, from the Borough's beginning in 1905 to the present. Ordinances and resolutions can also be found on the website, but a more complete collection of Borough codes can be found at https://ecode360.com/WE0607.

There are a few boards and commissions that currently exist in the Borough. They are comprised of appointed citizens whose job is to advise and assist council. They include the civil service commission, planning commission, and zoning hearing board.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

The West View Police Department is a full service, 24-hour police department, employing 11 full-time and 2 part-time police officers.

The department consists of the Chief of Police, a Lieutenant, a Sergeant, a Detective, and 6 patrol officers. Two police officers are on-duty at all times, with their primary duty being to patrol the streets of the Borough, enforcing laws and ordinances, and assisting residents as needed. The Police Department serves as a liaison between the residents and Borough Council, sharing information and concerns brought to our attention.

The police department maintains 4 police cars and 1 Harley Davidson Motorcycle. In addition to motor vehicles, you will see officers on foot patrol at times promoting safe shopping in West View Plaza or our Business District. Several officers are trained in special duties such as Crime Watch, crime scene investigator, fingerprinting, Accident Reconstruction, and Drug Investigators. 2 of our officers are members of the North Hills Special Response Team (SRT).

Our officers investigate all crimes that occur in West View. Only those requiring extensive investigations or resources beyond our means are referred to outside agencies such as the Allegheny County Police. All calls for assistance, emergency, and non-emergency are handled through Allegheny County Emergency Services, who has the responsibility of receiving calls and dispatching officers as needed.

11 school crossing guards employed by the Police Department see that your children safely cross the streets in the mornings and afternoons while on their way to and from school.

FIRE / EMS SERVICES

West View Borough is serviced by the West View Volunteer Fire Department, located at 471 Perry Highway.


In addition, Ross/West View Emergency Medical Services Authority is a non-profit organization that provides emergency and non-emergency medical care and rescue services to Ross Township, West View Borough, Millvale Borough, Reserve Township, and Ohio Township. They also provide mutual aid to McCandless/Franklin Park EMS, Valley Ambulance, Shaler EMS, Northwest EMS, and the City of Pittsburgh.

Their services include the provision of basic life support, advanced life support, rescue services, public education, and training. They employ 29 full-time employees, as well as many part-time employees and volunteer personnel staff. The Authority's fleet consists of five ambulances, two response vehicles, one wheelchair van, and a rescue truck.


As of 2023, Ross/West View EMSA has implemented an annual <u>mandatory</u> EMS fee in each of the five municipalities it serves. This fee is to provide a source of sustainable funding for the EMS. The fee is \$55 per household. Once you have paid this fee, you will not have to pay any out-of-pocket ambulance fees that are not covered by insurance. TRANSPORTATION

The Borough is located a short distance away from several major interstate highways and regional transportation routes. I-279 is less than half a mile outside the borders of West View, providing quick and easy access to downtown Pittsburgh. In addition, Route 19 runs right through the heart of West View.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

The Public Works Department ensures that the borough operates smoothly and looks its best at all times. They are responsible for:

- Park and field maintenance
- Roadway and alleyway maintenance and repair
- Snow removal from roadways, sidewalks, and steps
- Tree and brush trimming
- Leaf, tree, and shrub removal
- Combined sewer maintenance
- Catch basin cleaning
- Stormwater management
- Painting of crosswalks and yellow lines
- Maintaining and upgrading signage
- Repairing and replacing traffic signals
- Municipal trash removal
- Seasonal decorations (flags, Christmas decorations, military banners)

The Department of Public Works is led by Rich Rapp, Public Works Coordinator, who is directly overseen by Borough Manager Bruce Fromlak. They currently employ 7 full-time and 4 part-time staff. They also have an array of vehicles and equipment, including 3 5-ton dump trucks, 2 pickup trucks, 1 high lift/back hoe, 1 Pelican sweeper, 1 Falcon asphalt trailer, 1 leaf vacuum trailer, 1 35-ft. bucket truck, and 1 Kubota grass cutter with various attachments.

Please note that residential trash collection is not provided by the Department of Public Works. Waste Management collects residential trash.

COMMUNITY INFORMATION

SHOVELING GUIDELINES

Any sidewalk in the Borough must be cleared of snow by the property owner within 24 hours after the snow, sleet, or ice has stopped (See Ordinance Code: Chapter 245, Article 1).

SIDEWALK MAINTENANCE

Sidewalks for the use of pedestrians are required to be constructed, maintained, and kept in thorough repair and safe condition at the expense of the owners of the abutting premises. (See Ordinance Code: Chapter 245, Article III).

TRASH AND RECYCLING

West View Borough does not have a municipal trash collection service. Instead, Waste Management is responsible for trash and recycling pickup. In late 2023, Waste Management issued all West View residents new trash and recycling carts. Starting February 1st, 2024, all trash and recycling must be placed inside these carts. You **cannot** leave any items outside your carts, otherwise Waste Management will not take it. If these new carts are too big for you, the Borough is offering a limited time exchange to a smaller cart. Trash collection is weekly and recycling is biweekly (after February 1st, 2024). If you ever have concerns regarding your bill, have questions about the new trash and recycling carts, need to report a missed pickup, or need to schedule a special pickup, you can visit Waste Management's website at https://www.wm.com or give them a call at 1-800-866-4460.

PERMITS

Many of our permits (solicitation, building, etc.) are available to view and download on our website. If you have any questions regarding permits, you can stop by the Borough building, give us a call, or send us an email. Building permit applications are now handled by Code.sys Code Consulting, Inc.

WATER SERVICE PROVIDER

Water service in the Borough is provided by West View Water Authority. Their offices are located in West View at 210 Perry Highway. The Authority supplies water to 32 municipalities and over 200,000 people in portions of Allegheny, Beaver, and Butler counties. The Water Treatment Plant is located on Neville Island with the main source of supply from the Ohio River and wells on Davis Island. The Authority owns and maintains 10 reservoirs throughout the service territory with a maximum water storage capacity of

39,850,000 gallons. For more information about WVWA including contact information, visit their website at https://westviewwater.org.


